On 9/28, SCW Liseta Botelho met with Kimberly Hutnak at Panera Bread in Warwick, RI. SCW

introduced herself as the social worker that she will be case planning with and if she could prove some background knowledge on the case and her daughter, Rebecca Parker. Rebecca currently resides in

Texas, while they await their next scheduled court hearing for the custody agreement between mother and father. Ms. Hutnak told SCW that this custody battle has been going on since 2020; Ms. Hutnak's

father (Rebecca's Grandfather) passed away in 2021. Ms. Hutnak stated she made a kid-napping report to the Charlestown Police Station regarding father, David Parker. Ms. Hutnak showed SCW Botelho a

video of Rebecca that she recently recorded of herself to send to Mother, Kimberly. In the video, Rebecca was making several SI statements such as "I rather die than come live with my mom" and "If I

have to come to RI, I will kill myself." Also stated in the video recording, "My mother abuses me mentally, emotionally, physically, and so does the rest of that family" and "My mother does not support

of her not caring about my health and well-being." SCW asked Ms. Hutnak if she could elaborate more on what Rebecca meant by this statement. Ms. Hutnak said the doctor recommended a strict diet due to

her medical condition; and Ms. Hutnak did not think she needed to be on a strict diet. She told SCW how she has bought lots of gluten-free products and almond milk that she would end of throwing in the

trash because Rebecca would never follow through with eating or drinking it. SCW asked if Rebecca had a therapist. According to Ms. Hutnak, Rebecca's therapist (Katie F. Aubin) recently resigned from

being her therapist due to text threats sent by David Parker. SCW asked if Rebecca has had Neuropsychological Examinations completed and mother said she did one in 2018 at Hasbro Hospital.

SCW suggested Rebecca completes an updated neuropsychological exam and possibly a mental health evaluation. Mother also requested SCW if we can look into Bradley Hospital's Adolescent Inpatient Program due to the SI statements being made by Rebecca. SCW scheduled a follow up meeting with

Ms. Hutnak on October 7th at 2:15PM at Panera Bread in Warwick.

SCW Botelho emailed William Dolan DCYF Probation & Parole Officer II stating,

"Mother just called me and said they are keeping Rebecca in Juvenile Detention until we can get her to RI. Can you please verify this information?"

William Dolan DCYF Probation & Parole Officer II replied back to email stating the following;

"The court has the right to detain her if they feel she is a danger to herself or others. Also, if she told the Court that she is unwilling to return, they could deem her a run risk and detain her on that. I'm going to start working on arranging her travel back.

Would someone from FSU be going to TX to escort her or would you be looking to have her fly back on her own? If she's coming back on her own, I'll try to arrange a non-stop flight. If there isn't a non-stop flight, we'd arrange to have her supervised by Probation in which ever state she does the lay-over in.

Let me know. Thanks. FYI-I don't have any documentation from TX at this point. The only info we have is mother's report that she's being detained. I'll be contacting TX to confirm before finalizing any arrangements."

SCW Botelho and Supervisor Sherman asked Officer Dolan to let us know as soon as possible once he has confirmation that the plan is for Rebecca to return back to RI.

SCW Hall met the County Sheriff, Detention Center worker, and child Rebecca Parker at the Airport in Austin, Texas at 12noon. The team gave SCW Hall the updated court order as Mother couldn't be present during this transport with Rebecca back to Rhode Island. SCW checked in with Rebecca before the team left if she was okay and if she was going to AWOL. Rebecca stated that she feels safe since Mother wasn't flying with her. SCW Hall observed Rebecca, she appeared clean, well groomed, and dress appropriately. SCW Hall and Rebecca received their boarding passes and then went through the TSA. SCW Hall and Rebecca then waited for their 3pm flight. While waiting SCW Hall asked Rebecca if she needed to eat and she stated that she was fine for now. Rebecca shared while they was waiting that her Mother emotional abuse her and she never wants to live with her. Rebecca talked about her friend Hannah and her family and how she wants to live with them when she goes to RI. SCW explain that when she goes to RI, she will be going to ST Mary Hills Unit and that DCYF will look into Hannah's family to see if it's appropriate. Rebecca stated that the family was already looked into and she's suppose to go there. Rebecca started talking to SCW Hall about all her books and drawings in her backpack. SCW Hall and Rebecca boarded the plane and then arrived to Philadelphia at 7:27pm. When they arrived in Philadelphia, SCW Hall bought Rebecca dinner before the next 9pm flight. Rebecca ate her food and took her vitamins. Both boarded the last plane and landed in RI. SCW Hall transported Rebecca to St Mary Hills for 11:30pm. Rebecca started crying as she did not want to stay at this facility or would give up her phone to SCW Hall. SCW stayed there for 30 minutes or more to help Rebecca calm down as she would be staying there for the night. Rebecca finally calmed down and SCW Hall left the placement. There were no safety concerns during this placement. There were no incidents during transport by airplane or car.

SCW Botelho met with Rebecca at St.Marys. Rebecca and SCW Botelho were able to meet privately, downstairs in her Unit House at St. Mary's. SCW introduced herself to Rebecca, letting her know who she was and why she is there. Rebecca said "Yes, I know you're my social worker." SCW asked Rebecca how the fight from Texas was and Rebecca replied that it was good and went by quickly. Rebecca appeared to suddenly change affects from calm to very upset, tearful, crying, and started yelling that she hates her mother and just wants to live in Texas with her father and stepmother Mary. SCW reassured Rebecca her role is to help her and her family and connect them with the necessary resources and services. SCW talked to Rebecca about starting school again at Charitho High School, where she has attended since her freshman year of high school. Rebecca said she is not going to go to school and that she wants to go to school in Texas. SCW explained to Rebecca that since she is going to continue to reside in RI, the plan is for her to go back to her original school at Charitho High School. Rebecca became argumentative and defiant about going back to school in RI. SCW redirected the conversation and asked Rebecca what she liked to do for fun? Rebecca told SCW that she likes art, drawing, and creative writing. Rebecca also told her that she was in the process of writing a book. SCW made attempts to talk about case plan and questions, but Rebecca's responses became very short and told SCW she did not want to talk anymore. Rebecca appeared to become very upset and tearful again. SCW also noted that during the meeting, Rebecca appeared to have symptoms of anxiety, aggressively scratching at arm during discussion causing her arm to start bleeding. SCW did report this to Rebecca's clinician at St. Marys as well. SCW told Rebecca that if she wants to end the meeting and does not want to continue talking with SCW, we can schedule another day to meet again in a few days and begin the case planning process. Rebecca did not report being in any imminent harm or risk in her placement at St.Marys.

