This case came to the attention of the RI Department of Children, Youth and Families August 8th, 2022 when a call was made to the child abuse hotline. At that time father, David Parker stated his child, Rebecca Parker (16) sent a four-minute video to her mother, guardian ad litem; Patricia Raposa, and therapist, Katie Ferrier reporting she is refusing to return to Mother's care.

Reporter stated that Rebecca was due to return today back to RI from Texas and refused to leave. Reporter stated Mother and her attorney have filed an ex-parte and are holding reporter in contempt for refusing to return the child back into Mother's care. The child has medical issues including a genetic disorder, PCOS, and a chemical imbalance which requires a special diet. Mother does not adhere to the diet which causes the child to experience swelling, redness to her face, and sores. Child is threatening to hurt herself if she goes back to RI.

Father states Rebecca has sent an email to mother stating, "fuck off, I am not getting on the plane." Father also reported that Rebecca is alleging emotional and medical abuse as to Mother. Father stated Texas CPS said they need a referral from RI to interview the child about her allegations.

An investigation occurred involving both Rhode Island CPS and Texas CPS. CPI Iadevaia was assigned to the investigation in Rhode Island. CPI Iadevaia spoke with Rebecca's Therapist Katie who acknowledged parent's tumultuous relationship. Katie also stated that this was unhealthy for Rebecca. Katie states that at one point Rebecca did share some of the issues she had with moms parenting. Katie stated that she attempted to prompt Rebecca to speak with mom regarding these issues. Katie stated that Rebecca opted not to. Katie did not hear or witness anything that she thought was abuse or neglect on the part of mom or dad. Both Texas CPS and Rhode Island CPS came to the same conclusion of an unfounded investigation for abuse or neglect.

On September 9th, the Department was ordered to immediately work with the Texas DCF to bring the child back to the adjudicated home state of RI, over father's objection. Rebecca Parker is with her father in Texas and is refusing to return to RI. Mother and father have joint legal custody, but mother has sole physical custody. Rebecca is alleging physical and medical neglect by mother. She has threatened to commit suicide if forced to return to RI. She has a medical condition that requires a special diet, but she says mother is not providing the correct food for her. Rhode Island then initiated the requisition via the ICJ rules,

On September 19th, 2022, the Kimberly Hutnak case opened to the Family Service Unit (FSU) as a non-legal status case. Rebecca Parker remained in Texas awaiting the judicial decision of the Texas courts to determine if Rebecca would return home to RI to her mother per the current domestic custody agreement.

On October 6th, Rhode Island Family Judge Naik signed an Interstate Compact for Juveniles-Requisition for Runaway Juvenile as the child was considered a runaway and believed to be with her father in Hutto, Texas. Judge in Williamson County Juvenile Court also signed the document allowing RI DCYF to retrieve Rebecca Parker from the state of Texas. A court hearing was also held on the same date regarding this matter in Williamson County Juvenile Court at which time the judge in Texas detained Rebecca Parker due to suicidal statements and the concern if she returned to her father's home while awaiting DCYF's arrival, he would not freely turn the child over to the Department.

RI DCYF flew to Austin, Texas where mother, Kimberly Hutnak remained. It was determined by both Judges and DCYF that mother should not fly on the same flight home to Rhode Island as Rebecca continues to make SI statements if she has to see or return home to her mother. DCYF determined the teen should enter into placement until further assessment regarding the relationship between Rebecca and her mother and overall safety in the home.

The below information was collected during the most recent RI CPS investigation retrieved from both parents and resources.

