

Progressive?

I've never understood how the left has taken the word progressive and made it their own. They use catchy phrases that hide their agenda within words that make their plan seem like it is helpful and friendly to the American people. The sad thing is they have actually convinced people of this, causing people to vote against their own long-term interests and of their children. Let me share some examples.

When students complain about student debt, the left decides to ride into the conversation and author bills to simply forgive the collective debt on student loans. While we're talking about this, perhaps we should discuss these useless degrees that colleges confer on students who seem to not have prospects for employment in mind? To close out this issue, how is it fair for people who either never got to go to college or those who have paid their own way to foot the bill for others?

The left marches on in their crusade to demand the rich pay their "fair share" of taxes. When closely examined, the top one percent of earners (over \$548,000) do earn 22% of all income, but they also carry the burden of paying 42% of all taxes. The top 2%-5% (over \$221,000-\$548,000) earn an additional 16% of income, while paying 20% of the taxes. The top 5%-10% (\$152,000 to \$221,000) earn 11% of income while paying an equal 11% of taxes. Finally, the folks from 11% up to the top 25% of earners (\$86,000 to \$152,000) earn 21% of the income and pay 15% of the taxes. This means that that collectively, the top 25% of earners pay 87% of the taxes. The bottom 10% of earners (less than \$42,000) pay 2% of all the taxes, with many paying nothing. Simply "paying their fair share" isn't numerically in the lowest earner's interest, but rather political hyperbole at its worst. Equally pairing percent of income with percent of taxes paid would be a dramatic shift of tax burden to those Americans earning under \$86,000 per year. Many of these earners are also currently eligible for additional tax benefits and programs that the higher earners are not. But this all doesn't fit on a bumper sticker.

Finally, the left enjoys talking about the certification of the 2020 Presidential election. You hear them yell about election deniers, fake electors, faithless electors, and other terms meant to be derogatory towards Conservatives. I would just like to point out that several Democrats in January of 2017 raised objection to the certification of the Presidential election of Donald J. Trump. If you read the Congressional Record from Friday, January 6, 2017, you will enjoy several paragraphs of the official record of these proceedings. Through the theatrics and anger over Secretary Clinton's loss, we see meltdown from Trump's win and his subsequent inauguration, with leftist heroes such as Representative John Lewis and others refusing to attend the inauguration. Kettle? Pot?

My point isn't that Republicans are perfect, because we aren't. But the left has gotten so good at spinning their lies into accepted truth that people just accept it. Instead, my point is that we must stop
