INTRODUCTION

This programme was developed by the manufacturer members of chemical products, with the objective of setting minimum standards to ensure chemically based products used in the cleaning process are "fit for the purpose".

One of the NCCA's major functions is to research, develop and publish standards, and a number of reasons dictated why such a programme should be implemented, namely:

- As the programme gains momentum, it will have the effect of gradually eliminating the many poor quality products that are being manufactured and used in the market place.
- Contract Cleaners will be given confidence in the knowledge that they are using products that will not only achieve desirable results, but moreover will significantly reduce their risk of expense due to non-performance.
- Building Owners and Occupiers of buildings will have "peace of mind" by specifying that their outsourced cleaning service provider shall only use NCCA approved products.
- Manufacturers of NCCA approved cleaning products will be able to demonstrate their products are equal or better than the published NCCA performance standards.

Notes

The following standards are intended to be fit for purpose when used in **general** purpose and disinfections in low risk areas e.g. offices and toilets.

Higher specification standards may be required for higher risk areas e.g. **food processing and hospitals/clinics.**

GENERAL

The first phase of this programme considered standards for "large volume" products commonly used in the Industry. Once this phase has been successfully implemented commencing April 2002, then standards for other cleaning products will gradually be phased into the programme.

"This programme for product approval is only open to members of the NCCA"- refer 8.1 on page 6".

DEFINITIONS

pH - concentrate

The pH measurement may have a permissible tolerance of plus minus 0.5

pH product guideline

Acid 0 - 6 Neutral 6.1 - 9 Alkaline 9.1 – 14

Minimum % actives - concentrate

Means "any raw material which will assist in the cleaning process, excluding water, from all sources.

Minimum % actives in use solution

Means the minimum actives in the diluted solution to give a satisfactory cleaning result in a medium soil condition.

Minimum dilution ratio

Means the volume of the product added to the volume of water.

The following performance criteria are designed to ensure the products shown will perform the function for which they are sold:

Notes concerning the above criteria

 # In addition to the above criteria, it should be noted all Disinfectants and Detergent Disinfectants must be registered with the South African Bureau of Standards (SABS) in terms of the compulsory specification as published in Government Gazette No 19999 dated 14th May 1999, promulgated under Section 22(1)(a)(1) of the Standards Act, 1993 (Act 29 0f 1993).

Chemical Raw Materials

In terms of <u>health and safety and the environment</u> the following raw materials will **not** be permitted to be used in the manufacturing process:

Hydrofluoric Acid Carbon Tetrachloride Chlorofluoro Carbons Cresols

Performance Control

The NCCA has the right to request any member to test from time to time any product, in order to provide proof of compliance with minimum % actives and performance standard. The cost of such test shall be for the member's own account.

PRODUCT DATA SHEET

Product data sheets must be available for each product and the following minimum requirements shall be stated:

- Description of the product.
- Usage i.e. where the product should be used.
- Directions i.e. how to use (these should be kept as simple as possible).
- Precautions to take in use.

MATERIAL SAFETY DATA SHEET (MSDS)

It shall be obligatory for each product to carry a MSDS equal and equivalent to the format contained in the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993.

CONTAINER MARKING

The following minimum marking criteria on chemical containers shall apply:

1) Product Name

Each product shall have a name and description.

2) Language

English.

3) Hazardous Warning Statement

A hazardous warning statement must be shown as necessary in terms of current legislation in the RSA.

4) Company Identification

Company name and physical address.

5) Batch Number

A batch number must be shown.

6) Cautionary Procedures

A statement concerning any cautionary procedures/s to be taken with regard to skin, eye and ingestion contact.

7) Labels

Labels on any container shall be securely fixed, and be non-smear.

8) Display of NCCA logo

<u>8.1 Who is eligible to display the NCCA logo and stating approved product on a container?</u>

• NCCA Chemical Manufacturing members

Manufacturing members who sell any of the designated products under their own brand name – only after signing the NCCA's "undertaking of compliance".