SCW explained to Rebecca that this phone call conversation with Father should refrain away from speaking about the case and legal matters. Rebecca agreed and appeared to be receptive, saying that's fine I just wanted to talk to my dad because I miss him.

3 way- Phone call began at 3:00PM.

During the phone call, Rebecca mentioned to Father that Mother, Kimberly came to pick up Rebecca's cell phone at St.Marys. Father became argumentative with SCW while on a 3-way call with child, using vulgar language such as "DCYF does not know what the fuck they are doing" and told Rebecca he is going to "BRICK" Rebecca's cell phone which is going to cost him \$800. SCW told Father and Rebecca at 3:08 that the conversation is beginning to be very inappropriate and we needed to end the phone call until father is in a better space. Father said he was going to call the supervisor and that "somebody from DCYF better get the phone with mother or else."

After Rebecca agreed with SCW to refrain from conversations regarding the case with father during phone calls, it is evident that it was difficult for both father and Rebecca to keep appropriate conversations.

Scw Botelho asked if she wanted to call or try another visit with Mother again and Rebecca appeared tearful, anxious, and told SCW "no I never want to see my mom again." Rebecca told Scw that at her pediatrician appt last week, she was alone in the pt room with mother and that she felt interigated by her mom. Rebecca also told Scw that she tried blocking her ears so that she could not hear what mother was saying and that Mom aggressively took her Rebecca's hands off her ears. Rebecca told scw that after this incident she never wants to be alone with mother and that she does not feel comfortable. Scw will follow up with mother about this. Scw and Rebecca talked about school and had a phone call with her father during car ride. Rebecca talked to her father for 15 minutes. Conversation remained appropriate. After 45 minute car ride, Rebecca arrived at NAFI with no issues/concerns.

On 8/10/22, 12:40PM, DCYF Hotline received a report. Reporter is dad, David Parker. This report stated that child Rebecca Parker (16) sent a four-minute video to her mother, guardian ad litem: Patricia Raposa and therapist Katie Ferreira stating that she is refusing to return to mother's care. The report stated that Rebecca was due to return on 8/10/22 to RI from Texas but refused. The Report also stated that Mother, Kimberly Hurnak, and her attorney, had filed an ex-parte and are holding Father, David Parker in contempt for refusing to return the child back into Mother's care.

On 8/10/22 Child Protective Investigator Nicholas Iadavala was assigned to the case

CPI spoke with dad who stated that child, Rebecca Parker was refusing to return home from Texas. Father stated that mom does not take Rebecca's medical issues seriously and has failed to follow through with a strict diet recommended by her doctor. Dad provided CPI with a form from Hasbro indicating that Rebecca was, in fact, diagnosed with PCOS. The form also recommended a specific diet. Dad appeared to feel very strongly that he had been wronged by mom and the court. Dad does not feel that he is being taken seriously.

Rebecca made a video where she highlighted 3 specific areas of concern for returning to mom's home. First, Rebecca states that mom is emotionally abusive. This includes mom belittling dad and his wife in front of her, mom telling her (on one occasion) to pack her stuff and leave the home and mom blaming the death of her maternal grandfather on Rebecca. Second, Rebecca says mom is neglectful of her medical needs. More specifically, Rebecca states that mom refuses to acknowledge that she has PCOS. Rebecca says that she has severe debilitating cramps that immobilize her if she fails to stick to a rigid diet. Rebecca says that her mom will not provide her with the necessary dietary needs to help avoid this extreme discomfort. Finally, Rebecca states that her room at mom's home is filled with bed bugs and has been for over a year. Rebecca says that mom and maternal grandmother will periodically treat the bed bugs with chemicals, but that this is a short-term temporary fix and they always come back. Rebecca is adamant that when she left there were still bed bugs in the home. CPI spoke with Rebecca following seeing this video. Rebecca reiterated that she would rather harm herself than return home with mom.

CPI Iadavala spoke with mom regarding these concerns. Mom stated that Rebecca does NOT have PCOS and is exaggerating her medical issues due to dad and his wife, Mary's influence. Mom stated that there were bed bugs in the home, but they dealt with the issue and the bed bugs are no longer there. Mom says that she does not emotionally abuse her daughter.

MGM, who owns the home, would not allow CPI to go into the area of the home suspected to have bed bugs during the visit. Upon learning that CPI would put this in the report to the court, mom contacted CPI and asked him to come to the home. CPI was unable to do that in such short notice, so mom provided CPI with pictures of the room and allowed CPI to see the room via Facetime. There were no visible bed bugs in the pictures or on Facetime. This, however, cannot fully exclude bed bugs.

The level of bitterness and resentment between mom and dad is so severe that it has likely caused a great deal of emotional and psychological damage to Rebecca. Both parents spend an immoderate amount of time impugning and denigrating each other's character. This level of constant turmoil is extremely unhealthy.

CPI spoke with Rebecca's Therapist Katie who acknowledged mom and dad's tumultuous relationship. Katie also stated that this was unhealthy for Rebecca. Katie states that at one point Rebecca did share some of the issues she had with mom's parenting. Katie stated that she attempted to prompt Rebecca to speak with mom regarding these issues. Katie stated that Rebecca opted not to. Katie did not hear or witness anything that she thought was abuse or neglect on the part of mom or dad.

