What Does This Mean? Pastor Weinkauf

Question from the Catechism. Do we ask it enough? Whether it is culture changes or issues before us. We tend to ask *why*? Is it often the wrong question? There are no end to questions: why would God ... why is this happening...? Instead of asking about the answers to *why*, ask *what does this mean*? A better pursuit is often the question of 'meaning.' What does this mean?

We do not really want to know *why* things go well or we feel blessed and our Christian life easy. We just want it to continue. But what life goes not as planned or as we want or as we understand, we manage our wounds, look for answers and even look around for someone to blame, *why?* is an obvious question without much chance of a real answer. *What does this mean?* is the question that offers the Holy Spirit to enlighten, to use this circumstance for our good and to help our faith grow. We want to know that we got it right. What we need, however, is the perspective of faith and that can mean asking the question, *what does this mean*?

It is to our doom we can sometimes fixate on the question *why?*. Even when we get an answer, it does not help us to accept what we do not want or to be at peace with it. On vicarage, I had an elderly member, smoker for 70 years. Tethered to an oxygen line and constantly out of breath, I asked why, if she ever regretted smoking. She lifted the mask from her face, in her raspy voice told me that if it would not blow us up (oxygen), she would gladly light up again. There was no comfort in the question *why*, there was not even any regret. *Meaning* could not be found in an answer to *why* she suffered -but *what does this mean?* pushed her into the arms of her Savior, into the forgiveness, into the strength made perfect in her weakness, and into the perfect healing that awaited her when she feel asleep in the arms of her Savior.

Yeah, sometimes it seems like God delights in plans coming unraveled and disagreements with others that bring hardship. But instead of pondering *why* as if this were a problem to be solved, the meaning of our questions can be found only in Christ, His suffering, how He works for good. It is this that St. Paul describes when he tells us that Christ was made perfect through suffering and through His suffering and our suffering with Him, for His sake, we are given the same privilege. For example, for things that happen to you: *Why?* Because it didn't work out. *What does this mean?* Could be: to show we should always love, show empathy, realize you may not have all the details to properly understand a situation so trust the Lord to work good, forgive those who may error, seek to be compassionate to others, and opportunity for you to grow.




Men's Basketball
