Monthly Command Report

For April Emergency Response:

For the month of April, there were a total of **36** fire calls.

For the month of April, there were total of **41 911** EMS calls with **23** Transports and **18** non- transports. Of the transports, there were **23** ALS and **00** BLS calls.

In addition, there were **35** facility transfers completed.

For the month of April there were a total of **76** EMS runs.

ALS- Advanced Life Support

BLS- Basic Life Support

Average response time for the month was **08** minutes and **18** seconds. This is a door-to-door time.

Emergency Vehicles:

B-22: Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report. Suspension and brake repairs were completed by southwest brake and alignment.

B-21B (New Heavy): Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

2 1/2 Ton 22 B: Apparatus is being checked daily and is in Service without any major issues to report.

E-22: No change in status. We are still working with third party re sale vendors to secure a buyer.

E-21: OOS. The engine repairs have begun on this unit.

Loaner Engine: Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report. We are responsible for any repairs while it is in our possession.

T-22: Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service. Siddons and Deep South have agreed on the repair bill, repair work should start in the first half of May.

M-23: Unit is being checked daily and is in service.

M-22: The medic unit is being checked daily and is in service. A faulty oil filter was replaced in house.

M-21 (New Medic Unit): Unit is being checked daily without any major issues to report. Due to an odd amount of condensation building up in one of the compartments, hvac filters and drain tubes were replaced. During this time, a electrical recall was discovered for the unit from Demers. The unit is still safe for us to operate; however, it will require a full strip job. To minimize our downtime, Siddons is providing us with a brand-new demo truck to use during our unit's downtime. To further minimize our unit's downtime, a brand-new box is being shipped down from the Demers plant. The new box will be put on our chassis and will be specced the exact same as our current box. Our current box will then be sent back to the Demers plant, and our unit will return to service. This is set to take place in the first half of May.

Rescue 22: Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service. This unit is currently being temporarily utilized as a Command unit.

MISC:

The order for the new pumper/tender has been placed with Siddons and is under construction and is on track.

Personnel:

With the raise and benefit package roll out, we have begun to finally have relief from staffing hardships.

Administration:

Admin team is working on running self DSHS & TCFP compliance audits in order to ensure that we are holding ourselves to a high standard.

Wilson County will be upgrading its radio infrastructure to the LCRA radio system. This does require an upgrade of our apparatus and handheld radio equipment prior to January 2023.

Training:

EMS

Crews reviewed and trained on the following:

- Trauma Assessment
- TXA & Whole Blood administration

Fire

Crews reviewed and trained on the following:

- Pump Operations
- Draft Training
- Nursing Operations
- Radio operations

Station:

Any public walk ups to the department are being redirected to the front doors instead on leaving the apparatus bays open. This is to ensure health safety for both the public and the personnel.

Grants/Donations:

Our agency was awarded with a \$20,000 PPE grant from the Texas Forestry Service. We also have an admin team pursuing several other grant opportunities.

Public Relations:

Fire: Our biggest obstacle remains to be the age and condition of apparatus and equipment, leaving more equipment out of service than in service. This has begun to cause a decrease in the quality of relationships with surrounding departments.

EMS:

The Standard Medical Operating Protocols are currently in the final review stage. We are on our last pass of edits before a full launch.

Misc.: A major focus point of the department remains to create a strong professional working relationship with surrounding departments and increase the number of local volunteers.