Father, David Parker in 2018, was seen by Dr. Brett Leimkhuhler who conducted a comprehensive neuro-psychiatric test of Mr. Parker. The evaluation found that Father had Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, Unspecified Depressive Disorder (with features of dysthymia and major depression), Unspecified Personality Disorder (with schizoid, schizotypal and/or paranoid features), adjustment disorder with Anxiety and Depressed Mood, Unspecified Anxiety Disorder and Unspecified Neurocognitive Disorder. The evaluation states that dad needs "intensive individual therapy". At the time, dad opted to see therapist L1CSW Judith Chick. Judith was recently contacted via email by Mr. Parker who CC'ed CPI Iadevaia. Judith stated she had not spoken to Father in over a year and did not believe she was the appropriate person to contact. Judith also stated that she had referred him to a therapist in Texas. It does not appear that Mr. Parker has engaged in therapy since this time. This is concerning because Dr. Leimkhuhler's evaluation indicates that Mr. Parker needs significant therapeutic treatment directly related to his parenting style and confusion about boundaries (likely due to his unhealthy fixation with Rebecca's menstrual cycle). Dr. Leimkhuhler also strongly recommended that dad find a psychiatrist for medication to manage his mental health needs, Mr. Parker states that in 2021 he followed up on recommendations and took the SNRI drug Effexor. Father states that this medication made him ill. Mr. Parker's medication was then switched to the Serotonin Modulator, Trazadone. Although Mr. Parker reports that this medication had less side effects, he eventually made a personal decision to stop taking it. He states that it was no longer necessary. Mr. Parker says he is currently managing his mental health through socialization with friends, role playing games, video games and periodic exercise. It is unclear if these are effective therapeutic strategies to manage Father's specific issues, but they are certainly not what was recommended by Dr. Leimkhuhler in 2018. Therefore, it does not appear that Mr. Parker is currently meeting his own needs, nor has he shown that he is resilient.

Mother, Kimberly Hutnak has no known history of criminal behavior, drug addiction or alcoholism. During interactions with CPl ladevaia, Ms. Hutnak did not show any signs of being under the influence or mentally unstable. Mom reports to have a diagnosis of ADHD, Complex PTSD and Generalized Anxiety Disorder. Mother is currently on Lexapro and Adderall to help manage her symptoms. She is also seeing therapist. Melanie Clifford at Professional Counseling on a weekly basis. Furthermore, Kimberly is currently employed full-time as an accountant. She also has a working car and drives regularly, is in college full-time and has stable housing. Moreover, based on witness accounts, mother is financially responsible and able to fulfill daily activities in a timely and productive manner. Based on this information, it does appear that mom can control her impulses and takes action.

Moreover, Kimberly has rented her home for several years, has a stable job and appears to be meeting all of her financial responsibilities. Ms. Hutnak also appeared patient during interactions with CPI despite the stress related to the investigation. Finally, Kimberly has been cooperative throughout the DCYF process. This includes effective communication and promptly responding to DCYF requests.

Rebecca is a 16-year-old adolescent girl. Rebecca is a patient at Thundermist Health Center. Rebecca has PCOS and a Genetic Disorder. According to a report from Hasbro, it was recommended that Rebecca be on a specific diet. These recommendations consisted of a series of links to healthy eating websites. There is some debate between mom and dad as to the rigidity of this diet. However, Rebecca does state that when she strictly adheres to the diet, she feels much healthier. Mom states that she has attempted in the past to purchase the healthy food that Rebecca requested, but Rebecca would choose to continue eating unhealthy food. Rebecca denies that mom put in sufficient effort to provide her with healthier alternatives. In addition, Rebecca is a student at Chariho High School. Rebecca entered into the 11th grade this year. Mom reports that Rebecca has an IEP to help with her diagnosis of ADHD and anxiety. In addition, mom states that Rebecca does not have serious behavioral issues but can be oppositional and disrespectful at times. Finally, Ms. Hutnak says that Rebecca has a close group of friends that she talks to online and that act as a support system for her.

Family is not associated with a Native American Tribe, ICWA does not apply to this family.

Due to the ongoing tumultuous interactions between both parents in regard to their daughter, Rebecca which has caused ongoing concerning interactions, as well as Rebecca's suicidal ideation statements, DCYF is filing a Dependency petition as to said child to help support her family and provide services to address the above ongoing concerns.

