It had nothing to do with being a church secretary/bookkeeper. That used to be my dream job 20 years ago. But, after working in a church and under an abusive pastor, I swore I'd never work in a church again. Boy, did God have other plans.

I kept month after month striving to do my best while hoping and praying for God to open the door to something like I had before working with women of domestic and sexual violence. Was I really putting my all into it? I don't really know. I do know I wasn't content. I wasn't happy. I honestly felt like I should be doing something different.

This September will be two years of working in this position. This last year I took the role of the missions/outreach coordinator. Since that time, that missions/outreach ministry has grown. We do a weekly Bible study showing us how to retrain ourselves on how to be effective local missionaries in the community we are in. Currently, we are actively involved in three agencies in the Kirksville/Adair County area. Why is that important? Because I'm doing my ultimate calling. I get to go out into the community and serve – and I get to do it through my church. I don't have to do it alone. I have a team to go with me and we work together to be the light of Jesus in our community.

Recently, I was asked to join KLI (Kirksville Leadership Institute). The only way to join this is to be recommended by someone saying you are a leader for the Kirksville area. What an honor! The church sponsored my way




If you'd be interested in joining the Beyond Borders team, let one of the team members, the office, or Pastor Shawn know. They have a monthly meeting the first Monday of each month.

Pastor's Thoughts

God wants to establish your faith. In Judges 6 we find Gideon alone in the bottom of a winepress attempting to thresh wheat – a job that requires wind... but there's no wind at the bottom of a wine press. Their nation was defeated by a foreign army and they were abandoned. Gideon asks "Sir, if YHWH is with us, why has all this happened to us? And where are all the miracles our ancestors told us about? Didn't they say, 'YHWH brought us up out of Egypt'? But now YHWH has abandoned us and handed us over to the Midianites."

Gideon may not have realized who he was talking to because he was asking the angel of YHWH why YHWH had abandoned them, which He hadn't, because the angel was there. But so it goes when our faith is weak. We only see the circumstances around us and we miss God's presence even when he sends messengers or is standing right in front of us. We have to pursue God's view of our circumstances. There are so many other voices screaming to be heard around us. The voice of society and culture and the hurtful words we hear around us must all be rejected as we listen for God's voice. It is the voice saying "I will be with you." (:16)
