Greetings dear readers of the Freshwaters Current, may the blessing and peace of the Holy Spirit be with you and your families.

In Romans 12:9-21 we find Paul outlining for us how to live our faith in Christ Jesus. This is not the only letter where he does it, but this is one that is oft quoted. In this passage we see elements of our faith that we strive to do – we are called to abhor evil, stand for what is good. We should be passionate in our faith through words, deeds, attitudes, and behavior. Our love for God and one another should not be fake, but genuine. We should be hospitable to those in need. political, societal divisions are deepening. It is easy to get swept up in this division that causes us to see one another as enemies. Paul and our Savior Jesus Christ call us to live a life that does not reflect the way of the world. Rather than respond with hate; we respond with love and prayer; we respond with honor rather than dishonor. As much as it depends on you "live peaceably with all." I do not pretend that this is easy to do, but the way of Christ is not easy. Transformation of hearts, minds, lives is not easy – it is painful at times. What we are called to do, and I believe that this is what the world needs is a people who live counter to the culture of "us" versus "them." As Paul says, "if your enemy is hungry feed him; if he is thirsty give him something to drink....do not be overcome by evil, overcome evil with good."

What I appreciate about this congregation is we hold differing perspectives of the world, and yet we strive to live together in the love of Christ Jesus. This is something we can teach and reflect to the world around us. Basically, what Paul is saying is live your faith daily with love and conviction; be humble, give your hurts to God, pray, forgive, have mercy, live and act with Christ's compassion. If we can live this every day – we can change our families, our community, indeed the very world. May we be that people – people who live with the marks of a true Christian. Amen!
