Minister's Message:

October was a busy month around the church. Every Sunday after worship we had multiple things happening: Rev. Tad and Rev. Carol's discussion group, new directory photos, fall supper planning. Even though we often feel pulled in multiple directions, the office staff say how thankful we need to be to have a church with lots of things going on, and multiple activities for our members to be involved with.



Speaking of the fall supper, it was a tremendous success. Not only in providing hospitality and fellowship for those who attended, but also in raising money for our congregation and the charitable works of the **Men's Club**. Many thanks to the Men's Club for hosting, as well as everyone who had a hand in the work.

During a week of Continued education in October, MiYeon and I attended the **Western Intercultural Network** event in St. Albert, Alberta. The theme explored an intercultural lens to reconciliation work within the church. There were many excellent and inspiring speakers, including Rev. MiYeon. For me the highlight was singing some of the new hymns being prepared for **Then Let Us Sing** project, a new online hymn resource that is being compiled to celebrate The United Church of Canada's centennial in 2025. We'll likely hear some in worship in the coming months.

During that week I also participated in a one-day meeting of the **General Council**, which now meets annually online to conduct business between the triennial in person meetings. The **Chinook Winds Regional Council Executive** met in Stettler on November 2-3. I could not attend the meeting in person due to a nagging injury from falling on the stairs at the church, but I was able to join using Zoom.

The Regional Council operates differently from the previous Presbytery and Conference. They are much less of a rules enforcement body, and more of companion in helping our ministries to flourish. I suspect I may have some very positive news to share with you in the coming months as a result of my advocacy for our southwest Alberta churches.

During **Advent**, we will have a 4-week **Bible study** on Sundays following worship. We will be reading the **Book of Revelation** (always appropriate for Advent). If you wish to participate, I'll invite you to read the following chapters prior to each session: <u>Sun Nov. 26</u>: Chapters 1-4; <u>Sun Dec. 3</u>: Chapters 5-11; <u>Sun Dec. 10</u>: Chapters 12-17; <u>Sun Dec. 17</u>: Chapters 18-22

Finally, on **Remembrance Day**, we remember those in the Armed Forces who have died in conflict. Members of our congregation have been working on a project this past year that we look forward to sharing with you on Nov. 5.

During the Second World War the following happened at Southminster:

1939 Men's Club had Major H.C. Singer from the 20th Anti Tank Battery as guest speaker. He spoke on the progression of the war.

1940 The official board stated that an Honor Roll was being made to keep record of members & and adherents of the church who enlisted

- A suitable flag for church was discussed.
- Women's Association had speakers from the armed services.

1941 All women groups of the church were busy with sewing, quilting and knitted articles during the years at war.

- Fireside chats after church service included members of the armed services stationed in and around Lethbridge.
- The Union Jack to be hung in the church. The flag was donated by Mr & Mrs. J.T. Wallace.

1942 An entertainment evening for the troops was hosted by Women's Association at the YMCA. There was also a Sunday Tea, a concert and dance for armed forces.

1943 The Business Girl's Club's programs included visiting the #8 Bombing & Gunnery Hospital, collecting sewing, knitting for overseas troops, and collecting war stamps and certificates here at home.

Every year of the war, Christmas cards were sent to the troops overseas and to those serving along the coasts of Canada.

1944 The church **mortgage was burned**. Members of the church stand with Reverend H Muchmor at the

pulpit.



1945 Arthur Putland's arrangement of High Flight, a poem by Pilot Officer John Gillespie MaGee was presented to the congregation. Unfortunately, there is no copy in the archives.

Dear Folks of Southminster;

This month we – the Stewardship Committee – would like to address you with a little challenge. I could go on and ramble a bit about how we came to be where we are – but you all know the story by now. So, let's keep it short and – well, not sure if "sweet" is the right word.

Nonetheless, we are – financially - where we are. It is nearing the end of the year, and we need to catch up our Givings to come close to meeting our accepted Budget. And, Well, November IS Stewardship Month – so most of you will be expecting this anyway.

Please take a look at the Financial Summary chart. If you hadn't noticed before, it shows our expenses – compared to the annual Budget, breaking it down to the costs per week and even the costs per day VS the Budget per day.

Let's take a look at some specific expenses that are not normally recovered:

You can see that all our expenses are under budget. We are - and have always been – very careful about our spending.

This brings us to the Challenge Part . . . For lack of anything more creative, we can call it the *"Colour the Calendar"* Challenge.

We are offering you the opportunity to sponsor the expense of your choice and the date of your choice. We are using **November and December** as our **Make Up Months**. Here's how it works:

For a donation to the General Fund of

between 5 - 10, you can sponsor one day of the cost of communications

Between \$15 – 25 – sponsor the paper & photocopying

Between \$ 20 – 50 - sponsor Building Repairs & Maintenance


Between \$45 – 55 – pay one day of Insurance

Between \$75 – 100 – choose to pay all the overhead, administrative costs

Between \$ 90 – 110 – you can cover the utilities for the day

I like November 20th (Rhedyn's Birthday) and Dec 22nd (Maeghan's) – I will choose to cover at least – maybe more – expense for those days. Once I pay the funds in to the office, a colour specific to the expense I've chosen can be placed on the Calendar Poster that will be displayed in the hallway.