- 1. That on 8/8/22, the RI Child Abuse Hotline received a report that 16-year-old Rebecca would not return home from a visit with father in Texas due to alleged emotional and medical abuse as to mother.
- 2. That CPI Nicholas Iadevaia was assigned the investigation and both Texas CPS and RI CPS came to the same conclusion that the allegations were unfounded.
- 3. That on 9/9/22, the Department was ordered to immediately work with the Texas DCF to bring the child back to the adjudicated home state of Rhode Island.
- 4. That the child threatened to commit suicide if forced to return to Rhode Island.
- 5. That Rhode Island then initiated the requisition via the ICJ rules.
- 6. That on 10/6/22, Judge Naik signed an Interstate Compact for Juveniles along with a judge in Williamson County Juvenile Court allowing RI DCYF to retrieve Rebecca from the State of Texas.
- 7. That 16-year-old Rebecca is currently placed at St. Mary's Home for Children Assessment Center.
- 8. That mother and father have joint custody, placement with mother.
- 9. That the following circumstances exist which would indicate that there is a substantial, immediate danger to the child which precludes the provision of preventative services as an alternative to removal: That 16-year-old Rebecca refused to return home from a visit with her father from Texas, parents have joint custody, placement with mother, and child refuses to return home to mother.
- 10. That the "Summary of Facts to Substantiate Allegations of Dependency, Neglect, and/or Abuse" signed by Liseta Botelho and dated October 17, 2022, is hereby attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A.
- 11. That the continuation of said child in the home of the parent is contrary to the welfare of the child.

Dear Judge,

This case was last before the Court on 10/25/2022. DCYF has TC w/Pl Dis of Rebecca Parker. The case is in court today for Pre Trial.

Rebecca is currently placed at the assessment center with St. Mary's Home for Youth and Children in North Providence. She engages in individual therapy with Clinician, Sarah Casey at St. Mary's. Ms. Casey has attempted several sessions of family therapy with Kimberly and Rebecca however, Rebecca continues to refuse to engage in any therapy with Mother. On 11/22/2022, Scw Botelho discussed with Ms. Casey if it would be possible to engage Rebecca's Father in family therapy with her as well, which would need be done virtually since Father resides in Texas. Ms. Casey stated she would just need to check on state laws regarding the virtual over state lines and discuss this with her supervisor. DCYF will update the courts once an answer is obtained.

Rebecca is enrolled at the Thundermist Health Center Pediatrics in West Warwick. Rebecca's last pediatric appointment was completed virtually on October 27, 2022. Her most recent in-person pediatric appointment was on May 13, 2022. Rebecca also sees Doctor Monica Gonzalez at the Endocrine Clinic at Hasbro Children's Hospital for irregular menstrual periods, per pediatrician's request. Rebecca had an appointment scheduled for November 8th, 2022 for a follow up. Mother discussed with Scw Botelho that she wanted to try taking Rebecca to this appointment. Unfortunately, Rebecca refused to go with her. The appointment was rescheduled for December 13th, 2022 and Rebecca will be accompanied by a DCYF worker.

Rebecca completed a Psychiatric Assessment at St. Mary's with provider, Rebecca Parant. Rebecca has been diagnosed with ADHD, Depression and Anxiety. Rebecca is not curently refusing to treat any reported diagnosis. Rebecca reported to Provider that she has ADHD and Autism. Provider reports no evidence to support diagnosis of Autism. However, she presents as young for her age both physically and emotionally. Rebecca also endorses depression, anxiety, and insomnia. Rebecca reported taking naturopathic supplements that her father and stepmother gave her. The naturopathic supplements were discontinued by the Nurse Practitioner at St. Mary's until her scheduled appointment with a pediatrician who will make recommendations for any identified medical concerns. The Department has made referrals for Rebecca for Boystown, Child and Family, Communities for People, Compass Lincoln House, Family Service, and NAFI (Ridge Street). As of the writing of this letter, NAFI has interviewed Rebecca for their program. All other programs will be scheduling their interviews shortly. No dispositions have been received as of yet.

