# Minister's Message:

#### Spring has sprung.

As a result, it is that time of year: next week, I will be away for the Annual General Meeting of Chinook Winds Regional Council of which Southminster belongs.

Chinook Winds is made up of all the United Churches in southern Alberta, south of hi-way 13. All of the clergy, as well as lay delegates from every congregation, join together for four days of decision making, worship, workshops, and fellowship. This year we are meeting at Fifth-Avenue Memorial United Church in Medicine Hat.



For the second year in a row, I will be serving as the chair of the business committee, which manages the agenda and handles the decision-making portions of the meeting. Many people think I must have something wrong with my brain to actually enjoy doing that, but I get great satisfaction from a well-run meeting and try to make the four 10-hour days of meetings as painless as possible.

I will not be returning to chair the business committee next year. I have been named the chair of the planning committee for the 45th General Council meeting in Calgary in 2025, the centennial year of The United Church of Canada. I guess that's what happens when you do a good job.

However, I will remain as a member of the Chinook Winds Executive Committee. The executive sets the policy directives for the Regional Council, and the Executive Minister and staff execute those directives. The executive meets four times a year, either on Zoom or at the Regional Council Office in Okotoks.

Of course, the big news at Southminster has been last week's congregational meeting on affirming ministry.

Last year at the annual congregational meeting, the congregation of Southminster received a letter from one of our members asking us to consider exploring the possibility of our church becoming an affirming ministry of The United Church of Canada. To express publicly, intentionally, and explicitly our welcome of all people, regardless of sexual orientation or gender expression.

For the past 14 months we have engaged in a directed program as prescribed by Affirm United, the national network which provides the affirming designation to ministries of the United Church. We have considered our welcome of other marginalized groups, considering race, class, family composition, and physical and mental ability and health.

### **George Rogers**

On the wall between the windows in the boardroom is a framed picture of the church with an insert of George Rogers. George was a member of Southminster United Church for over 60 years and during those years he wore many hats.

- . He was a caretaker for the church.
- ❖ He held the door open on Sunday mornings and greeted people as they came to church.
- ❖ He closed the windows and locked the doors after events held in the church.
- ❖ He was a storyteller relating many memories and recollections of events that occurred within Southminster.
- ❖ He was familiar with every nook and cranny of the building.
- ❖ He was a member of the Men's Club in the 1970s and was on their publicity and PR Committees.
- ❖ He led the singalongs before each meeting and was on the executive for many years.
- George loved music and he was a member of the choir from 1943 to 1968. The music director A. K. Putland was his stepfather.
- ❖ He enjoyed coffee time every morning in the kitchen.
- ❖ He is remembered as a kind soul who loved his church and the people in it, and the contentment he felt to be needed.
- ❖ He passed away in 2009.

On April 23rd, at a special congregational meeting, the Church Council presented the final report of the Affirming Taskforce, including an affirming statement, an affirming action plan, and an equal marriage policy. A motion, that Southminster United Church submit an application with Affirm United to become an affirming ministry of The United Church of Canada, was adopted.

When we have received this approval, we will hold a celebration to declare that Southminster is a two spirit, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, and asexual affirming congregation.

On May 21, the Sunday of the May long-weekend, we will have the final session of the Building God's Beloved Community book study. I want to thank everyone who has participated in this over the past year. Proposing and then editing the book was a giant 4-year undertaking. I am so glad that I could share this first time through the book with all of you. As God wills it, it should serve as a tremendous resource to those seeking confirmation and new membership within the United Church for years to come.

Speaking of, at the end of May on Pentecost Sunday, Southminster will be having a new members Sunday. A wonderful celebration for those who have decided to officially make Southminster their spiritual home. To celebrate this day fully, we will be serving ice cream and inviting food trucks into the north parking lot for a picnic following worship. I hope to see many of you there.

Our church is so richly blessed by each person who contributes to make it the special place that it is.
