### The Grand Knight's Message November, 2016

Brother Knights, Sister Columbiettes, Family and Friends of Father Judge Council,

October was dedicated to the Holy Rosary. Our council presented three opportunities to its members to pray the Rosary. On October 15<sup>th</sup> at 12:00 noon we gathered at the corner of Cheshire Place and 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue to pray the rosary in public. Over 35 Knights, Columbiettes, their family members and parishioners attended the "public square" rosary. It was a heart warming experience. At our social meeting we held a living rosary prayer service. We had 50 People participate, each held one bead of a bigger than life set of rosary beads. We were led by Fr. O'Leary and celebrated the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary. Finally, at the 4<sup>th</sup> degree meeting we hosted on October 19<sup>th</sup>, as is customary at any 4<sup>th</sup> degree meeting we recited a single decade of the Rosary.

I am so proud of our council family and the way we came together to celebrate and honor the Holy Rosary. In October we also came together as a family for the council's first Knights of Columbus monthly Mass. With little fanfare approximately 40 members of our council and auxiliaries and their families attended the 10:30am Mass on Sunday, October 23<sup>rd</sup>. Deacon Braun welcomed us during his homily and told the congregation how the Knights of Columbus "spread the word", the message in the readings and his homily. But brothers keep in mind this is also a challenge for us. As Knights our Catholic faith must always be first and foremost in our lives.

Other events in October included Dr. Ray's dinner for veterans, Oktoberfest, and Soup & Sandwich night. Dr. Ray hosted over 200 participants to honor the men and women who sacrifice so much to protect us. PGK Ed Schnepf and Carl Finke chaired another successful Oktoberfest with 109 guests in attendance. Tony Azic made homemade soups and Mike Simonelli made grilled cheese for our first Friday Night Soup & Sandwich. See the monthly recap more details on these events.

November is upon us and with the start of the Holiday season. This is an extremely busy and gift giving time of the year for our Council. Our RSVP program is in full swing. Letters were sent out to all members asking for donations to sponsor seminarians studying for the priesthood. We are all aware of the shortage of Catholic priests in the United States. Another program that comes around this time of the year is our Food Basket Program. We donate up to 15 food baskets for Thanksgiving and Christmas to the Parish Outreach food pantry for less fortunate families. Each basket costs the council up to \$50. We will also host our Thanksgiving day dinner. We open our council hall on Thanksgiving day, prepare and serve a traditional Thanksgiving Day dinner to anyone who comes by. We need volunteers to help with this event. Set-up is from 9:00am - 11:00am, we serve dinner from 1:00pm – 3:00pm and clean-up begins at 2:00pm. Other events in November include a 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> degree. If you have potential members please get their form 100 in to membership director, Ed Perillo. We are also holding our next Soup & Sandwich night on Friday, November 11<sup>th</sup>. Finally, there will be a special BINGO meeting on Tuesday, November 8<sup>th</sup> at 7:30pm at the council hall. I encourage all bingo workers to attend to discuss the future of our Saturday night Bingo.