Rebecca attends Chariho High School. Rebecca missed 7 and half weeks of school due to awaiting domestic court hearing orders due to an ongoing contentious custody

battle between mother and father. The school has enrolled Rebecca with tutors for each subject through academic advantage. DCYF, Chariho's School Psychologist, Chariho's Principal, and Chariho's Guidance Counselor scheduled to meet on 11/30 to discuss planning around the tutoring schedule. Rebecca also has a current IEP through Chariho High School.

Mr. Parker has (2) 15 minute phone calls with Rebecca per week supervised by the Department. Initially Mr. Parker needed to be redirected on numerous occasions during the calls to not discuss the case but to focus on visiting with her daughter and discussing more typical conversations. It is clear that Rebecca has been involved in her parents custody case for a long time. She speaks of things regarding the case that a teen who has not been made as an added party would know about. The calls have since become more typical and Mr. Parker has been compliant with the case plan process with Scw Botelho. He is willing to complete a neuropsychological evaluation. Mr. Parker has an appointment scheduled with the Neurobehavioral Institute of Austin via Web-EX intake on Jan 17th & In-person evaluation on Jan 26th.

Mr. Parker did ask to be put on the call list for any canceled appointments. The Department will continue to case plan with father to engage him with the necessary services.

Referrals have been made for a child-parent evaluation for both Mother and Father. The Family Connections program potentially may be able to complete child-parent evaluation. However, there is confusion around the insurance policy because Mother has out of state health insurance. Scw is waiting to see if the Family Connections program will approve 005 requests in replacement of the insurance if needed. The clinician at St. Mary's voiced concerns with mother's behavior and statements made during her attempts to visit Rebecca on site. Mother has made statements that she refuses to allow Rebecca to go anywhere else but her house once she leaves St. Mary's. Mother's behavior has drawn concerns and after a discussion between clinician and Scw Botelho. Due to these concenrs it is in the child's best interest to have supervised visits with her Mother moving forward. On 11/20/2022, Scw Hall attempted to supervise a visit with Rebecca and her mother. Rebecca refused the visit (11/20) and became very upset. Rebecca told Scw Hall that she was unwilling to visit that particular day but that she will try again next week. The next scheduled supervised visit for Rebecca and her Mother is on 11/27/2022. An approved day pass was provided for Rebecca to spend the day on Thanksgiving with her friend, Hannah's family. DCYF completed BCI and DCYF clearances which cleared. DCYF had a phone call conversation with the mother of Hannah previously as both Mr. Parker and Ms. Hutnak had stated this family could possibly provide foster care for their daughter. After DCYF discussed this with Hannah's mother, it was clear she had concerns for being able to maintain Rebecca in her home with daily supervision due to her and her husbands work schedules. She also voiced concerns around bounderies with both parents though mainly regarding father. She stated father has texted her at all

hours of the day and night wanting to disucss his custody case. She stated she did not feel comfortable caring for Rebecca full time in her home but was willing to have her for day passes. The Thanksgiving pass was approved though on 11/22/22, Ms. Hutnak stated to St. Mary's she did not want her daughter to go on pass to Hannah's home. The reasoning behind this is unclear. CWS Sherman emailed mother asking for the reasoning behind this and that it will only damage the mild improvement on she and her daughters relationship. As of the writing of this letter, Ms. Hutnak did not respond.

Since Rebecca has returned to Rhode Island, it is clear the family's long ongoing custody battle has affected her in numerous ways. Rebecca has been found trying to reach her father by utilizing her Chromebook, passing a note to Hannah at school to ask her mother to inform her father of whatever the note stated. Hannah's mother brought this to DCYF's attention and was not comfortable with the situation. Parents do not agree on any aspect of care for their child. Father went as far as to creating a website regarding the "removal" of his daughter. This was addressed in their custody hearing recently.

DCYF will continue to work with providers to help support the goal of reunification with parents. DCYF will also follow up with all referrals for placement to ensure interviews are completed.

Dear Judge,

This case was last before the Court on 11/29/2022. DCYF has TC w/PI Dis of Rebecca Parker. The case is in court today for Pre-Trial and Disposition Hearing.

