Languedoc soldier Martin Balthazar dit St. Martin (1737-97) spoke at Bastille Festival







Thanks to BGHS member Phil Stickney, I have these photographs to show you of my recent portrayal of Martin Balthazar dit St. Martin, a French soldier who fought in the 1759 Plains of Abraham battle in Quebec. In that battle, he witnessed the deaths of his General Louis-Joseph de Montcalm and the opposing British General James Wolfe. The French lost that battle and others which resulted in losing virtually all of North America in the 1763 Treaty of Paris. Having survived, St. Martin was allowed to remain in Quebec as one of 500 soldiers. This native of Metz (Lorraine Province, France) is an ancestor of many French-Canadian persons who now live in northeastern Illinois's French-Canadian Heritage Corridor—the King family is one such family. St. Martin addressed a large crowd at the French Heritage Museum's Bastille Day Festival on July 16. I thank Veronica Featherston, executive director of the Kankakee County Museum, for giving me an opportunity to convey this important history.

Let's celebrate MBVM's 175th anniversary on August 20-21






Additional kudos to our volunteers and donors
