## **Monthly Command Report**

### For October 2019

#### **Emergency Response:**

For the month of October, there were a total of **25** fire calls. Average response time for the month was **12** minutes and **37** seconds. This is a door to door time. Average response time increased this month due to responding to multiple mutual aid calls. Additional information can be viewed in the all in one report for the month.

For the month of October, there were total of **37** EMS calls with **29** Transports and **8** non-transports. Of the transports, there were **23** ALS and **6** BLS calls.

#### **Emergency Vehicles:**

**B-90:** A new turbo was installed by Billy Bob's and the unit is back in service.

**B-91-** A new water pump was installed by Billy Bob's, and the unit is now operational.

**5-TON/B92:** Crews are still working in house to correct wiring issues to ensure all vehicle headlights, taillights, turn signals, and side marker lights were working properly. Parts are being fabricated in house to properly install a new lightbar. Unit is still able to respond to calls.

<u>2 ½ Ton/B93:</u> Unit is being checked daily without any major issues to report. The electric hose reel still needs to be repaired.

**E-90:** Unit is being checked daily without any major issues.

**E-91:** Unit is being checked daily without any issues to report.

**T-90:** Unit is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

**M-90**: Unit is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

<u>M-91:</u> There have been issues with the inverter on the unit failing, Siddons has been called to diagnose the issue. The turbo failed as well. The new parts were ordered, and repairs are being completed by Billy Bob's.

<u>Command:</u> A new radio and siren have been ordered. The initial siren that came in was defective, the company is replacing the parts, and we are waiting for them to arrive. The unit received a new set of tires.

**Rescue 90:** Unit is being checked daily without any major issues to report. The unit received a new set of tires.

#### **MISC:**

#### **Personnel:**

Volunteer Craig Chenault joined the department.

Officers are working to coordinate volunteer drives in order to further build the department's volunteer roster. Volunteers are required to complete an inactive probationary period before being eligible to move to active status with the department.

An Officer meeting was held October 21st.

#### **Administration**:

The department is currently working with 2 brokers in order to ensure that the best, feasible health benefits package is selected for the department. The current package is set to either be renewed or changed on December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019. A more detailed briefing will be provided during the ESD meeting.

#### **Training:**

<u>Fire:</u> Regular training is conducted each day as a requirement. Crews train on specific skill sets specific to crew needs. The department training coordinator completes uniform and scheduled training with all shifts at least once every 2 weeks for approximately 4 hours per shift. For the month of October, crews worked on transitional fire attack techniques along with ladder skills.

**EMS:** For the month of October, crews focused on training over protocol updates in preparation for going live with whole blood.

**Station:** The station washer machine has begun working only intermittently.

# **Grants/Donations:**

We are preparing applications for several grant programs that will be opening at the start of October.

## **Fire/EMS Prevention:**

**<u>Fire:</u>** October is Fire prevention month, and several events have been scheduled.

**EMS:** Department SMOPs (Standard Medical Operating Protocols) are currently being updated and converted to flow charts, one at a time. Once all protocols are converted to flow charts, they will be uploaded to a mobile application.

<u>Misc.:</u> A major focus point of the department has been to have positive public relations, and to create strong professional working relationships with surrounding departments.
