



The Altar Guild. Duty. Reverence. Pastor Weinkauf

The Altar Guild keeps time for us. While some may not understand or appreciate the seasons, feasts, and festivals of the Church Year, the Altar Guild sets the time for the people of God and for the Divine Service by changing the paraments, lectern and pulpit hangings, veils, and banners. They remind us every Sunday we walk not by the time of the world but by God's calendar, that we may order our days under His grace and guidance. God bless their good work in applying to our busy schedules and calendars the order of God's rhythm and pace.

The Altar Guild sets the table for us. There is much work and detail required to set the table of the Lord for us, the ladies of the Altar Guild do so with humility and ever so faithfully week after week, service after service. It is a hidden work but extensive labor to prepare the chalice, ciborium, paten, cruets, flagons, lavabo, individual cups, purificators, corporal, and on and on. They set up, and clean up with much attention to cleanliness and purity. Especially weekly care of linens used in the Sacrament of the Altar have special care and cleaning process Vessels need to be abluted (proper washings) by taking care that any remnants of the Lord's Supper –not go down to the sewer but through a special sink, the piscina, back to the earth along with the water in which they were cleansed. These ladies act out in every Divine Service our confession of the True Presence of Christ.

The Altar Guild keep clean the chancel, the sacred space around the altar. Many little step are taken in addition to the weekly routine. For example, during cold/flu season the Communion railing is sanitized between morning Services.

The Altar Guild especially during the Festivals, Holy Week attends to the particular seasonal and festive duties. Things are important not because they are recognized or appreciated but because they reflect in care the faith we confess. When we veil the sacred images and crucifix or set out the Advent wreath or window votive candles or individual candles used for Christmas Eve and Easter Vigil or change Paraments we are denoting the significance of the day in God's calendar and its part in the gift of Christ and His salvation. These and many other small but significant acts help us know and appreciate the fullness of what it means to be His own and to live under Him in His Kingdom forever.

The Altar Guild cares for the vestments of the assisting servants and acolytes. We all think clothing is important. The vesture of those who serve in God's House is no less important. The Lord also thinks clothing for those who serve in His House is important. It bespeaks of the reverence and dignity for which they are/were used.

Then there are flowers, candles, wicks, candlelighters, pew torches, constant filling oil, and on and on. God bless our Altar Guild for your good and faithful work! The 10 ladies of the Altar Guild make their pastor's life easier and I am sincerely thankful for all their service to the Lord.

They are faithful beyond measure in all this work and it is no small task. They honor the Lord and honor us by serving on our behalf to do this and their witness is an inspiration of how we should reverence and approach the Lord's altar. Anyone is welcome to join in their ranks. Prayerfully consider it. Some do all the needed tasks, some just do certain parts, like setup on Saturday morning or after Sunday 10:30 Service. 
