Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

What is Ad Orientum? It means to or towards the East, and when a priest celebrates Mass in this posture (either posture facing the people or **PASTOR** facing liturgical east is approved in the sacrifice of

the Mass) he is leading the people to God; all facing the same direction. I am going to share a few insights from theologians and scholars on this matter who can sum it better than I can!

From the Congregation of Divine Worship (CDW):

In the year 2000, the Congregation for Divine Worship issued an official response stating that: "This dicastery wishes to state that Holy Mass may be celebrated versus populum or versus apsidem. Both positions are in accord with liturgical law; both are to be considered correct. There is no preference expressed in the liturgical legislation for either position." CDW on 10 April 2000 (PROTOCOL NO. 564/00/L)

Cardinal Sarah:

"It's permitted and encouraged, and, I would insist, pastorally advantageous, in the more modern form of the Roman rite."

How can we enter into this interior disposition except by turning physically, all together, priest and faithful, toward the Lord who comes, toward the east symbolized by the apse where the cross is enthroned? The outward orientation leads us to the interior orientation that it symbolizes. Since apostolic times, Christians have been familiar with this way of praying. It is not a matter of celebrating with one's back to the people or facing them, but toward the east, ad Dominum, toward the Lord.

When we rise to pray, we turn East, where heaven begins. And we do this not because God is there, as if He had moved away from the other directions on earth..., but rather to help us remember to turn our mind towards a higher order, that is, to God."

Father Joseph Fessio, SJ - founder and editor of Ignatius Press "When I'm talking to the people, I face the people. When I'm talking to God, I face God."

"I don't say Mass "with my back to the people" any more than Patton went through Germany with his "back to the soldiers." Patton led the Third Army across Germany and they followed him to achieve a goal. The Mass is part of the Pilgrim Church on the way to our goal, our heavenly homeland. This world is not our heavenly homeland. We don't sit around in a circle and look at each other. We want to look with each other and with the priest towards the rising sun, the rays of grace, where the Son will come again in glory on the clouds."

Pope Francis

"To be modern, some believe that it is necessary to break away from the roots. And this is their ruin, because the roots, the tradition, are the guarantee of the future."

"a common turning to the East during the Eucharistic Prayer remains essential. This is not a case of something accidental, but of what is essential. Looking at the priest has no importance. What matters is looking together at the Lord. It is not now a question of dialogue, but of common worship, of setting off towards the One who is to come. What corresponds with the reality of what is happening is not the closed circle, but the common movement forward expressed in a common direction for prayer."

<u>Dr. Helen Ratner Dietz</u> essay entitled "<u>The Nuptial Meaning of</u> Classic Church Architecture"

... the Christian liturgical practice of facing East ... was already a longstanding practice at the time Origen wrote and some scholars trace it back to the early second century. The practice could conceivably have been adopted before AD 70 ... when the Christian Eucharist was presumably still celebrated in private homes."

I'll leave you all with this example: at night before retiring for bed we can say our prayers lying in bed or we can kneel down next to our bed or even go to an area we have designated as a prayer area to say our evening prayers. Our bodies and gestures can and do express a reality and so it is with my posture as a priest and your postures as the Church militant.

To continue to bear an abundance of good fruit in the Lord, we MUST always be counter-cultural or swimming upstream against the heresy of modernism. May the Holy Family guide and protect each one of you in your journey towards Jesus Christ, the King of the universe.
