Yom Teruah: Feast of Trumpets

Leviticus 23: 23-25:

²³ The LORD said to Moses, ²⁴ “Say to the Israelites: ‘On the first day of the seventh month you are to have a day of sabbath rest, a sacred assembly commemorated with trumpet blasts. ²⁵ Do no regular work but present a food offering to the LORD.’”

Yom Teruah: Feast of Trumpets

Numbers 29:1-6

29 “On the first day of the seventh month hold a sacred assembly and do no regular work. It is a day for you to sound the trumpets.

² As an aroma pleasing to the LORD, offer a burnt offering of one young bull, one ram and seven male lambs a year old, all without defect.

³ With the bull offer a grain offering of three-tenths of an ephah of the finest flour mixed with olive oil; with the ram, two-tenths;

⁴ and with each of the seven lambs, one-tenth.

⁵ Include one male goat as a sin offering to make atonement for you.

⁶ These are in addition to the monthly and daily burnt offerings with their grain offerings and drink offerings as specified. They are food offerings presented to the LORD, a pleasing aroma.

Yom Teruah Today: Rosh Hashanah

- The words “Rosh Hashanah” do not appear in the Bible. They first are used in the Mishna around 200 A.D.
- *Rosh Hashanah*, the Jewish New Year, is observed on the first day of the month of *Tishrei* on the Hebrew calendar, which falls in September or October.
- Unlike the secular New Year, *Rosh Hashanah* (which means, literally, “the head of the year” in English) is not characterized by frivolity and celebration. Instead, it is a holy day marked by moral and spiritual introspection.
- *“But if a wicked man turns away from all the sins he has committed and keeps all my decrees and does what is just and right, he will surely live; he will not die. . . . Do I take any pleasure in the death of the wicked? declares the Sovereign LORD. Rather, am I not pleased when they turn from their ways and live?. . . Rid yourselves of all the offenses you have committed and get a new heart and a new spirit.” — Ezekiel 18:21, 23, 31*

Rosh Hashanah Today: Reflection and Resolution


The *Malkhuyot*:


Portions of the *Zikhorot*:

[T]hose lost in the land of Assyria, and those cast away in the land of Egypt shall come back and worship ADONAI on the holy mountain in Jerusalem...



Celebration Today: Joy in the Lord

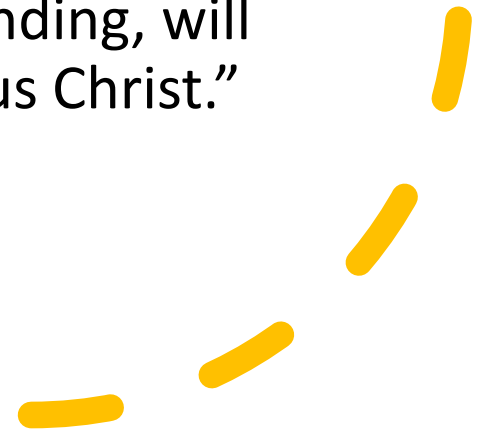
Philippians 4:4-7 (The Passion Translation):
