Monthly Command Report

For August Emergency Response:

For the month of August, there were a total of 20 fire calls.

For the month of August, there were total of **31 911** EMS calls with **22** Transports and **09** non-transports. Of the transports, there were **20** ALS and **02** BLS calls.

In addition, there were **40** facility transfers completed.

For the month of August there were a total of **71** EMS runs.

ALS- Advanced Life Support

BLS-Basic Life Support

Average response time for the month was **07** minutes and **50** seconds. This is a door-to-door time.

Emergency Vehicles:

B-22: Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report.

B-21B (New Heavy): Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report. The apparatus went to 181 Auto to have a full PM completed. The following repairs were completed: Replaced the cab suspension, hydraulic pump reservoir, window arrestor, door push rods & handles.

<u>2 ½ Ton 22 B:</u> Apparatus is being checked daily and is in Service without any major issues to report.

E-22: No change in status. We are still working with third party re sale vendors to secure a buyer. We have recently had re sale companies inquiring on the apparatus.

E-21: Engine repairs have been completed & the apparatus is back in service.

Loaner Engine: Apparatus is being checked daily without any major issues to report. We are responsible for any repairs while it is in our possession. Siddons is allowing us to keep the unit in our possession until the tank repairs on T22 are complete.

<u>T-22:</u> Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service. We are still awaiting tank repairs to be scheduled, major delays are occurring due to Deep South.

<u>M-23</u>: Unit is being checked daily and is in service.

<u>M-22:</u> Unit is being checked daily without any mechanical issues to report. This unit is out of service however, due to the stretcher needing repairs.

<u>M-21 (New Medic Unit):</u> Unit is being checked daily without any major issues to report and is in service. The unit went to 181 Auto for PM. The radiator was flushed, bad batteries & alternator replaced.

Rescue 22: Apparatus is being checked daily and is in service. This unit is still being utilized as a temporary Command. We have been experiencing AC issues, Billy Bobs is working to correct the issues as quickly as possible due to the whole blood & intercept drugs carried on the unit.

MISC:

Nothing to report.

Personnel:

We have been in contact with TCDRS, due to the length of time that has passed, we need to re complete and submit paperwork for a new quote.

Administration:

Grants/Donations:

The Command Staff is currently working on several grants.

District 2 Fire Personnel will attend the Floresville Community Market on September 10th, to show the apparatus & equipment to the community.

<u>Fire:</u> Our biggest obstacle remains to be the age and condition of apparatus and equipment, leaving more equipment out of service than in service. This has continued to cause a decrease in the quality of relationships with surrounding departments.

EMS:

The new Standard Medical Operating Protocols are complete and in place.

<u>Misc.:</u> A major focus point of the department remains to create a strong professional working relationship with surrounding departments and increase the number of local volunteers.
