

Piety and What about Veils? Pastor Weinka



At one time, it was common to see veiled women in the Divine Service. Today, it's not common but not rare either. If you look at the above painting of a Lutheran Divine Service, you see all the women with head coverings. Of course this is an ancient Church practice from the admonition of St. Paul in 1 Corinthians 11. In the larger context of global Christianity, our Christian history, even among Lutherans, veils are not unusual. Ancient practices of veils, like kneeling, incense, crucifixes, 'sign of the cross' fell into disuse among American Lutherans greatly influenced by American Reformed churches.

We live in a world where I think much of the social woes and madness going on can be addressed in a single word: piety. Piety: the virtue of devotion to religious principles; a duty of respect. For us, Christian piety is God's Word forming in us: duty, honor, commitment, respect, living out your God-given vocations. You see the chaos all around: gender issues, lack of modesty, sexualization issues, sanctity of life, sanctity of marriage, taking personal responsibility, civility of debate, acceptance of Biblical sin, how people treat others, pragmatism/lack of objective truth, respect for authority...and no piety. The virtue of piety is a significant part of the solution for our world.

Christian piety to be played out in our lives; how desperately we need a daily devotional life, to practice liturgy in our homes, to live life intentionally in Christian piety.

Veils seen in our churches are a simple sign of identity, piety -the mark of those who take seriously vocations, roles, and desire for living holy. If you are curious, ask those who wear them. It's not a desire to stand out or draw attention to self as our culture loves to do, but a sign of piety that the external mirrors the internal, again note 1 Cor. 11.

Lutherans love to celebrate our Christian freedom according to Scripture. If a woman wishes to wear a veil as an expression of her devotion to the Lord, God bless her. If people want to cross themselves, kneel, dip their finger in the font, genuflect (bow at "Glory be to the Father..." and during the humiliation of Christ in the Creed), go to private confession, fast, etc... God bless them. If you don't, God bless you. But these acts of piety is our own history, lest we forget or unaware; even common, the norm for historical Christianity throughout the ages until our American modern times. Yet, an adiaphora, key word among Lutherans, meaning simply where God does not give a command, we don't make it God's law. So use your Christian freedom; it also means joy to accept (or pick-up) practices that are directed in reverence and ritual in godly piety unto Christ. Blessed Easter. The Lord is risen!