RI DCYF also reached out to Texas DCYF to determine safety for Rebecca in Texas at dad's home. Here is the Texas interview with Rebecca Parker:

"I made contact with Rebecca Parker at the residence located at 130 Easy St Hutto, TX 78634. I introduced myself the department and role. Rebecca presented as happy and healthy. Rebecca was dressed appropriately for the weather wearing a black graphic t-shirt and shorts. Rebecca's body hair and clothing appeared clean. I saw no evident marks or bruises on Rebecca's arms, neck, legs or face. Rebecca appeared at the appropriate height and weight for the developmental stage of 16. Rebecca gave me permission to take her photograph and record the interview, a photo and audio recording are uploaded to OneCase.

Rebecca stated that she has heard of CPS before. Rebecca stated that her mother has mentally abused her in

Multiple ways, Rebecca stated that her mom has told her that her grandfather died because of Rebecca. Rebecca stated that her mother has tried to kick her out of the home. Rebecca stated that this has been going on for a few years. Rebecca provided her full name as Rebecca Cathline Rose Parker. Rebecca identified everyone who lives in her father's home and her mother's home. Rebecca stated that she has a medical condition that requires her eat a specific diet. Rebecca stated that her mother does not provide her with the food she needs. Rebecca stated that her mother refuses to address Rebecca's needs. Rebecca stated that she gets her dietary needs when she is with her father. Rebecca stated that she does have her own bedroom when she is with her mother. Rebecca stated that when she gets into trouble with her mom it usually turns into a screaming match. Rebecca stated that her mother is usually the one instigating the arguments. Rebecca stated that she knew what drugs and alcohol are but that no one in her mom or dad's house uses drugs and that they do drink but in moderation. Rebecca stated that she knew what safe means and that she feels safer with her father than she does in Rhode Island. Rebecca stated that her mother makes her feel unsafe. Rebecca answered no to all body boundary questions and identified her trusted adults as her step-mother and father. Rebecca stated that she usually fights with her mother and that police have been to both her mother's and her father's house regarding their custody agreement. Rebecca stated that she would rather kill herself than have to go back to live with her mother. Rebecca stated that she has really good friends in Rhode Island. I thanked Rebecca for her time and concluded the interview."

At the conclusion of the investigation and due to a preponderance of evidence, CPI Iadevala finds that the allegations of Neglect; Lack of Supervision against Mother, Kimberly Huhnak is Unfounded for child, Rebecca Parker. CPI Iadevala made this determination as a result of the following factors:

1. Despite mom not knowing about, or acknowledging, Rebecca's PCOS, at no point was DCYF contacted by a medical professional stating that she there was medical neglect occurring. It is policy of the department that a medical professional report any medical neglect. There is no indication that this has ever occurred.

2. There has been no reports by therapist Katie Ferreira or any other mental health professional that mom has been emotionally abusing Rebecca. Katie Ferreira denied ever hearing, or having knowledge of, abuse or neglect in the home by either parent.

3. Although MGM would not allow CPI in the home to see the upstairs of the house, there is not direct evidence of bed bugs. Mom also provided pictures and a Facetime video of the home, mattress and piles of clothes.

Rebecca denies that mom put in sufficient effort to provide her with healthier alternatives. In addition Rebecca is a student at Charitho School. Rebecca will be entering the 11th grade next year. Mom reports that Rebecca has an IEP to help with her diagnosis of ADHD and anxiety. In addition, mom states that Rebecca does not have serious behavioral issues, but can be oppositional and disrespectful at times. Finally, mom says that Rebecca has a close group of friends that she talks to online and that act as a support system for her.

Behavioral: Witness statements indicate that mom has no known history of criminal behavior, drug addiction or alcoholism. During interactions with CPI, mom did not show any signs of being under the influence or mentally unstable. Mom reports to have a diagnosis of ADHD, Complex PTSD and Generalized Anxiety Disorder. Mom is currently on Lexapro and Adderall to help manage her symptoms. Mom is also seeing therapist Melanie Clifford at Professional Counseling on a weekly basis. Furthermore, Mom is currently employed full-time as an accountant. She also has a working car and drives regularly. In college full-time and has stable housing. Moreover, based on witness accounts, mom is financially responsible and able to fulfill daily activities in a timely and productive manner. Based on this information, it does appear that mom can control her impulses and takes action.

Cognitive: Based on conversations with mom and MGM there is no indication that mom lacks self-awareness. In interactions with CPI, mom appeared alert and socially mindful. Also, in conversations with witnesses, there was no indication, or any concern related to mom's intellectual capability. Mom has been consistently able to competently answer questions requiring analytical and problem-solving skills. Lastly, witnesses held that mom was more than capable of recognizing threatening situations. This was reinforced when speaking with CPI. Mom responded appropriately when provided questions related to risk and safety.

Emotional: Mom reports that she uses several calming techniques. These include mindfulness, taking space, and therapy. Mom appears to manage her stress well and can function productively despite most emotional stressors. Moreover, mom has rented her home for the several years, has a stable job and appears to be meeting all of her financial responsibilities. Mom also appeared patient during interactions with CPI despite the stress related to the investigation. Finally, mom has been cooperative throughout the DCYF process. This includes effective communication and promptly responding to DCYF requests. Based on this information, it does appear that mom meets her own needs, is resilient, is stable and is tolerant.

Behavioral: Based on DCYF background checks, conversations with children, parents and CPI observations, there is no indication that dad has any substance use issues or criminal history. In addition, dad owns his home, has a functioning car, reports to work regularly and appears to be on top of his financial responsibilities. Based on this information, it appears that dad can effectively control his impulses and take action.

Cognitive: Multiple witnesses report that dad is alert and aware of his surroundings. During CPI

accounts, dad has no history of intellectual limitations. CPI did not observe dad to be cognitively impaired

in any interactions and appeared to understand the information provided. Finally, based on the available

evidence and interviews with various people, there has been no information demonstrating that dad is

incapable of recognizing threats. When asked, dad was able to sufficiently distinguish between risk and

safety.