• <u>Supplier and Contract Cleaning members i.e. members who do not manufacture</u> chemicals

Supplier and Contract Cleaning members who purchase any of the designated products from a compliant NCCA manufacturing member, and sell/distribute under their own brand name –only after signing the NCCA's "undertaking of compliance".

8.2 Who is not eligible to display the NCCA logo and stating approved product on a container?

 This applies when an NCCA compliant "manufacturing member", "supplier member" or a "contract cleaning member" sells designated products to a non-member, who in turn wishes to sell/distribute under their own brand name. In this instance there can be no transfer of compliance until the organisation concerned applies to become a member of the Association.

9) NCCA Logo

Compliant members must display the NCCA logo on each container, with the words "Approved Product" underneath. The size of the logo is optional.

Note

Members are responsible for their own printing requirements, including the NCCA logo.

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PUBLICATION OF APPROVED PRODUCTS

The NCCA will on an ongoing basis publicize details of products which are approved. These products will be listed by type, alphabetical order, and by Company.

COMPLIANCE

All applicable members of the Association as defined in terms of 8.1 of this standard, are required to give an undertaking of compliance to the Association, a draft of which is attached.

1. INTRODUCTION

The use of cleaning equipment is an integral part of the cleaning process.

It is legally, morally and financially essential that equipment used is "safe" and does not endanger the operator/s or members of the public in the surrounding areas where the equipment is being used.

Under the Occupational Health and Safety Act, 1993, it is the responsibility of every Employer to ensure that products used are safe and without risk to health, and moreover providing adequate training and supervision for establishing safe working practices.

This responsibility also extends to asking the supplier of cleaning equipment for specific information in terms of compliance to relevant standards.

The following standard is recommended to minimize the chance of an accident resulting from faulty equipment.

All end-users, and clients of end-users, are therefore advised to ensure equipment used onsite whether purchased or leased, comply with the following standards:

2. SCOPE

• This standard covers all equipment used for general cleaning purposes.

3. STANDARD

- All products shall be "fit for the purpose.
- In the case of electrically operated equipment, products shall comply with the following applicable SABS standard:
- * **Vacuum Cleaners** and Water Suction Cleaning Appliances: SABS IEC 335-2-2.
- * Floor Treatment and Wet Scrubbing Machines: SABS IEC 335-2-10.
- * General Purpose Cleaning Appliances: SABS IEC 335-2-54.
- * Wet and Dry Vacuum Cleaners including power brush for industrial and commercial use: SABS IEC 335-2-69.
- * Floor Treatment and Floor Cleaning Machines for industrial and commercial

use: SABS IEC 335-2-67.

* <u>Spray Extraction Appliances for industrial and commercial use</u>: SABS IEC 335-2-68.

<u>Note:</u> Written proof of compliance with the above specification should always be requested.

4. TRAINING

A supplier of cleaning equipment shall:

- Ensure all relevant personnel undergo in-house training on an ongoing basis concerning the products they market and/or service.
- Provide as required training in product use to users of equipment, in accordance with the cleaning equipment "unit standards" as published by the Services SETA – Cleaning Chamber.

5. SPARES AND SERVICE BACK-UP

The NCCA recommends that suppliers of equipment are able to provide a full back-up service, by trained personnel.

6. WARRANTIES

The NCCA recommends that a warranty in writing be given for all equipment supplied.

<u>Note:</u> Industry warranties are normally for a period of between one and two years, Where extended spares availability e.g. 10 years is offered, the supplier shall be called upon to prove they are currently supplying spares for equipment 10 years old or more in the market place.

7. APPROVED NCCA EQUIPMENT SUPPLIER

Means that:

- The supplier is a member of the NCCA.
- The member on request shall show evidence that they comply with this standard.

8. COMPLAINTS

When a client i.e. end-user of equipment has cause for a complaint pertaining to this standard, which cannot be resolved with the supplier member, the client may request the NCCA to conciliate in the matter.

9. CODE OF COMPLIANCE

All members who supply cleaning equipment are required to subscribe to a code of compliance which is attached to this standard.
