FHP made arrangements for the bike and stopped by the hospital to catch the rider up with the details. After a few days for surgery and care, and a brief stay at a rehab to hone their OT & PT skills, arrangements with the family were made to bring them home for further recovery.

We stopped for a scrumptious breakfast and rolled into the Show shortly after the gate opened. It was obvious that the new



Safety Talk


Why It Goes Wrong By Doug Westly

So it happened. You weren't hurt, but your motorcycle is now lying on its side, with its tongue figuratively hanging out. As you pick yourself up, you start wondering what happened.

Motorcycle crashes are rarely the outcome of one factor. Regardless of whether it is a single vehicle crash (only the motorcycle and rider involved), or a multiple vehicle crash involving the bike and rider.

Analysis of motorcycle crashes indicates it is usually a combination of factors that results in the incident. For instance, a decreasing radius curve doesn't call a crash. However, a curve with a decreasing radius, combined with

excessive entry speed and/or improper braking can certainly result in the rider and bike going down. In fact, crash statistics tell us that the majority of single vehicle motorcycle crashes occur in curves or turns.



When we start looking at motorcycle crashes, there are certainly those that are truly accidents. Maybe the motorcyclist rounds a corner and in the middle of the turn hits a patch of oil on the road that he/she can't see. Maybe the deer simply jumps out of the woods without warning. There is little we can do about these types of events.

However, a lot of crashes could be prevented if the rider simply paid attention to the surrounding riding environment. If they recognize a dangerous curve is imminent, then takes appropriate prior action, such as slowing down, taking a proper entry line, using their head and eyes to follow through the turn, etc., it may prevent an incident. When the rider is approaching the intersection, are they paying attention to the other vehicles in or approaching the intersection?

When it comes down to it, we participate in a risk-intensive sport. There are inherent dangers that exist every time we get on our motorcycle. If we are going to be safe on our bikes, then it is incumbent upon us to take advantage of training and experience, as well as focusing on our riding and the surrounding environment.

The next time you get on your bike, think about not only where you are going and how you are going to get there, but also how you are going to remain safe on the road. Make sure you are focusing not only on the route, but also your surrounding riding environment. Try to predict potential dangers. Stay alert to cues that may indicate a potential threat. Remember that if you can eliminate just one or two of the contributing factors, you may just prevent the crash that could be waiting for you.
