The 2023 Morro-Schnepf Memorial Day Essay Contest

The winning essay submitted by Daniel Zanon, who read his essay at the Memorial Day Ceremony in John Walsh Park, is printed below. He will also read this before the June 5th Business Meeting. Please read

“The significance of Memorial Day for me”

It's May 29 and "Memorial Day" (formerly known as "Decoration Day") has arrived, but do we genuinely understand what Memorial Day is? Why is it significant enough to be acknowledged by the entire nation of the United States as a federal holiday? The typical response to these inquiries may be "a celebration of those who gave their lives for our country, serving in the armed forces," and while that is absolutely correct, this day has a deeper significance. Before I go any further, let me introduce myself. My name is Daniel Zanon, and I'm 16 years old and I am from Spain. I came to this country as an exchange student in order to experience what is referred to as "the American experience" and I am currently enrolled in Northport High School. Living here has given me the opportunity to become more familiar with some American customs and holidays, which has enabled me to grasp a number of ideas that I otherwise would not have been able to.

Being from a foreign nation, in all honesty, provides me the opportunity to write this essay from a different perspective, which may be something amazing and unique. I've always heard about "Memorial Day" and I was taught about it in school, but for me, it's always been a day when one remembers the people who gave their lives to serve the United States, as the name of the holiday literally states. I find this to be the bravest thing a person could ever do. As I grew older, I began reflecting on this, and numerous queries and ideas popped into my head. Why should it be viewed as a celebration rather than a time of sadness when many veterans have passed away? Is this day perceived as a triumph or, on the other hand, as a tragedy that must never be forgotten?

I have come to the conclusion that both points of view are complementary opposites. In my opinion, both of them may be correct, regarding that one can't be considered without the other. It's important to remember them fondly and with pleasant memories, but I also find it challenging to do so constantly. For this reason, I argue that the two are related since, when you think about a loved one that passed away, you typically experience both positive and negative emotions. Many American families today long for their lost loved ones. Thinking about this as I type these words chokes me up. I also discussed this topic with some of my local friends, and the majority of their responses revolved around "celebrating". But, when I asked older people, like my host grandparents, were surprisingly different. They view Memorial Day as "sad" and "nostalgic", rather than "hopeful" or "celebrated".

Memorial Day is a day dedicated to honoring those who heroically protected and served this country during difficult circumstances, that's why we can find several locations in our area in order to honor them. However, this does not imply that we should disregard the living. Every time I see a veteran wearing his cap, I hear cheers from the crowd. I have witnessed this act of gratitude many times. I find it to be both beautiful and characteristically human to express our gratitude to others. The American people also feel a stronger sense of national pride and a sense of belonging to something greater than themselves as a result of this holiday. I'm now referring to the idea of "nationalism" because, despite the fact that I've lived here for eight months and I am not American, I still feel a sense of kinship with this place, which has taught me far more than simply the English language.

I must say though that "Memorial Day" goes beyond simply honoring the brave people who have served in all the special forces and some who even gave their lives in the defense of this nation. In my opinion, it is the ideal day to reflect on the past, while also forging ahead without forgetting those individuals, since that is all that is left of them. Regardless of those families who have lost loved ones for all time, I'm almost certain that "Memorial Day" is a year-round observance for them, rather than simply a date at the end of May.
