
So, we come together once a month to sew simple dresses for underprivileged girls. The dresses are sent to where ever there is a need. Our group is well-established (almost 4 years), yet growing (a core group of 25-30 volunteers), friendly, and welcoming.

This year, 429 dresses, 297 dolls, 149 pairs of flip-flops, and 50 pairs of shorts have been donated to children in many countries around the world, including the United States, Haiti, India, and Guatemala. Our most recent donations were sent to the Tutwiler clinic/school in Tutwiler, Mississippi - an extremely poor area of our country. We are sustained by the generosity of others who give of their time, talent and love, and by our brother Knights, who support us by generously allowing us the use of their space. By the gift of a single dress, we can make a difference in a girl's life. If you know any person who might be interested in joining us, please feel free to invite them. You can sew with us or sew at home.

September 2019

September is Life Insurance Awareness Month. It's the one month each year that the life insurance industry coordinates a campaign aimed at educating folks about the importance of life insurance and helping them get the coverage they need. McGivney] was deeply interested in pursuing the topic of a Catholic fraternal insurance society among groups of Catholic laymen of New Haven." Then on page 35 Mr. Kauffman goes

on, "...he [Fr. McGivney again] spent his energy in promoting the insurance feature...his emphasis on business was his pastoral concern for the social and financial security of the family." Fr. McGivney lived both the social and the financial *insecurity* of a desperate family, with the breadwinner suddenly taken, that had to be supported. He left the seminary to work and support his mother and siblings. He didn't want other Catholic families to find themselves in such a predicament. That, and uniting men of faith, was the impetus for establishing our Order. Everyone who joined in those first years was insured; that was part and parcel of being in the organization. Now every member has a choice and every member should know what we do, and how we do it




