

While attending Wing Ding, I had the opportunity to attend a class presented by Dunlop Tires. It was very informative and I really enjoyed the class. The representative put on three classes and at each class gave a way a set of tires. What an incentive to attend a class. Unfortunately, I did not win.

A couple of things that he touched on, and probably the most important was tire pressure. For two-wheel bikes, he recommended 41 lbs. in the rear and 38 in the front. For trikes, he recommended 41 in the front and to go by the recommended pressure on the tire for the rear. He stated that with proper inflation that the Dunlop Elite 4's has recorded as much as 24,000 miles on a pair of tires. I would say that checking your pressure every time you get ready to ride would be an advantage to longer wear. Another thing he mentioned was the load you carry. For every 4 lbs. of deflation from the recommended pressures, you lose as much as 80 lbs. of load capacity. How many of us are riding overloaded?

We have a few rides on the calendar and I will be updating the Ride Calendar. We have some exciting rides planned and one a repeat of last year with the Moonlight ride. Hopefully it will be a clear night and we can enjoy the moon and stars. Listed below is the schedule of events for the remainder of July and part of August.

Why You Shouldn't Drink Ice Cold Water When It's So Dang Hot!

As most of you know, I'm on the road out riding in the hot hot wild west. Temperatures are reaching the mid to high 90's. Hydration and staying cool is so important if you plan on riding in this heat. Thankfully, I have a cooling vest (on loan from Terry Elliott) which keeps my core body temp around 78 when riding. They really do work. Intense heat can suck the life out of you which makes it very enticing to gulp down a couple bottles of ice cold water on the those hot hot days. Listen up, if you feel overheated and are tempted, don't do it and here's why.

If your body temperature is elevated, drinking ice cold water could shock your system. It thinks that the stomach is going hypothermic and so it takes the warm blood and sends it to the stomach. You can lose consciousness. You get such a significant difference between your body temperature and the ice cold water, which will cause spasm, cause your heart rate to drop, and cause your blood temperatures to drop. The mismatch of temperatures can cause of multitude of symptoms like chest pain, stomach pain and nausea.

Cold water is good but only in sips. Room temperature water is best if you need fast rehydration.

Stay safe out there this Summer!

Find - A - Friend Program Guidelines

- Open to all current GWRRA Members.
- The new recruited member will be recorded under the main member number of the household that did the recruiting.
- Each family member will count towards the number of recruits toward your Find-A-Friend count.
- When a Find-A-Friend pin/heart bar is issued, the main member and the -01 & -02 will each receive one.
- Memberships recruited during special events, such as Wing Ding, do qualify for this program.

Recruiting Rewards Program Guidelines

- Open to all current GWRRA Members.
- For every five new memberships (households) your household recruits, you will receive a Gift Certificate for \$55.
- Each membership counts as "ONE", regardless of the number of family members in the membership, towards receiving your gift certificate
- Certificates are non-transferable and will have a one-year expiration date. A
 certificate must be used in full in one single transaction. A credit will not be
 issued for the remainder amount of the gift certificate if the full amount is not
 used.
- There is no maximum number of gift Certificates that can be earned.
- Memberships recruited during special events, such as Wing Ding, do not qualify for this program.
- Members may use the Gift Certificate for Wing Ding Registration, Chapter Charter fees, Membership or GWRRA Official Merchandise. It may not be used towards shipping costs.
- ** Trial memberships will not count towards the Find-A-Friend or Rewards program numbers until they join fully.
- ** Must recruit new memberships only, not renewals.
- **Be sure to write your name and membership number at the bottom of the membership application in order to receive your credit. If your new recruits call member services to join, please tell them to provide this information to ensure you receive credit.



Stayin' Safe: Hidden Valley

We all know and love riding those hilly back roads but with that comes hidden challenges and dangers. Always expect the unexpected. Stay alert and be prepared. We cannot let our guards down.

The view of the road ahead looks wide open at first. But look again and notice the stretch of road that is hidden from sight.



The short valley beyond the hillcrest has swallowed the car from view. Could the school bus stop indicated in the sign be hidden there too?

Riding a stretch of rising and falling road is fun, but also presents a special kind of challenge for the back-road motorcyclist. While the rider can often see the road stretching out into the distance, parts of the path are hidden from view by one or more low elevation hillcrests. Those shallow dips—often hardly noticeable—can be as dangerous as a sharp blind curve. Both a blind curve and a small hillcrest can hide a car, truck, intersection, driveway, school bus stop, stopped mail truck...well, you get the idea.

The increased risk comes in a rider's tendency to ride faster than he or she should over the low hillcrests. Being able to see the road in the distance, it's easy to slip into the trap of setting travel speed according to that long view. The problem is, the real threat may be hidden just out of view, a few bike lengths ahead in the valley just beyond a rise in the foreground. First, it's important to recognize even a small hillcrest that hinders your view of a section of road ahead. Notice how the car in the pictures disappears from view when it drives into the dip. Also notice the sign indicating a school bus stop—is it in the valley or farther up the road? Consider the immediate hillcrest to be your "visual limit" or visual point (it's not where the road disappears in the far distance). Then set a speed that would permit controlled slowing, stopping or other maneuvering to avoid any threat that might be lying in wait in the hidden valley. There's a reason we call it "dead ground" in our Stayin' Safe program.