Emotional: In 2018, Dr. Brett Leimkhuher conducted a comprehensive neuro-psychiatric test of dad,

David Parker. The evaluation found that dad had Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, Unspecified Depressive

Disorder (with features of dysthymia and major depression), Unspecified Personality Disorder (with

schizoid, schizotypal and/or paranoid features), Adjustment Disorder with Anxiety and Depressed Mood,

Unspecified Anxiety Disorder and Unspecified Neurocognitive Disorder. The evaluation states that dad

needs "intensive individual therapy". At the time, dad opted to see therapist LICSW Judith Chick. Judith

was recently contacted via email by dad who C/C'd CPI Iadavala. Judith stated she had not spoken to

dad in over a year and did not believe she was the appropriate person to contact. Judith also stated that

she had referred him to a therapist in Texas. It does not appear that dad has engaged in therapy since

this time. This is concerning because Dr. Leimkhuher's evaluation indicates that dad needs significant

therapeutic treatment directly related to his parenting style and confusion about boundaries (likely due to

his unhealthy fixation with Rebecca's menstrual cycle). Dr. Leimkhuher also strongly recommended that

dad find a psychiatrist for medication to manage his mental health needs. Dad states that in 2021 he

followed up on recommendations and took the SNRI drug Effexor. Dad states that this medication made

him ill. Dad's medication was then switched to the Serotonin Modulator, Trazadone. Although dad reports

that this medication had less side effects, he eventually made a personal decision to stop taking it. He

states that it was no longer necessary. Dad says he is currently managing his mental health through

socialization with friends, role playing games, video games and periodic exercise. It is unclear if these are

effective therapeutic strategies to manage dad's specific issues, but they are certainly not what was

recommended by Dr. Leimkhuher in 2018. Therefore, it does not appear that dad is currently meeting his

own needs nor has he shown that he is resilient.

The level of bitterness and resentment between mom and dad is so severe that it has likely caused a great deal of emotional and psychological damage to Rebecca. Behavioral: When Rebecca was living with mom, it does appear that mom was home with her often. Moreover, it appears that mom spends an adequate amount of time and money caring for her child. This includes basic needs, medical care, educational resources and helping with her therapeutic needs. In regards to behavioral issues, mom uses several strategies to manage her child. These include having her sit for several minutes to calm down, removing electronic devices and verbal communication to help process through each situation appropriately. Lastly, mom recognizes the importance of the age and developmental level when addressing behavioral and other concerns. Based on this information, mom does appear to set her own needs aside for her child, demonstrates adequate skills and is adaptive as a caregiver.

Cognitive: Mom stated to CPI that Rebecca did not have PCOS. Mom stated to CPI that Rebecca and her dad over dramatized her medical issues. CPI was provided documentation that Rebecca does have PCOS and that there was a recommended diet. Rebecca repeatedly states that mom does not understand her medical and emotional needs. However, mom does appear to understand her protective role and has sufficiently demonstrated an ability to articulate plans for protection for her child.

Emotional: It appears mom loves and empathizes with her child. Mom also likes to spend time with Rebecca reading stories, going to the movies, and visiting friends. However, Rebecca is angry with her mom. Rebecca feels that her mom has dismissed her medical concerns and engaged in various forms of emotional abuse. Therefore, it does not appear at this time that mom and Rebecca have a positive relationship. Alternatively, mom works hard to provide Rebecca with the basic necessities. According to witnesses, mom has done this throughout the course of her child's life. Witnesses also state that mom has sought out therapy for Rebecca and followed through with her educational needs. Based on CPI observations and witness accounts, it does appear that mom is sufficiently supportive and aligned with her child.

Behavioral: According to dad and Rebecca, dad follows through in providing Rebecca with all the things she needs. This includes basic needs like food, clothing and shelter as well as medical care, educational needs and tending to her emotional well-being. Dad states that Rebecca rarely has behavioral issues, but if she is struggling, he will attempt to process through the issue based on each individual circumstance. Finally, dad understands that his child is at a unique developmental age, which requires him to attend to her behavioral issues in an individualized way. Dad understands that this is also true for general communication and interactions with his child. However, there are reports that dad has been unusually fixated on his daughters PCOS and menstrual cycle. During conversations with CPI, dad did appear extremely concerned with his daughters PCOS. If true, as unusual as this behavior may appear it does meet the criteria to state that dad is not protective. Based on this information, it does appear that dad sets his needs aside for his child, demonstrates adequate skills and is adaptive as a caregiver.

Cognitive: According to Rebecca dad is attentive to her needs in an appropriate way. However, other witnesses state that dad's observations of dad providing his child with housing, food, and other necessities. Moreover, CPI observations of dad providing her needs. Witnesses also report that dad understands how to be protective. This is further demonstrated in dad's attentiveness to his child's medical, educational and emotional needs. Finally, in interactions with CPI, it was evident that dad was capable of articulating plans for protection of his child.

Emotional: It appears that dad loves and empathizes with his daughter. It is apparent that dad and Rebecca spend quality time together and both report to have a good relationship. Rebecca appears and reports to love and have a positive attachment to dad. Finally, dad spends most of his money on various needs for his child. Now comes Liseta Botelho in her capacity as a Social Caseworker ("SCW") for the Department of Children, Youth and Families ("DCYF"), and hereby states the following facts:

1. That on 8/8/22, the RI Child Abuse Hotline received a report that 16-year-old Rebecca would not return home from a visit with father in Texas due to alleged emotional and medical abuse as to mother.

2. That CPI Nicholas Iadevaia was assigned the investigation and both Texas CPS and RI CPS came to the same conclusion that the allegations were unfounded.

3. That on 9/9/22, the Department was ordered to immediately work with the Texas DCF to bring the child back to the adjudicated home state of Rhode Island.

4. That the child threatened to commit suicide if forced to return to Rhode Island.

5. That Rhode Island then initiated the requisition via the ICI rules.

6. That on 10/6/22, Judge Naik signed an Interstate Compact for Juveniles along with a judge in Williamson County Juvenile Court allowing RI DCYF to retrieve Rebecca from the State of Texas.

7. That 16-year-old Rebecca is currently placed at St. Mary's Home for Children Assessment Center.

8. That mother and father have joint custody, placement with mother.

9. That the following circumstances exist which would indicate that there is a substantial, immediate danger to the child which precludes the provision of preventative services as an alternative to removal: That 16-year-old Rebecca refused to return home from a visit with her father from Texas, parents have joint custody, placement with mother, and child refuses to return home to mother.