Since Rebecca has returned to Rhode Island, it is clear the family's ongoing contentious custody battle has affected her in numerous ways. Parents do not agree on any aspect of care for their child including important medical decisions supporting Rebecca's health. Father also went as far as creating a website regarding DCYF and the "removal" of his daughter. This was addressed in their custody hearing recently.

On 10/13/2022, Rebecca was placed at the assessment center with St. Mary's Home for Youth and Children in North Providence. She engaged in individual therapy with Clinician, Sarah Casey at St. Mary's. Due to the nature of the placement center, Scw noted Rebecca was picking up new behaviors from the other girls in the house. Scw requested a new placement option for Rebecca. After her interview, the NAFI Clinician told Scw Botelho that Rebecca would fit well at the NAFI Ridge St. Program with the other girls residing in the house. Rebecca was discharged from St. Mary's and placed at the NAFI Ridge St. Program on 12/14/2022.

Since Rebecca's arrival to the NAFI Ridge Street Program, NAFI reports having no concerns pertaining to her safety (i.e., self-harm, AWOL, etc.). Initially, Rebecca struggled with her emotional regulation and overall adjustment to the program (i.e., excessive tearfulness, self-isolation, refusal to participate in tutoring, refusal to attend groups, refusal of chores, etc.). Substantial improvements have been made but Rebecca requires multiple prompts by staff.

The program has consistently purchased an ample amount of gluten-free and dairy-free foods to support Rebecca especially due to her health care provider's concern regarding her weight. Although gluten-free and dairy-free options were available, Rebecca has chosen to consume foods such as: Cheese, bread, pasta, french fries, cereal, chocolate, taco bell, chips, chicken nuggets, etc. No adverse reactions or complaints have been verbalized by Rebecca after the consumption of these foods.

Rebecca attends Chariho High School and has been enrolled at this school since she started the 9th grade. Rebecca missed approximately 39 consecutive days (about 7&half weeks) of school while under her father's care in Texas and during the time she was court ordered to be back in Rhode Island with her Mother and her school of origin. Father claims that he was home schooling Rebecca during that time. Both Scw Botelho and Pattee Dipollino, the Guidance Counselor at Chariho High School have requested documentation from Mr. Parker several times that can support Rebecca was being home-schooled including approval from the school system to do this, but he has

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yet to provide us with any information, documentations, or contacts thus far.

Scw received Rebecca's grades and she is currently failing every class. However, Rebecca has been working diligently with her teachers to be able to catch up on all the learning/schoolwork she missed during those 7 and half weeks. Scw Botelho and Chariho High have set Rebecca up with a total of (6) tutors for each subject through the Academic Advantage Program; She has a tutor for English, Algebra II, Chemistry, Spanish, Health, and US History. With the help of her tutors, she was able to take the midterms for all her classes aside from Spanish and Chemistry since she was still very behind in those specific classes. She increased tutoring to twice a week for Spanish/Chemistry. Rebecca will continue to work with her teachers and meet with tutors with the goal of passing the 10th grade.

Rebecca was last seen by Dr. Caitlin Gillooly, her primary care doctor at Thundermist Health Center Pediatrics in West Warwick on 12/13/2022. Dr. Gillooly reports Abnormal Weight Loss, Anxiety, and Adjustment Disorder. Rebecca's previous weight 103 lbs. at visit on 5/13/2022 and patient was 92 lbs. at visit on 12/13/2022, and now in low BMI category.

Dr. Gillooly discussed concern for Rebecca's weight and physical health in this setting. She also discussed that if Rebecca's weight continues to decline that we will need to up her level of care to inpatient or partial program to better address. Dr. Gillooly also discussed the importance of checking blood work related to metabolic derangement and to access overall nutritional health. Rebecca and Father declined blood work, though mom was amenable. In the setting of her restricted diet and weight loss, the pediatrician discussed the option of starting a multivitamin which Rebecca and Mother were amenable to, however Dad adamantly declined.

