#### Spotlight on our Teacher of the Year:



On June 8, several of our Post members attended the awards presentation at the Department Convention to see our Post Teacher of the Year, Monica Grim, receive the first place award for State of CA Elementary Teacher of the Year. Mrs. Grim is a 5th grade teacher at Stoneybrooke Christian School in San Juan Capistrano.

Mrs. Grim is a model of citizenship and exemplifies many of the qualities that define those who serve our nation—courage, patriotism, faith, and respect. She strives to pass these values on to her students in the classroom.

Mrs. Grim values each student as an individual and promotes their personal development as well as academic learning. She believes teaching them to be a productive member of society is one of her most important teaching objectives.

When she is not in the classroom, she does volunteer work, including teaching Vacation Bible School at boy's orphanage in Haiti.

Monica is the wife of a USMC Gulf War veteran, and daughter of a US Army Bronze Star Vietnam veteran.

<u>Did you Know:</u> The **6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion** was the first battalion of predominantly African American women ever to serve in the US military overseas? In February 1945, 800 women mostly in their late teens and 20's arrived in Glasgow, Scotland to do something crucial for the war effort. Their job would be clearing a massive backlog of millions of pieces of undelivered mail, intended for US Servicemen, stored in European warehouses from floor to ceiling. For 2 years or longer, soldiers had been waiting for letters and packages that hadn't arrived and morale was declining. They worked in cold, dirty, dark, rat infested aircraft hangars with broken windows. Despite having to deal with difficult working and living conditions as well as discrimination, the 6888th produced great results. With a new tracking system they created, the women processed an average of 65,000 pieces of mail per shift and cleared the six-month backlog of mail in just three months. Unfortunately, as it too often happens, official national recognition of their service and accomplishments didn't come until almost 80 years later when, in March 2022, they were awarded the Congressional Gold Medal.
