# Log schoolhouse historic landmark nomination will be presented to the Kankakee County Board on August 8

Bourbonnais Grove's log schoolhouse's nomination as a Kankakee County historic landmark may be approved by the county board on August 8 at the 9 am board meeting. The Village of Bourbonnais has already approved the log schoolhouse as a village historic landmark. The log schoolhouse (1837-48) later became the home of French-Canadian families from 1848-2010. What a wonderful treasure we now enjoy and can use as a tangible artifact to teach and "touch" our community's pioneer history!


#### Who am I?