Dr. Gillooly reports Rebecca's anxiety is chronic and clearly uncontrolled. Concern there may be other underlying diagnoses that are also not being adequately recognized or treated. Rebecca is diagnosed with ADHD, Depression and Anxiety. Rebecca has an appointment with the Psychiatrist through NAFI scheduled for 1/30/2023.

Mr. Parker is court ordered 3 x 15 minutes (total of 45 minutes) supervised phone calls per week. With the curtesy of Scw Botelho and the Clinician at NAFI, Mr. Parker has been privileged to an exceeded amount of time for his supervised phone calls with Rebecca for most weeks, if not all since the last court hearing. For example, just on 01/14/2023, he was privileged to 52 minutes. Just between two days, 1/02/2023 and 1/06/2023, he was privileged to a total of 65 minutes. The Program Clinician was supporting DCYF with Mr. Parker's supervised phone call with Rebecca.

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As of 1/25/2023, Lynn Bishop, NAFI Executive Director made the decision for all and any communication from Mr. Parker go through DCYF. This is the second placement program that has refused to support supervised phone calls with Mr. Parker due to his actions and inappropriate behavior. During a phone call with Mr. Parker, Scw Botelho and Tayla Bartone (NAFI Program Clinician); Mr. Parker was very rude and inappropriate towards Clinician, calling her work "Trash" which he also wrote in an email as well. He inappropriately demanded all documentations of her credentials to him.

Mr. Parker is constantly making false accusations of things the Scw said during supervised phone calls. To support this, on 1/18/2023 at 5:14pm, Mr. Parker sent an email to Glen Whitehead, DCYF Supervisor and Scw, and NAFI Clinician stating, "I have been threatened by DCYF for challenging them and the ridiculous breakdown that has taken place." Because of the many threats of taking legal action and being falsely accused by Mr. Parker, Scw also feels uncomfortable supervising Mr. Parker's calls especially without a third-party present.

Mr. Parker sends an inappropriate and excessive number of emails to the Department and/or NAFI. Just in one email sent by Mr. Parker to Scw Botelho, Supervisor Sherman, Attorney Whitehead, and Clinician Tayla Bartone on 1/14/2023 at 1:11AM; he attached 25 links to different articles such as "Narcissistic Abuse and Complex Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, How Narcissistic Abuse Can Cause PTSD, 12 Signs You Must have Narcissistic Victim Syndrome, etc. On 1/17/2023 at 6:05pm, Mr. Parker sent an email to Scw Botelho, Supervisor Norie, NAFI Clinician, and Attorney Whitehead with 35 links to different articles.

Rebecca meets with her program Clinician for an individual therapy session weekly. In terms of individual and family sessions, Rebecca meets and is engaged in all scheduled sessions. Family sessions with Rebecca and her father, David are not occurring currently as a result of the harassing nature, verbal threats, and inappropriate presentation of Dave via treatment meetings, emails, and with program staff.

Family sessions with Rebecca and her mother, Kim, have occurred after Rebecca's initial reluctance. Rebecca has attended all in person sessions with her mother willingly and with ample notice. The most recent family session on January 20, 2023, ended in both Rebecca and her mother physically embracing each other and validating each other's emotions. The focus continues to be primarily on building effective coping skills, relationships, communication, trauma, and establishing safety. It is recommended that Rebecca continues to engage with services at the NAFI Ridge Street Program. The NAFI Ridge Street program will continue to support family work between Rebecca and her mother. Mother continues to case plan with the Department and engage in the necessary services.

Mr. Parker has requested that the Department pays for his mental health/neuropsych evals and that he will not pay out of pocket. Because of this, he has yet to complete the evaluations. The Department will continue to case plan with father to engage him with the necessary services. A W-9 form was sent to Mr. Parker's evaluator via email but the agency has not sent the form back to the Department at this time.

Referrals were made for a child-parent evaluation for both Mother and Father. Becky Carter, has accepted the referral to complete the child-parent evaluations for both Ms. Hutnak and Mr. Parker. Scw will work with both parents to schedule their first intake appointments.

DCYF will continue to work with providers to help support the goal of reunification with parents.

