HYMN What Child Is This UMH 219 verses 1, 3

THE STORY OF MARY: Gospel of Luke 1:26-35 (select verses)

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to Nazareth, to a virgin named Mary engaged to Joseph of the house of David. He came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words, and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God... you will bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word."

A WORD FROM MARY

No one ever listens to girls. Not in my world. No one listens when we have something to say. No one believes us when something amazing happens. No one believes us when we get used and abused. But this was different. I wasn't scared. I knew what was being asked. And I said, "yes." To God.

JOSEPH AT THE MANGER

HYMN O Little Town of Bethlehem UMH 230, verses 1-2

During the hymn, small votive candles on the altar may be lit.

THE STORY OF JOSEPH: Matthew 1:18-21 (select verses)

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

A WORD FROM JOSEPH

It was that voice that stopped me. It was that voice which told me I should trust her. It wasn't pleading. It wasn't full of tears. There was no fear. It was that voice which helped me say, "yes." To her. To God.

THE STORY OF THE STAR: Matthew 2:1-10 (select verses)

Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we have seen his star in the East, and have come to worship him." When they saw the star, they rejoiced with great joy.

STAR, STAR, SHINE YOUR LIGHT

Star, star, quiet star
Silent sparkle in the night
Still, still, hear the star
Lighting up the sky
Silent noise from afar
Hush, hush, soundless prayer
Silent glimmer through the air
Star, star, shine your light.

THE BIRTH OF CHRIST

HYMN Angels We Have Heard on High UMH 238 verses 1-3

During the hymn, the Christ Child may be brought to the manger.

THE STORY OF JESUS' BIRTH: Luke 2:1-7 (select verses)

In those days a decree went out from the Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. Joseph went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child.

While they were there, the time came for her to deliver the child. And she gave birth to

her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.
