Labor Day...And Sabbath Rest Pastor Weinkauf

Labor Day. Summer's over. Take advantage of the last of hot weather, relax, vacation, look for Labor Day store sales, enjoy the long weekend. It would benefit us all to focus where the true rest from our labors is found. 3rd Commandment. **Remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy.** Not that you simply recall, think about the Old Testament Sabbath (which has been fulfilled and superseded in Christ Jesus) but that you receive and rest yourself in the Word that God speaks and the gifts that He pours out in the place where He causes His Name and His Glory to 'tabernacle' with you for the sake of your life and salvation in Christ. **Remember**, key word that calls on God's works; **Sabbath**, rest; **Day**, not just a 24 hour time or the old covenant Saturday, but now an eternal '**Day**' of Jesus, **keeping it holy**, in God's presence, receiving God's gifts to you, to sanctify/holy you, from His House with His life, into your house in your life.

Dr. Luther so clearly, simply explained in the Small Catechism, 3rd Commandment: **We should fear and love God that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it.** For it is by this way and means of preaching that God grants you His perfect peace and sabbath rest through the forgiveness of all your sins, the receiving rest of weary body and soul in His gifts. That is how you live and labor and do not die, body and soul, now and forever.

The way you live and work and go about your days and weeks is to be grounded in how you keep this sabbath rest. Do you recognize your work/vocation to be a way of living in the rest that God gives you by His grace?

To put it another way, what is it that rules your life? In what do you have a rest for your body and soul? For that is "the kingdom" to which you belong, whether it be of God or the devil.

Where is the promise of sabbath rest? That is yours only in Jesus, His life, death, resurrection delivered to you; granted to you in the preaching of His Gospel, poured our in a Sacramental life. What other rest is there? And what He has thus done and established by His hard work, by His bloody sweat and labor, He grants to you rest in His Means of Grace (Word & Sacraments). He sanctifies your body and your soul for the life everlasting; gives rest in Himself forever. Matthew 11 should come to mind as well, the Lectionary Gospel reading a few weeks back, **Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.** Matthew 11:28. A promise in all your labors.




This artwork, document is 402 years old! It was printed in Mainz, Germany. It is a choir sheet music.