10. That the "Summary of Facts to Substantiate Allegations of Dependency, Neglect, and/or Abuse" signed by Liseta Botelho and dated October 17, 2022, is hereby attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A.

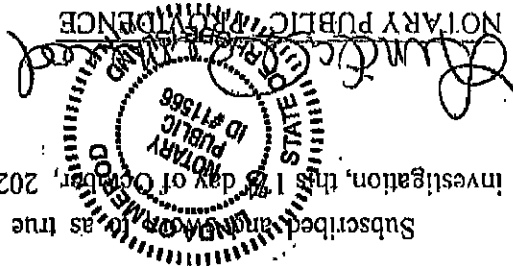

This case came to the attention of the RI Department of Children, Youth and Families August 8th, 2022 when a call was made to the child abuse hotline. At that time father, David Parker stated his child, Rebecca Parker (16) sent a four-minute video to her mother, guardian ad litem: Patricia Kapos, and therapist, Katie Ferrer reporting she is refusing to return to Mother's care.

Reporter stated that Rebecca was due to return today back to RI from Texas and refused to leave. Reporter stated Mother and her attorney have filed an ex-parte and are holding reporter in contempt for refusing to return the child back into Mother's care. The child has medical issues including a genetic disorder, PCOS, and a chemical imbalance which requires a special diet. Mother does not adhere to the diet which causes the child to experience swelling, redness to her face, and sores. Child is threatening to hurt herself if she goes back to RI.

Reporter states Rebecca has sent an email to mother stating, "fuck off, I am not getting on the plane." Father also reported that Rebecca is alleging emotional and medical abuse as to Mother. Father stated Texas CPS said they need a referral from RI to interview the child about her allegations.

An investigation occurred involving both Rhode Island CPS and Texas CPS. CPI Iadavalta was assigned to the investigation in Rhode Island. CPI Iadavalta spoke with Rebecca's Therapist Katie who acknowledged parent's did share some of the issues she had with moms parenting. Katie stated that she attempted to prompt Rebecca to speak with mom regarding these issues. Katie stated that Rebecca opted not to. Katie did not hear or witness anything that she thought was abuse or neglect on the part of mom or dad. Both Texas CPS and Rhode Island CPS came to the same conclusion of an unfounded investigation for abuse or neglect.

On September 9th, the Department was ordered to immediately work with the Texas DCF to bring the child back to the adjudicated home state of RI, over father's objection. Rebecca Parker is with her father in Texas and is refusing to return to RI. Mother and father have joint legal custody, but mother has sole physical custody. Rebecca is alleging physical and medical neglect by mother. She has threatened to commit suicide if forced to return to RI. She has a medical condition that requires a special diet, but she says mother is not providing the correct food for her. Rhode Island then initiated the requisition via the ICJ rules.

On September 19th, 2022, the Kimberly Humak case opened to the Family Service Unit (FSU) as a non-legal status case. Rebecca Parker remained in Texas awaiting the judicial decision of the Texas courts to determine if Rebecca would return home to RI to her mother per the current domestic custody agreement.

On October 6th, Rhode Island Family Judge Naik signed an Interstate Compact for Juveniles-Requisition for Runaway Juvenile as the child was considered a runaway and believed to be with her father in Hutto, Texas. Judge in Williamson County Juvenile Court also signed the document allowing RI DCF to retrieve Rebecca Parker from the state of Texas. A court hearing was also held on the same date regarding this matter in Williamson County Juvenile Court at which time the judge in Texas detained Rebecca Parker due to suicidal statements and the concern if she returned to her father's home while awaiting DCF's arrival, he would not freely turn the child over to the Department.

RI DCF flew to Austin, Texas where mother, Kimberly Humak remained. It was determined by both Judges and DCF that mother should not fly on the same flight home to Rhode Island as Rebecca continues to make SI statements if she has to see or return home to her mother. DCF determined the teen should enter into placement until further assessment regarding the relationship between Rebecca and her mother and overall safety in the home. The below information was collected during the most recent RI CPS investigation retrieved from both parents and resources.

Father, David Parker in 2018, was seen by Dr. Bret Leimkühler who conducted a comprehensive neuro-psychiatric test of Mr. Parker. The evaluation found that Father had Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, Unspecified Depressive Disorder (with features of dysthymia and major depression), Unspecified Personality Disorder (with schizoid, schizotypal and/or paranoid features), adjustment disorder with Anxiety and Depressed Mood, Unspecified Anxiety Disorder and Unspecified Neurocognitive Disorder. The evaluation states that dad needs "intensive individual therapy". At the time, dad opted to see therapist LICSW Judith Chick. Judith was recently contacted via email by Mr. Parker who CC'ed CPI Iadavala. Judith stated she had not spoken to Father in over a year and did not believe she was the appropriate person to contact. Judith also stated that she had referred him to a therapist in Texas. It does not appear that Mr. Parker has engaged in therapy since this time. This is concerning because Dr. Leimkühler's evaluation indicates that Mr. Parker needs significant therapeutic treatment directly related to his parenting style and confusion about boundaries (likely due to his unhealthy fixation with Rebecca's menstrual cycle). Dr. Leimkühler also strongly recommended that dad find a psychiatrist for medication to manage his mental health needs. Mr. Parker states that in 2021 he followed up on recommendations and took the SNRI drug Effexor. Father states that this medication made him ill. Mr. Parker's medication was then switched to the Serotonin Modulator, Trazodone. Although Mr. Parker reports that this medication had less side effects, he eventually made a personal decision to stop taking it. He states that it was no longer necessary. Mr. Parker says he is currently managing his mental health through socialization with friends, role playing games, video games and periodic exercise. It is unclear if these are effective therapeutic strategies to manage Father's specific issues, but they are certainly not what was recommended by Dr. Leimkühler in 2018. Therefore, it does not appear that Mr. Parker is currently meeting his own needs, nor has he shown that he is resilient.

