Camp Sunday

Do You Remember being an Explorer?

Do You Remember being a member of C.G.I.T?

Do You Remember being a leader in one or the other?

Do You Remember attending camp as one of the above?



How many of you remember going to **Canyon Church Camp** in your youth? I did. I was an explorer in the early 1960s and spent a week at CCC. Older now, I can't remember what we did for that week. I surmise there were activities such crafts, Bible Study, hikes, free time for writing letters & post cards home, campfires, singalongs, and fellowship. Most of the kids came together as strangers and when the week was over, parted as friends.

Canyon Church Camp, located in a valley on the way to Red Rock Canyon in Waterton Lakes National Park, was run by the CCC Association with representatives from southern Alberta presbyteries. The camp was leased from the Park Service and the lease renewed every 10 years. In the 1940s and 1950s there were 5-9 camps from May to September with an approximate number of campers between 280 to nearly 500. The camp registrants ranged from senior boys and girls, intermediate boys and girls, junior girls, and boys. Other campers were from organizations like the C.G.I.T., YMCA and other church groups.

As the decades flew by, family camps were added to the lineup. The camps were successful due to the fine directors and leadership, the cooks, the camp nurse, and the many volunteers who met each year before the camp season opened to repair, paint or replace the needed buildings and machinery.

Do you remember the lodge where meals were enjoyed, and names carved into the walls? Or the cabins where you bunked with 6-8 other kids? How about the tuck shop where you purchased postcards, stamps, or treats? Do you remember gathering around the flagpole in the morning or sitting around the outdoor campfire, for sing songs with a leader softly strumming a guitar.

Do you remember the last song of the evening before turning in?
