## Terrific Treat Recipes!!!

### **Fish Fudge** (adapted from Clean Run Magazine)

1 can mackerel (14 oz)

2 eggs

2 Tbls garlic powder

1 c flour of your choice (Adding tapioca flour as part of the flour makes them almost non-crumby)

Blend mackerel, eggs, and garlic powder in blender. Add flour and mix. Coat a 7" x 10" pan with cooking spray or line pan with aluminum foil instead. Bake approximately 30 minutes until cooked through, but not hard. Cut into preferred size. A pizza cutter works well.

Reading level of grades 1-3.

This book is written by Caldecott Winner Ezra Jack Keats. It follows a boy trying to learn to whistle for his dog.

Jade Lost in Yellowstone by Michelle Caffrey (Breed of dog- Australian Shepard)

Reading level of grades 3-5.

This book is based on a true story in which Jade, a young Australian Shepard, was lost in Yellowstone for 44 days. Hint: It does have a happy ending!

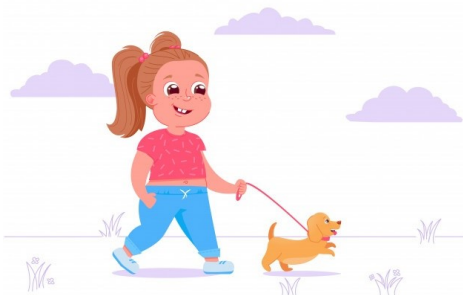
Activity for all books: Dog Ultimate Sticker Book (Can be found on Amazon)

This book with reusable stickers can be used with a variety of age levels

Level 1- With the youngest children (kindergarten- 2<sup>nd</sup>) simply matching the reusable pictures to the dog shapes. Mom or dad should tell them the breeds of the dog

Level 2- With children slightly more knowledgeable of dog breeds. They can identify the dogs and match to corresponding pictures.

Level 3- With older children. The entire reading text can be used. The kids would then learn about the various dog groupings and characteristics of the breeds.