Mother, Kimberly Humak has no known history of criminal behavior, drug addiction or alcoholism. During interactions with CPI Iadavala, Ms. Humak did not show any signs of being under the influence or mentally unstable. Mom reports to have a diagnosis of ADHD, Complex PTSD and Generalized Anxiety Disorder. Mother is currently on Lexapro and Adderall to help manage her symptoms. She is also seeing therapist, Melanie Clifford at Professional Counseling on a weekly basis. Furthermore, Kimberly is currently employed full-time as an accountant. She also has a working car and drives regularly, is in college full-time and has stable housing. Moreover, based on witness accounts, mother is financially responsible and able to fulfill daily activities in a timely and productive manner. Based on this information, it does appear that mom can control her impulses and takes action.

Moreover, Kimberly has rented her home for several years, has a stable job and appears to be meeting all of her financial responsibilities. Ms. Hutnak also appeared patient during interactions with CPI despite the stress related to the investigation. Finally, Kimberly has been cooperative throughout the DCYF process. This includes effective communication and promptly responding to DCYF requests.

Rebecca is a 16-year-old adolescent girl. Rebecca is a patient at Thundermist Health Center. Rebecca has PCOS and a Genetic Disorder. According to a report from Hasbro, it was recommended that Rebecca be on a specific diet. These recommendations consisted of a series of links to healthy eating websites. There is some debate between mom and dad as to the rigidity of this diet. However, Rebecca does state that when she strictly adheres to the diet, she feels much healthier. Mom states that she has attempted in the past to purchase the healthy food that Rebecca requested, but Rebecca would choose to continue eating unhealthy food. Rebecca denies that mom put in sufficient effort to provide her with healthier alternatives. In addition, Rebecca is a student at Charlio High School. Rebecca entered into the 11th grade this year. Mom reports that Rebecca has an IEP to help with her diagnosis of ADHD and anxiety. In addition, mom states that Rebecca does not have serious behavioral issues but can be oppositional and disrespectful at times. Finally, Ms. Hutnak says that Rebecca has a close group of friends that she talks to online and that act as a support system for her.

Family is not associated with a Native American Tribe, ICWA does not apply to this family.

Due to the ongoing tumultuous interactions between both parents in regard to their daughter, Rebecca which has caused ongoing concerning interactions, as well as Rebecca's suicidal ideation statements, DCYF is filing a Dependency petition as to said child to help support her family and provide services to address the above ongoing concerns.

- o The substitute caretaker may be required to provide transportation to medical appointments, social services and/or family visits.

The substitute caretaker may be required to provide any of the following: ventilator treatments, oxygen, apnea monitors/heart monitors, IV medications, specialized feeding, nasal gastric tubes, etc., multiple interaction medications. Due to these conditions, the child/youth may be considered technologically dependent, i.e., the child/youth may require more than 40 hours per week of personal care.

The BOHHS provides an opportunity for any of the above-named to be heard through a formal procedure for review of any agency decision when efforts at resolution within the respective divisions have not been successful. Dissatisfaction may arise in the administration of the program for a variety of reasons, and this agency provides a method for receiving complaints from individuals and an appeal process. However, an attempt should be made to resolve appeals at the level where the decision was made through a discussion with the staff member who made the decision and/or the staff member's supervisor or administrator.

A complaint is defined as any oral or written request for remedy made to a DCYF staff person in the field or office or to supervisory or administrative staff, concerning the administration of agency policies and programs, in which the legal rights, duties or privileges of a specific person are required by law to be determined by the Department. Such complaints may include but not necessarily be limited to:

- Visitation
- Placement or removal of children from foster homes
- Disagreement in case planning including those services provided for youth 18 - 21 to assist with transition to adulthood
- Determination that a youth between the ages of 18 - 21 is ineligible for services
- Claims of discrimination based on race, color, national origin, age, sex, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, religious belief, political belief or disability
- Licensing issues
- Certification issues
- Indicated child abuse or neglect findings

(a) Whenever the department of children, youth and families shall pay for the support and maintenance of any child pursuant to §§ 42-72-13 and 42-72-14, or whenever another department, agency, society, institution, or person having the charge, care, or custody of a child shall pay for the support and maintenance of the child, the court shall order either or both parents owing a duty of support to a child to pay an amount based upon a formula and guidelines adopted by an administrative order of the family court. If, after calculating support based upon court established formula and guidelines, the court, in its discretion, finds the proposed order would be inequitable to the child or either parent, the court shall make findings of fact and shall order either or both parents owing a duty of support to pay an amount reasonable or necessary for the child's support after considering all relevant factors, including, but not limited to:

- (1) The financial resources of the child;
 - (2) The financial resources of the custodial parent;
 - (3) The standard of living the child would have enjoyed had the marriage not been dissolved;
 - (4) The physical and emotional condition of the child and his or her educational needs; and
 - (5) The financial resources and needs of the non-custodial parent.
- (b) If it deems necessary or advisable, the court may order child support and education costs for children attending high school at the time of their eighteenth (18th) birthday and for ninety (90) days after graduation, but in no case beyond their nineteenth (19th) birthday. In addition, the court may order the support of a child with a severe physical or mental impairment to continue until the twenty-first (21st) birthday of the child.
- (c) After a decree for support has been entered and upon the petition of either party, the court may review and alter its decree relative to the amount and payment of support. If the court finds that a substantial change in circumstances has occurred, the decree may be made retroactive to the date that notice of a petition to modify was given to the adverse party. In such a case the court shall set forth in its decision the specific findings of fact which show a substantial change in circumstances and why the decree should be made retroactive.
- (d) Any order for child support issued by the family court shall contain a provision requiring either or both parents owing a duty of support to a child to obtain health insurance coverage for the child when such coverage is available to the parent or parents through their employment without cost or at a reasonable cost. "Reasonable cost" shall be defined in accordance with guidelines adopted by administrative order of the family court in conjunction with the child support guidelines.
- (e) Any existing child support orders may be modified in accordance with this section unless the court makes specific written findings of fact that take into consideration the best interests of the child and conclude that a child support order or medical order would be unjust or inappropriate in a particular case.
- (f) In addition, the national medical support notice shall be issued with respect to all orders issued, enforced, or modified on or after October 1, 2002, in accordance with chapter 29 of this title. The notice shall inform the employer of provisions in the child support order for health care coverage for the child and of the method to implement this coverage. In lieu of the court ordering the non-custodial parent to obtain or maintain health care coverage for the child, the court may order the non-custodial parent to contribute a weekly cash amount towards the medical premium for health care coverage paid by the state of Rhode Island and/or the custodial parent. to determine a reasonable weekly amount shall be addressed in a family court administrative order pertaining to the child support guidelines.

