

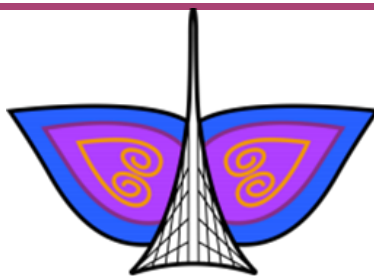

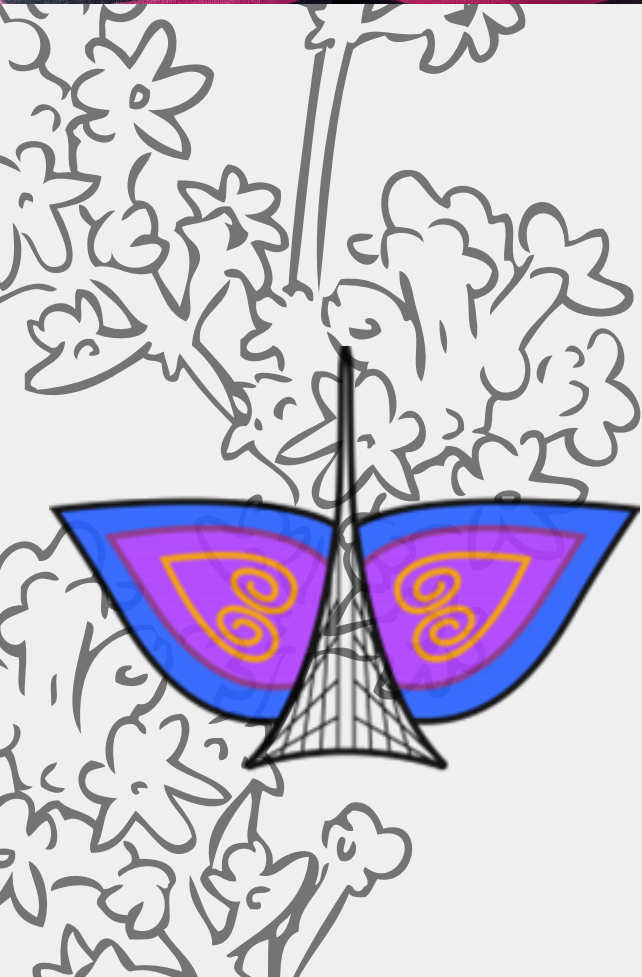
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## WHERE WE ARE NOW

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Since our creation in 2008, our organization has changed and grown. MCHH was created after an alarming rate of Hmong women were diagnosed with Breast and Cervical cancer. It was our goal and mission to spread education and access to screening and prevention to our people. Now we work extensively with our newer Southeast Asian refugee populations to help reduce inequities faced each day. Our compassionate community health workers work with a variety of programs and team up with other organizations to improve quality of life for all.

The global pandemic put a pause on many of our outreach community events and it took a moment to figure out how we would rise up and continue our work. Soon enough we figured out how to connect with the community and do outreach over platforms like Facebook and Zoom. We organized distributions and donations to ensure our community was getting enough during the uncertainty. 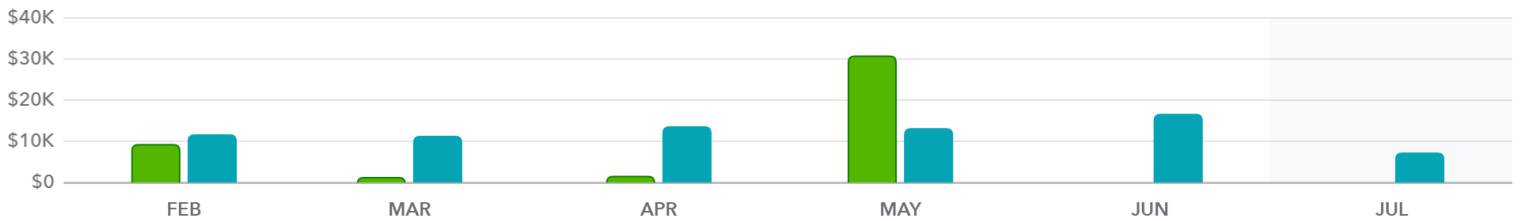

