Monthly Command Report

For June Emergency Response:

For the month of June, there were a total of **29** fire calls.

For the month of June, there were total of **48 911** EMS calls with **34** Transports and **14** non- transports. Of the transports, there were **21** ALS and **13** BLS calls.

In addition, there were **50** facility transfers completed.

For the month of April there were a total of **98** EMS runs.

ALS- Advanced Life Support

BLS- Basic Life Support

Average response time for the month was **09** minutes and **53** seconds. This is a door-to-door time.

Emergency Vehicles:

B-22: Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report. Additional repairs are still needed to repair a bad foam line and sweep sprayers.

B-21B (New Heavy): Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report. Plumbing repairs are needed in order to have the booster line placed into service.

2 ½ Ton 22 B: Apparatus is being checked daily and is in Service without any major issues to report.

E-22: No change in status. We are still working with third party re sale vendors to secure a buyer.

E-21: Engine repairs have been completed & the apparatus is back in service. The apparatus will remain in service with us until the new engine has been delivered.

Loaner Engine: Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report. We are responsible for any repairs while it is in our possession.

T-22: Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service. Siddons and Deep South have agreed on the repair bill. Now that E21 is back in service, the parts for the tank repair job have been ordered. When they are received, the repairs job will be scheduled. The loaner engine will remain in our possession until the repairs are complete.

M-23: Unit is being checked daily and is in service. In order to remain DSHS compliant, the unit went to Siddons to have a faulty compressor replaced.

M-22: Unit is being checked daily and is in service.

M-21 (New Medic Unit): Unit is being checked daily without any major issues to report. The warranty repair work has been completed by Siddons, and the unit is back in service.

Rescue 22: Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service. This unit is currently being temporarily utilized as a Command unit. Necessary repairs needed for the AC system was completed by Carlisle Auto-Air.

MISC:

The order for the new pumper/tender has been placed with Siddons and is on track. Our approval visit is scheduled for the week of June 18th.

Personnel:

With the raise and benefit package roll out, we have begun to finally have relief from staffing hardships. The new benefit package is still not fully complete, as the retirement plan is still being finalized.

Administration:

Admin team is working on running self DSHS & TCFP compliance audits in order to ensure that we are holding ourselves to a high standard.

Our biannual audit period with TCFP is set to close the week of July 3rd.

Wilson County will be upgrading its radio infrastructure to the LCRA radio system. This does require an upgrade of our apparatus and handheld radio equipment prior to January 2023.

Training:

EMS

- Whole Blood equipment operations

Fire

Crews reviewed and trained on the following:

- Area Familiarization
- Radio operations
- Different hose lay applications
- Ladder operations
- Pump and deck gun operations

Station:

Any public walk ups to the department are being redirected to the front doors instead on leaving the apparatus bays open. This is to ensure health safety for both the public and the personnel.

Grants/Donations:

Nothing new to report at this time.

Public Relations:

Nothing to report at this time.

Fire: Our biggest obstacle remains to be the age and condition of apparatus and equipment, leaving more equipment out of service than in service. This has continued to cause a decrease in the quality of relationships with surrounding departments.

EMS:

The Standard Medical Operating Protocols are currently in the final review stage. We are on our last pass of edits before a full launch.

Misc.: A major focus point of the department remains to create a strong professional working relationship with surrounding departments and increase the number of local volunteers.