(g) All support orders established or modified in the state on or after October 1, 1998, shall be recorded with the Rhode Island family court/department of administration, division of taxation child support computer enforcement system. The system maintains the official registry of support orders entered in accordance with applicable administrative orders issued by the Rhode Island family court.

(h) In any subsequent child support enforcement action between the parties, upon sufficient showing that a diligent effort has been made to ascertain the location of such a party, the court may allow for notice and service of process to be made by first class mail or by service of written notice to the most recent residential or employer address of record, as specified in the Rhode Island rules of procedure for domestic relations for the Family Court of Rhode Island.

(i) The department of children, youth, and families shall not seek child support for services to the child which are special education services as defined under state and federal law and pursuant to the regulations of the board of regents for elementary and secondary education governing the special education of students with disabilities, section two, I, 1-0-4.11 and 34 C.F.R. That father has also posted a picture of SCW Botelho as a minor on the website and continues to have a picture of Judge Naik on the website, and he requests donations to go to Rebecca's attorney to support his cause.
5. That SCW Botelho picked up Rebecca from school on 4/17 at 2: 15 PM and drove her to her placement at NAFI. Rebecca appeared bright, excited to show her the new drawings she had done, and told the SCW she was thinking about applying to the RI School of Design for college. SCW told Rebecca that is a very talented and to certainly apply if that is something she wants to pursue.

6. That Rebecca told the SCW she was terrified to tell her father that she now wants to go home with her mother and the SCW let Rebecca know that she can be supported when she decides to have that discussion with her father.

This emergency motion for review is before the court due to the following concerns in regard to the safety and wellbeing of child, Rebecca Parker, SCW Botelho and NAFI clinician, Tayla Bartone.

Over the course of this case, Mr. David Parker has harassed and belittled professional staff at St. Mary Home for Children as well as NAFI. Mr. Parker was offered clinical services for he and his daughter to engage in family counseling but both agencies after several incidents of concerning threatening emails and conversations from Mr. Parker, they ceased engagement with father. Scw Botelho made a referral to the Inner You Counseling Center for family therapy, and the program reports they have called Mr. Parker three times and left three messages with no response or call back thus far.

Mr. Parker has created a website called <https://rescuebex.com>. This website continues to discuss his minor daughter and the DCYF case as well as the family's domestic case. Within this website, Mr. Parker states numerous false statements regarding the NAFI clinician, SCW Botelho and DCYF. He has also posted a picture of Ms. Botelho as a minor on the website and continues to have a picture of RI Judge Naik on the website as well. This website also requests donations to go towards Rebecca's attorney to support his cause.

On 4/16/23, NAFI clinician Tayla Bartone supervised a weekly phone call between Rebecca and her father. Ms. Bartone sent this email after hanging up with Mr. Parker "I am sending this email to provide an update as well as transparency over the phone call that occurred about an hour ago with myself and Rebecca's father. Despite my multiple emails indicating that Rebecca did not want to speak with Dad today, he proceeded to call the program a few minutes after 2:00pm today. Rebecca still refused to speak to him. In this phone call he proceeded to state that we are enforcing and rewarding this type of behavior (refusing to speak to him) with Rebecca. He stated that Rebecca has been working with a clinician who he has never met to which I proceeded to remind him that I am the individual working with Rebecca as I am the clinician at NAFI Ridge Street. He states that DCYF and Cindy said we would not be working with Rebecca and that he has been lied to. I reminded him of a previous email sent by Norie indicating that we would no longer be working with him as a result of his behavior and overall inappropriateness. He proceeded to talk about my qualifications and told me to "stop talking" multiple times. He stated that he will be filing a grievance and going after Cindy's license and will be talking to his attorney about who he can sue. I attempted multiple times to redirect him stating that I was attempting to support a phone call but we cannot force an individual on the phone and that I need to be respectful of Rebecca's wishes as a 17 year old young adult. Throughout the phone call Dave spoke to me in a degrading way and about case related concepts which I also attempted to redirect him about. Throughout the phone call I remained professional, validating, and concrete. Other concepts regarding vitamins, her diet, and a binder Rebecca has filled with various documents were brought up by him. I remained factual based in the entirety of the exchange. During the phone contact Rebecca

could hear her father yelling at Mrs. Bartone even behind closed doors. Rebecca stated SCW Botelho in relation to this call "now I see why people have a difficult time talking with him"

On 4/17/23 at 2:15pm,

Scw Botelho picked up Rebecca from school on 4/17 at 2:15PM. Scw drove Rebecca to her placement at NAFI. Rebecca appeared bright, excited to show Scw her new drawings she has done. Rebecca also told Scw that she was thinking about applying to the RI School of Design for college. Scw told Rebecca that is great to hear that you are now considering applying to a college since the last time Rebecca told Scw that she did not want to go to college at all. Scw told Rebecca that she is very talented and to certainly apply if that is something she wants to pursue. Rebecca said her visits with her mom have been going really well and she has seen a huge change within her mother's home. She said her mom and grandmother have been really attentive to Rebecca's wants and needs. She also said she realized that during that time she felt neglected by her mother, the family was grieving over the loss of her grandfather. She now knows that everyone grieves differently and the way that she grieves is wanting/needing attention from others. She believes some of her family members wanted to grieve more privately and alone and she now understands her mom a lot better knowing that. Rebecca said she really wants to go home with Mom and is ready to go back home to her mother's.

