- the ability to plan for the future progression of the disease
- the ability to quickly adapt to changes In symptoms
- a full and detailed understanding of all treatment options
- connections to clinical trials

Your movement disorder specialist will have:

- 1. experience with prescribing PD medications and with managing the side effects
- 2. experience with managing non-motor symptoms
- 3. experience administering botox for various non-motor symptoms
- 4. training In Deep Brain Stimulation (DBS) management
