

Minister's Message:

The church has entered the season of Lent, a 40-day period of reflection and penitence, mirroring Jesus' forty days in the wilderness tempted by Satan, which prepares us for Holy Week and Easter.

Traditionally, Christians have used this time for fasting, prayer, and acts of mercy. I hope that whatever spiritual discipline you have chosen to pursue during this season will bring meaning to you. If you are still



unsure of something you could do for Lent I would always suggest reading the Bible. There are 35 days remaining until Good Friday, you could read a chapter a day of the Gospel of John, then Paul's letter to the Hebrews.

If you'd like an easier suggestion, between Good Friday and Easter, you could watch the film version *The Gospel of John* from 2003. It is a 3-hour acted out narration of John's Gospel, and it is available for free on Youtube.

Around the church we have several activities to deepen our faith during Lent as well. Every Thursday during Lent, different downtown churches are hosting Lenten lunches at 12:00pm. This is a chance to connect with some of the neighbouring Christian churches with food and fellowship. We have our Saturday Faith Formation activities, specifically, on March 11th we are invited to join our friends at McKillop United Church. They have invited Rev. Tony Snow, the Indigenous Minister for Chinook Winds Regional Council, to lead a blanket exercise. If you have not participated in a blanket exercise, I would commend this event to you.

During Holy Week, Southminster will be hosting a joint Maundy Thursday service (April 6), and this year's Good Friday will be hosted by McKillop. I would **highly** commend the Holy Week services to you, especially Good Friday. In the entire year, if you only go to one event of the church outside of a Sunday morning, my hope is that it would be the Good Friday service. There is no Easter without Good Friday.

Blessings to you for a holy Lent, may you find meaning and connection to God in this season.

The ones who served

Last November you may have seen the military banners on the light posts in front of the church. They and others hung around town commemorate the lives and sacrifice of men and women in wartime.





At the back of the sanctuary there is a good-sized plaque with the names of Knox Presbyterian Church men who gave their lives in World War One. This plaque was hung in the Knox Presbyterian Church and came to us in the late 1930s.

As one of my projects, I am gathering names of men and women who went to war from Wesley Methodist Church. There is a roster of seventeen names from the Wesley Methodist Church ledger. Going forth in time to the Second World War and the Korean Conflict, their names Should be displayed, too.

To date, I have gathered the names of men and women – Southminster Church members - who have served in the military, **but I need your help:**

If you have or had a **family member** who served either in **2nd World War or Korea**, please send me their names to be complied into a list and be mounted on a plaque setting.

We are hoping to have this completed for *Remembrance Day 2023*. Their military information will be kept in a file in the church archives.

I will need the following:

- NAME
- BIRTH & DEATH dates [if applicable]
- RANK
- COMPANY
- WHERE STATIONED, WHERE SERVED
- YEARS SERVED
- A PORTRAIT in uniform if possible

Ernie Malacko

Ernie was one of the most optimistic men ever known. He was always happy and made others happy, too. He never left home without some hard candy in his pocket. He'd greet a child with an open hand and a kind word.

Ernie was a long-time Pastoral Care Visitor for Southminster. But, he also made a practise of dropping in at the hospital and leaving a long train of laughing patients all the way down the hall.

Agnes Short

Agnes was the daughter of a fireman and was consequently raised in Firehall number 2.

She trained as a nurse in Calgary, then returned to Lethbridge to work at the Galt Hospital and later for school district no. 51. Eventually, she was employed by the Health Unit. Many citizens remember her giving them their polio vaccination in some capacity as a nurse; she worked in Lethbridge from 1939-1980. She was also involved in many community organizations, eventually earning the YWCA's Woman of Distinction award.

Here at Southminster, we remember her as a long-serving Elder. She was famous for saying "It is a pleasure to serve". She was always taking care of someone, right to the time of her death.

The following Thursday **Lenten Lunches** at noon are still coming up in March:


