Long Beach VA Hospital: It has been since February 2020, the beginning of Covid, since we have been allowed in the LBVA Hospital. But, on December 28, a few members including Rene Macare, our Sr. Vice, and his band, "The Flashback", was able to put on a live concert in the Spinal Cord Injury Ward for the patients.

The feedback from the hospital was that all of the Veterans who attended really enjoyed the music.



Unfortunately this does not signal the lifting of any restrictions to enable us to resume visits to the hospital or put on our usual BBQs or Pizza Parties.

Our Post does continue to provide donations to the LBVA in the form of gift cards so the staff can buy things the patients need.

<u>Youth Essays:</u> We received a record breaking number of entries this year for the Patriot's Pen Essay contest from seven local Middle Schools. We also received Voice of Democracy audio essays from 12 local High Schools. Our Post Committee, consisting of Richard Vaughn, Gale Goodall, Casey Kleindienst, and Kristen Clements, spent <u>many</u> hours reading and judging these essays and are now ready to begin presenting awards to the winners. 58 middle school students and 13 high school students will receive 1st, 2nd 3rd, or Honorable Mention awards. Many of these will be presented at their respective schools and some will be given out at one of our monthly Post meetings.

Beginning in February, we will start bringing some of our winners to Post meetings to read their essays and receive their awards. You will definitely want to plan to come and hear the inspiring essays these students have written.

Orange County Veterans Cemetery Update: The on-going quest for a veterans cemetery has recently cleared another potential obstacle. The successful completion of the site feasibility study for the Gypsum Canyon Veterans Cemetery project commissioned by CalVet is a significant step forward. The most important information from the study is that the 100-acre site has been determined to have no obstacles to development, paving the way for continued progress at the site. Ongoing efforts continue to secure the necessary funding for site improvements and infrastructure. While the Veterans Cemetery project still has a long road ahead, the continuing progress is promising.

US Air Force Memorial to become part of Arlington Cemetery: The US Air Force Memorial's official



dedication was held October 14, 2006. President George W. Bush spoke and underscored the memorial's meanings: "A soldier can walk the battlefields where he once fought, a Marine can walk the beaches he once stormed, but an airman can never visit the patch of sky he raced across on a mission to defend freedom. And, so it's fitting that, from this day forward, the men and women of the Air Force will have this memorial, a place here on the ground that recognizes their achievements and sacrifices in the skies above."

This commemorative site is located on a high promontory overlooking Arlington National Cemetery, the Pentagon, the Potomac River and the Washington, D.C. skyline.

It is now planned that as part of the

Arlington National Cemetery expansion project, the southern boundaries of the cemetery will be extended. As many as 60,000 more burial sites will be added and the US Air Force Memorial will become the centerpiece of a new southern entrance. This change will ensure seamless public access bringing thousands more people each year to honor American service members' journeys to the skies and beyond. Work is currently underway to clear the area and reroute roads and is expected to be complete by October 2026.