Rebecca missed approximately 39 consecutive days (about 7&half weeks) of school while under her father's care in Texas and during the time she was court ordered to be back in Rhode Island with her Mother and her school of origin. Since the last court hearing, Rebecca has caught up on most of the work she missed in beginning of the school year. In her most recent report card, Rebecca passed most of her classes aside from Chemistry and Spanish. However, Rebecca engages with a Chemistry Tutor and Spanish Tutor who continue to help her improve in those two classes.

Rebecca was seen by Dr. Caitlin Gillooly, her primary care doctor at Thundermist Health Center Pediatrics in West Warwick on 12/13/2022. At that time, Dr. Gillooly reported abnormal weight loss, Anxiety, and Adjustment Disorder. Rebecca's previous weight 103 lbs. at visit on 5/13/2022 and patient was 92 lbs. at visit on 12/13/2022. Rebecca had a follow-up appointment on 02/20/2023 and Dr. Gillooly reported Rebecca has gained weight since the appointment on 12/13/2022, which was one of Dr. Gillooly's major concerns for Rebecca's health. Dr. Gillooly also discussed the importance of checking blood work related to metabolic derangement and to assess her overall nutritional health. Dr. Gillooly has prescribed Vitamin D, Magnesium Vitamin, and an Iron Vitamin for Rebecca, which she has been taking daily since. Dr. Gillooly reports Rebecca's anxiety is chronic and clearly uncontrolled. Concern there may be other underlying diagnoses that are also not being adequately recognized or treated. Rebecca is diagnosed with ADHD, Depression and Anxiety. Rebecca was evaluated by a Psychiatrist through NAFI Ridge St. who recently prescribed Fluvoxamine (50mg, 1x Daily - 8PM @ only) to help Rebecca with sleep, anxiety, and PTSD. Mother and Father both consented to the medication prior to Rebecca starting the medication.

Rebecca meets with her program Clinician for an individual therapy session weekly. In terms of individual and family sessions, Rebecca meets and is engaged in all scheduled sessions. The NAFI clinician continues to provide weekly family therapy

with Ms. Hutnak and Rebecca.

Mother currently has unsupervised visits with Rebecca and coordinates with the clinician at NAFI. Rebecca's relationship with her mother has significantly improved. She has been spending a lot more time with her Mother. Rebeca has also agreed to two over-night visits with Mother on Thursday, 04/06/2023 and Friday, 04/07/2023 since there is no school Friday, 04/07/2023.

Family sessions with Rebecca and her father, David are not occurring currently because of the harassing nature, verbal threats, and inappropriate presentation of Dave via treatment meetings, emails, and with program staff. As of 1/25/2023, Lynn Bishop, NAFI Executive Director made the decision for all and any communication from Mr. Parker go through DCYF. This is the second placement program that has refused to support supervised phone calls with Mr. Parker due to his actions and inappropriate behavior. DCYF is attempting to locate a family therapist willing to provide therapy virtually for Mr. Parker and his daugther.

Mr. Parker is court ordered 3 x 15 minutes (total of 45 minutes) supervised phone calls per week. There have been no issues or concerns thus far regarding father's phone calls with his daughter. Referrals were made for a parent-child evaluation for both Mother and Father. Mother's first initial appointment with Dr. John Parsons, PHD is scheduled on 04/03/2023 and will need to complete a total of 7 sessions. However, Dr. Parsons does not accept virtual appointments and it must be in person. Because of this, it has been difficult finding a provider for Father in R. I. who is willing to conduct a parent-child evaluation through virtual appointments. The Department received the W-9 form from Ms. Joann Murphey, PhD., who will conduct the neuropsychological evaluation for Mr. Parker. The DCYF business office has the W-9, once it is entered into the RICHIST system, FSU can create the 005 for payment so Mr. Parker can schedule his evaluation. The provider stated the retainer fee is \$3,000.

The NAFI Ridge Street program will continue to support family work between Rebecca and her mother. Both Mother and Father continue to case plan with the Department and engage in the necessary services in support of reunification.

DCYF will continue to work with providers to help support the goal of reunification with parents.
