JOINING INSTRUCTIONS - PROVINCIAL MARKSMANSHIP COMPETITION 2024

Ref: CCOMCS Rule Book Sep 2021

GENERAL

- 1. The Provincial Marksmanship Competition will occur at Edmonton Garrison Twin Arena from 13-14 April 2024.
- 2. These Joining Instructions are published to help participants prepare for their travel and activities related to the Provincial Marksmanship Competition.

ARRIVAL/INTAKE

- 3. All out-of-town participants are to arrive at BB222 NLT 2300hrs on 12 April 2024. All local participants should arrive NLT 0730 13 April 2024.
- 4. A coaches briefing will be held at 0700 at the mess hall. All coaches will receive the detailed competition and match schedule during this initial briefing.

TRAVEL, RATIONS AND ACCOMMODATIONS

- 5. All travel outside of the Greater Edmonton area for cadets and coaches will be arranged and published by J4 Movements. Travel for competition staff will be booked through J8 Finance.
- 6. Two buses have been arranged to transport cadets from Northern and Southern Alberta. The following is a brief summary of the schedule. Please refer to the travel orders provided by J4 Movements.

- MEDICINE HAT LETHBRIDGE CALGARY RED DEER EDMONTON
 - Departing Patterson Armoury Medicine Hat at 1600
 - Departing Vimy Ridge Armoury Lethbridge at 1800
 - Departing HMCS Tecumseh Calgary at 2015
 - Departing Co-Op Place Wetaskawin at 2200
 - o Arriving Edmonton 2330
 - Departing Sunday April 14 at 1400
- 7. Teams that are flying will need to ensure cadets have a copy of their itinerary from Fortress and have a government-issued photo ID that matches the name on their ticket. Coaches who incur unexpected costs for excess baggage when travelling via commercial air are authorized to claim expenses with a CF52 under the activity in code.
- 8. Meals-on-route will be provided by J4 Movements as required. Anyone meeting a bus after 1200hrs will eat lunch prior to departure from their residences.
- 9. Accommodations for out-of-town participants and staff are provided at Edmonton Garrison B222. Linens/bedding is provided; however, all members must ensure they bring their own towels and toiletries
- 10. Rations are provided for out-of-town participants and staff for the weekend. The first meal in the Mess Hall for out-of-town participants and staff will be breakfast on 13 April, and the last will be a box lunch on 14 April. Supper for local participants and staff on April 13 will only be at the mess if the competition does not end before 17:30 hrs. Meals for those who do not arrive home before supper on 14 April will be arranged through J4. Any special dietary needs must be identified as soon as possible. Participants flying out on 15 April will eat breakfast at the mess prior to leaving for the airport.
- 11. Coaches are reminded that the barracks must be cleaned and left in a tidy state prior to departure on Sunday. March out is NLT 0900hrs on Sunday, 14 April but a specific checking out time for competition staff to inspect will be communicated at the coach's meeting. The cube truck will be available to move personal kit from the barracks to the arena (11 minute walk) should participants be unable to carry the items. Quarters will be inspected, and an out-clearance routine will be conducted before any teams/individuals can leave.

DRESS

12. Dress for the duration of the competition is as follows; Competition Staff will be wearing Cadpat. Coaches and Cadets will be in appropriate civilian attire.

EQUIPMENT

13. All equipment required to set up the range and related areas will be provided and set

up by competition staff. Only pellets issued by competition staff are authorized.

14. Teams are responsible to bring their corps/squadron air rifles and any personal/team shooting equipment including but not limited to off hand stands and or spotting scopes. Any teams not in possession of such items can request assistance through Regional Training.

SUPERVISION & MEDICAL

- 15. Coaches are responsible for their teams during the competition. Coaches are not required to be RSOs as supervision of the range will be the competition staff's responsibility.
- 16. **IMPORTANT:** All Cadets attending Provincial Marksmanship must have a completed annual medical validation or a RMLO screened DHQ approved before they arrive to the competition, or they will not be allowed to participate.
- 17. Coaches shall ensure that all cadets who bring prescription medication, must provide this medication to their coach upon arrival. Cadets will retain and be required to manage all Epipen, inhalers and birth control pills on their own. Coaches will supervise the cadets when they are required to take their medications.
- 18. After hours, medical emergencies shall be taken to the Sturgeon Community Hospital. Urgent or life threatening emergencies shall dial 911. Any medical treatment or injuries must be reported to the coach or competition staff immediately

COMPETITION STRUCTURE

- 19. A safety briefing will be conducted before the start of the arena's zeroing time, where the range will be set up.
- 20. All specifications of the Provincial Competition will follow the CCOMCS Rule book. It is the responsibility of the coaches to read the rule book and ensure they seek clarity wherever necessary. All questions can be directed to Capt Bentley Barr, (Chief of Competition) prior to the competition or to any competition staff during the competition. A thorough briefing will also be given at the mandatory coaches meeting on Saturday, 13 March 2024. Some key points include:
 - a. All shooting will be conducted on the SIUS electronic targets;
 - b. Equipment will be checked
 - c. Cadets will shoot three (3) relays in the prone position on Saturday and two (2) relays in the standing position on Sunday.
- 21. A Junior is a cadet who has not reached the age of 15 by two (2) days after the

conclusion of the Provincial Championship, which is **16 April 2024**. An Open Competitor must not have turned 19 by the same date. It is the responsibility of coaches and the Corps/Squadron COs to ensure their team composition of Juniors and Open is correct. Ages will be verified on FORTRESS prior to the competition. Age errors could result in team disqualification.

<u>ADMINISTRATION</u>

- 22. Cadets who have been selected for the Stage III Provincial Competition have been added to the FORTRESS serial under "Summer Training and Activities by Selection" tab and changes should have been communicated to the OPI and OIC.