4/17/23 at 5:22PM,

On 4/17/2023, Scw Botelho supervised a phone call between Rebecca and her Father for 25 minutes. In support of Rebecca, NAFI Clinician was also present in the room with Rebecca during the phone call. Father started the conversation by telling Rebecca she cannot refuse phone calls with him since he is miles away and he gets disappointed when they don't have phone calls. Rebecca told her dad that she was sorry, and she was just really tired. Her dad stated again that it cannot happen again, and he really needs her to have phone calls with him. Rebecca said again she was sorry and ok. Father asked Rebecca how she is doing and if there is anything he needs to report. Rebecca said that she (herself) and everything is going really well. Father started discussing with Rebecca about this famous YouTuber that speaks about sex trafficking. Rebecca appeared to be uncomfortable with the conversation and stated I honestly hate people who hide behind a keyboard. Father replied "these are website warriors." Rebecca said again, "nah I don't like that... I rather someone say stuff to my face than behind a keyboard." Rebecca changed subjects and started to tell her dad how she was thinking about going to RI School of Design. Her father said RLSID sucks and is a terrible school and that is a terrible idea. Rebecca said the school is actually really pretty in the inside, I have seen pictures and thought about applying. Dad said again that the idea was terrible. Father asked Rebecca if she is ready to go home to Texas. Rebecca said well I have been thinking about this for a while and I actually want to go live with my mom. Dad asked Rebecca who is brainwashing her and asked if there is anyone he needs to report. Rebecca said "What? No dad, this is what I want, and no one is convincing me to do so... I have seen a big change in my mother and the dynamic at home and we have been getting along a lot better. Her father asked is it because you feel like this is the only option you have?"

Rebecca said No, I know have a bunch of options, but this is what I want, and just want you to support my decision. Dad said when have I ever not supported you? Rebecca said again I just want to make sure you will support me on this decision. Father told Rebecca that he was disappointed in her decision. Father said again to make sure moving forward she does not refuse or miss any of their phone calls.

The letters were all the same but the names were changed depending on the recipient.

Dear Lisela,

I'm writing to BCG you to listen carefully to Rebecca Parker and hear her heart. This poor girl is being heavily abused by her mother and the system.

When I spoke personally with her while she was staying with Dave and Mary Parker in Texas she told me she was so happy and that she wanted NOTHING in life more that to live with her family in Texas.

She has a long paper trail of documentation about abuse from her mother and the system and the advocates who are supposed to have her best interest at heart.

Rebecca deserves to be heard and deserves to have the desires of her heart. She misses her loving family in Texas. Her family in Texas misses her and absolutely has her best interest at heart. We all miss her here as well.

Please listen deeply to your heart, pray about it, and do the right thing for Rebecca. Put yourself in her shoes. Karma will come back upon you.

Matthew 18:6 says... "But whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to fall away—it would be better for him if a heavy millstone were hung around his neck and he were drowned in the depths of the sea."

Dear Judge,

This case was last before the Court on 4/4/2023. DCYF has TC w/PI Dis of Rebecca Parker. The case is in court today for a Pre-Trial hearing.

Since the last court hearing Rebecca has reunified with her mother, Kimberly Hutnak as of 4/25/23. This reunification occurred with the recommendation from the NAFI clinician and the support from the assigned CASA attorney, Meagan Durigan. CASA Attorney Durigan met with Rebecca who was voicing to her clinician and the DCYF worker, Liseta Botelho that she wanted to move home with her mother. Attorney Durigan confirmed with Rebecca her wishes. Both mother and daughter had consistently engaged in family therapy through NAFI and due to this the relationship was able to progress and heal. Mother and Rebecca were also at a point where they were visiting unsupervised and had completed overnights all without issue. Currently Rebecca and her mother are engaged in Reunification Therapy with Kelly Gemma who is a private therapist. DCYF has not obtained an updated report yet from Ms. Gemma regarding the service.

Rebecca attends Charho High School and has caught up on the work that she was behind on when living Texas. She is scheduled to pass onto the next grade for this fall.

Dr. Gillooly has prescribed Vitamin D, Magnesium Vitamin, and an Iron Vitamin for Rebecca, which she has been taking daily since. Dr. Gillooly reports Rebecca's anxiety is chronic and clearly uncontrolled. Concern there may be other underlying diagnoses that are also not being adequately recognized or treated. Rebecca is diagnosed with ADHD, Depression and Anxiety. Rebecca was evaluated by a Psychiatrist through NAFI Ridge St. who recently prescribed Fluvoxamine (50mg, 1x Daily - 8PM @ only) to help Rebecca with sleep, anxiety, and PTSD. Mother and Father both consented to the medication prior to Rebecca starting the medication. Now that Rebecca is home with mother, Dr. Gillooly's office will be prescribing her medications.

Family sessions with Rebecca and her father, David were discontinued because of the harassing nature, verbal threats, and inappropriate presentation of David via treatment meetings, emails, and with program staff. As of 1/25/2023, Lynn Bishop, NAFI Executive Director made the decision for all and any communication from Mr. Parker go through DCYF. This is the second placement program that has refused to support supervised phone calls with Mr. Parker due to his actions and inappropriate behavior. DCYF located and referred father and Rebecca to the Inner You for a family therapy. The Inner You stated they would be able to provide family therapy virtually since David lives in the state of Texas. The Inner You reported emailing




Mr. Parker is court ordered supervised phone calls per week. Over the last two weeks Rebecca has stated to the supervisor of the visitation calls with her father that she did not wish to speak with her father. Rebecca reports that the calls feel awkward and she is uncomfortable.

Referrals were made for a parent-child evaluation for both Mother and Father. Mother's first initial appointment with Dr. John Parsons, PHD was completed on 04/03/2023 and she has one last session as of the writing of this court letter. However, Dr. Parsons does not accept virtual appointments and it must be in person. Because of this, it has been difficult finding a provider for Father in R.I. who is willing to conduct a parent-child evaluation through virtual appointments. The Department received the W-9 form from Ms. Joann Murphey, PhD, who will conduct the neuropsychological evaluation for Mr. Parker. The DCYF business office has the W-9, once it is entered into the RICHIST system, FSU created the 005 for payment so Mr. Parker can schedule his evaluation.

DCYF filed an emergency motion for review which is also scheduled for today's hearing. DCYF will continue to support Rebecca and work with both parents on her current case plan goal of "Maintain at home with Mother".
