GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT



What a year! I am so grateful to write to you of the wonderful year Manitoba Underground Opera has had. This season especially touched my heart by focusing on social issues in a pair of new venues, as well as utilizing a favourite venue in a new way.

Dido Aeneas marked the first time MUO has produced a Canadian composed opera. We paired Purcell's traditional Dido and Aeneas with James Rolfe's Aeneas and Dido in the Broadway Neighbourhood Centre. Both operas tell the same tragic story but from two different points of view. Purcell's from Dido's, sung by Elizabeth Hoyt-Surdhar, and Rolfe's from Aeneas', sung by Paul Winkelmans. Led by stage director Adam Da Ros and conductor Dr. Alexandra Dee. our production focused on high school bullying and teenage suicide. Our Sorceress and witches, imagined as the popular clique, ran a vicious campaign of social media bullying and mass texts against the main couple. The devastating final chorus number was preceded by the chorus receiving news of Dido's suicide via texts and social media updates.

On a lighter note, MUO held its first promenade opera this year, Lost Voices. Audiences traveled around the La Cathédrale de Saint-Boniface in a new production created by Artistic Director Brenna Corner and multi-talented artist Sawver Craig. historical Focusing on women figures, poets, and composers, this show spoke to those that have lost their voices. Despite history doing a great disservice by ignoring some prominent women, this show ended on a hopeful note: that we will all move forward with an open red, red heart.

Completing our traditional trio of festival shows was my own artistic child, a semi-staged version of *The Triumph of Truth and Time* by Handel presented in the cre8ery gallery. I've loved this oratorio for so many years not only because of its musical riches but because it speaks to a great inner conflict of our contemporary society.

Our world of instant gratification and convenience lends itself to choosing our own pleasure over self-sacrifice. Our protagonist, Beauty (sung by Sawyer Craig-we kept her very busy this summer) confronts her own decisions and mortality and turns away from Pleasure, sung by MUO veteran Carmen Harris.

If our season had only been those three successful productions, we would have been thrilled, but we were elated by the incredible successes of our outreach activities and our Opera for Children tour.

45 events in 2019

Our friend, the Downtown Winnipeg Biz, invited us to perform at their Cityplace Concert Series on Tuesday, August 20th and at their Farmers' Markets at True North Square every Thursday of August. Combined with our regular Lunch Hour Concert at the Amsterdam Tea Room, we presented public opera for free to over 600 Winnipeggers.

Our Opera for Children tour of *The Three Little Pigs*, stage directed by Sarah Jane Pelzer and music directed by Nicola Davies, was performed 23 times. In Winnipeg, this show was performed at 14 Public Library locations, one daycare and one summer camp. This tour was also a landmark in MUO's history. The Three Little Pigs performed at seven regional libraries,

including Altona, Gimli, Morden, Portage la Prairie, Selkirk, Steinbach, and Winkler, marking the first time MUO has performed outside the city of Winnipeg. Being that Manitoba is in our name, we have long wanted to make an impact outside of the city. We are so excited to have finally made it happen. This tour reached over 1,000 parents and children.

New this year, we were engaged by our friends at the Dalnavert Museum to present a concert series to compliment their *Strike* 1919 exhibit. We presented three concerts in the fall about revolution and music that highlighted underdog stories.

In addition to our artistic success, we were very fortunate to receive substantial public funder money, as well as foundation money for which we were eligible for the first time. Financially, you'll notice this was our strongest year and has built a nest egg for our future seasons.

Thank you for all of your support. 2019's season was the greatest so far in MUO history.





FAST PITCH

Manitoba Underground was selected to participate in Winnipeg Foundation's 2019 Fast Pitch during January and February. 16 local charities are paired with 32 professionals from other industries to work on a 3-minute pitch for \$20,000 in prize money.

General Manager Brendan McKeen was paired with Kathryn McBurney (of Tripwire Media) and Kelly Fournel (from the Government of Manitoba).


FINANCIAL OVERVIEW


2019 was the most financially successful year for MUO to date. Revenues increased and allowed for more money to go towards our artists. Additionally the previous deficit was paid off leaving the company in positive financial standing.

This year marks the first complete year of charity status for the company. Grants from the Winnipeg and Thomas Sills Foundations account for most of the revenue gains.

Moving forward, all box office sales will be "rolled over" to the succeeding year. The box office revenue from 2019 will be budgeted into 2020, 2020's box office will be budgeted into 2021, etc. This will allow MUO more flexibility in planning with current box office sales never being required to make our budget balance.


REVENUES: \$86,009.82




