Grand Knight's Message, April 2020 Knight Light

Brothers, Sisters, Members of the Fr. Judge Family, and Friends:

On behalf of my family and myself, we hope that you are well and are staying safe and healthy in these most unprecedented times. Our hearts go out to all of those who have been adversely impacted by the Coronavirus (COVID-19), especially to those who have contracted the illness. You are in our prayers as we pray that God will grant us the strength to get through this terrible ordeal.

As we entered the Lenten season this year, the world was thrown off course by an invisible enemy. The novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) had set into motion a series of events none of us could have ever imagined. As we are glued to our television sets, awaiting the advice and guidance from health and government officials, we learn of the countless number of people infected by the virus, which has been growing each day. We learn of the raising number of lives taken by this virus. We have learned of our own friends and family being infected, some of whom have lost their lives. Even members of our very own Fr. Judge Family have suffered firsthand the terrible effects of this deadly virus.

In an effort to slow the spread of the virus, health and government officials have issued "stay at home" orders, enacted policies of social distancing, and discouraged group gatherings. Businesses and schools have closed. Restaurants are transitioning to take out and delivery services only. Those of us weathering the storm may find ourselves working from home and venturing out only when absolutely necessary. Some of us may be victims of the direct hit the U.S. economy has suffered as a result of these uncertain times, and may make up a part of the nearly 10 million Americans who applied for unemployment benefits by the start of this month alone. There is no question that the virus has altered our way of life.

While these times may seem dark, there is a light at the end of the tunnel. While many in the media are referring to our "new way of life" as the "new normal", I don't agree with their analysis. While many of us have had our lives changed forever, to say this is a "new normal" implies that these events will last forever; that there will be no coming back. As Catholics, we know this not to be true. We know of the power of prayer and the strength it can provide. We know that when life throws unavoidable obstacles our way, steering us off our intended paths, we can place ourselves in God's merciful hands to help guide us back. Families not only around the world, but right here in our community are suffering at this time. Families that make up our Fr. Judge Family have suffered as a result of this virus. Whether it is from losing a loved one, the loss of employment, or the mental anguish as a result of the overall stresses, many of us have had our lives changed. As a community it is important that we be there for each other — perhaps not physically present, but certainly spiritually. We must place ourselves in God's hands and pray that He help steer us back.

Many have noted the similarities between the penitential qualities of the Lenten season and the public health crisis. In the article "Lent 2020: Raise up, Sacrifice, Offer", the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops tells us that during Lent, we are asked to devote ourselves to seeking the Lord in prayer and reading Scripture, to service by giving alms, and to practice self-control through fasting." During this time of self-quarantining, we must learn to be in solitude, to sacrifice and do without many luxuries. Many can't help but to see a strong correlation between quarantining and our goals during Lent. As we are at home, we have time to pray for an end to this ordeal. We can give alms by not only donating money or goods to the poor, but by performing other acts of charity. Perhaps we

Fr. Judge Columbiettes Dress a Girl Program—Switching Gears

Three weeks ago, we were sewing dresses and making dolls for girls in need around the world. In light of our new predicament, Covid-19, we are making masks. Requests started coming in about 3

weeks ago...

After much consideration and many requests, we changed gears. In the past 2 weeks, we've produced about 400 cloth masks. The problem with cloth masks is that they do not comply with normally accepted regulations regarding infection control. Studies are contradictory regarding effectiveness. However, the masks are being used in a variety of ways. They are worn over the n95 masks, infected patients can wear them to stop spread and they can be used for peace of mind, if nothing else. Recipients of the masks are from Good Samaritan, Stony Brook, Brookhaven, and St. Charles Hospitals. I want to thank Long Island Quilts for Kids for providing us with routes for delivery and supplies. Our group ran out of elastic pretty quickly! After 2 weeks, we started using much of their stuff. LIQFK has distributed about 1800 masks to date.

I really want to thank the group of seamstresses that have stepped up to make masks! I will continue to distribute mask kits until it is safe for us all to get out!!!

ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENTS

The purpose of these awards (\$1,000 for 1st place and \$500 for 2nd place) is to provide financial assistance to an applicant to further his or her Catholic High School education. This scholarship is a onetime award per student.

- Applicant must be enrolled in a Catholic High School, grade 9, 10, 11 or 12 as of September 2020. Proof of acceptance is required. Grade average at time of application must be a minimum of 2.0 or a "C". Transcript of latest grades will be requested.
- Applicant must be related to a member of Fr. Thomas A. Judge Council, Knight or Columbiette, in good standing, living or deceased, or be a Squire.
- Application must indicate student's involvement in Church, Community or School activities and must include a statement from a Priest, program mentor, teacher, counselor, etc. as to student's character.
- An essay entitled, "How my Catholic background helps me be a better person for myself and for others." Essay should not exceed 150 type written words.
- Signature of parent or guardian is required.

Applications should be submitted to Fr. Thomas A. Judge Council, P.O. Box 1151, East Northport, NY 11731. Attn: Mark R. Guarriello, GK, and must be post marked no later than May 30, 2020. Scholarship award will be presented to the student at the Council's June 2020, meeting. Student's application will be given a numerical identification. Names will not be available to Scholarship Committee members.

The decision of the Committee is final.

A GUIDE TO MASK USE



Before putting on a mask, clean hands with alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water.



Cover mouth and nose with mask and make sure there are no gaps between your face and the mask.



Replace the mask with a new one as soon as it is damp and do not re-use single-use masks.



To remove the mask: remove it from behind (do not touch the front of mask); discard immediately in a closed bin; clean hands with alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water.

Self-quarantine is recommended for individuals who have been directly exposed to the new Coronavirus or have history of travel in infected or heavily populated areas.

Stay at home.

Limit all your nonessential travels.

Practice good hand hygiene by washing your hands with soap and water or using alcohol or hand sanitizer.



Check your temperature.
