To qualify for a mentor, a learner has to have attended a course. An INTO learner will be identified ready for a mentor at the County practical element. Further qualifications, the learners can contact me direct to request a mentor once the online course is complete. I will allocate a mentor to the learners or the learner and mentor may arrange but I do need to be informed to keep my database up to date.

Mentors provide verbal and written feedback to the learners at/after every session so the learner have reference to look back on. A copy of the feedback is then sent to me for my records.

Criteria to become a mentor – you have to be and keep yourself up to date with all rules and protocols. You are also able to commit to the time to help the leaners. To qualify you are required to attend mentoring training {2 hour session} followed by observation on a practical session.