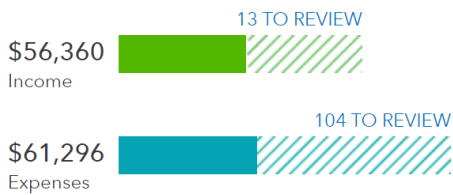

# Our Programs

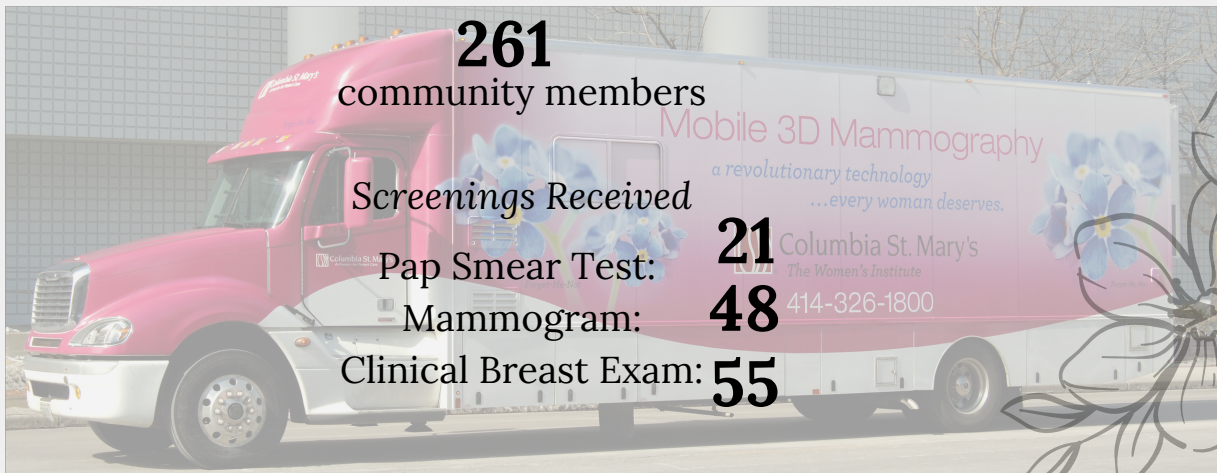
## Well Woman Program

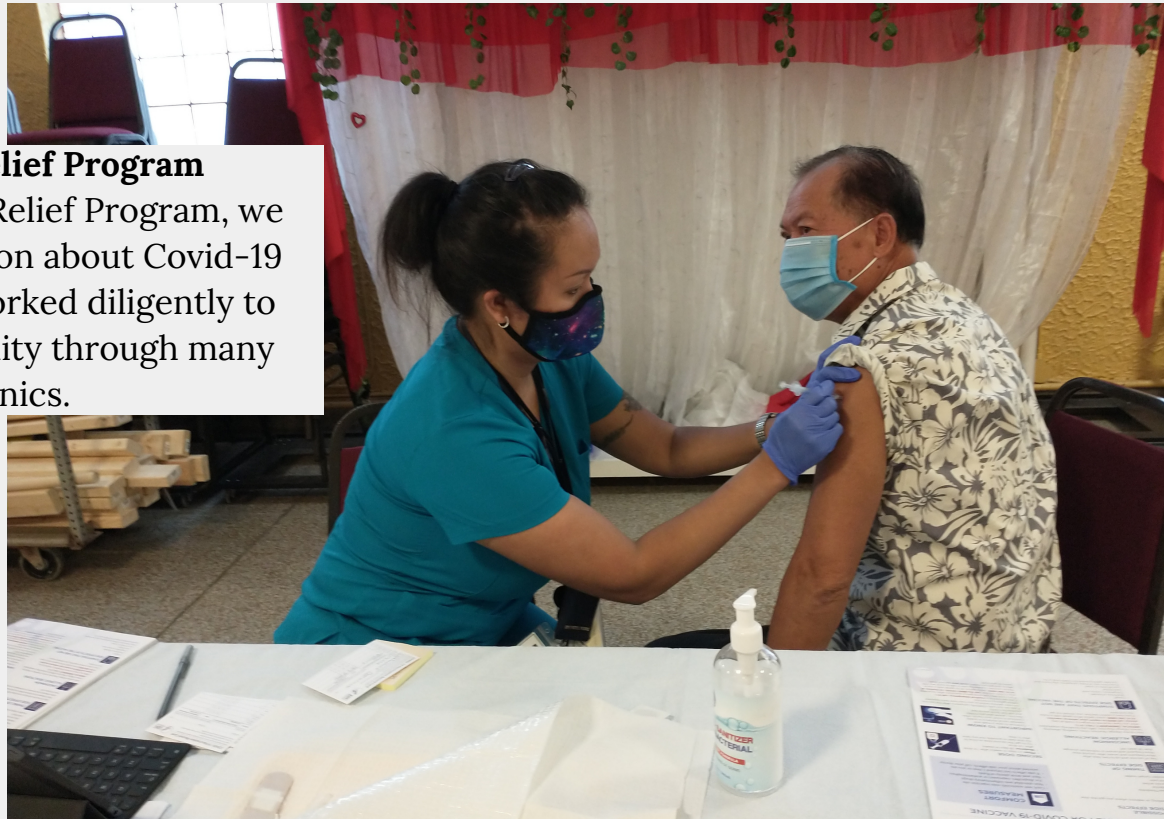
