## LaSalle Silhouette Unveiled in His Namesake City





The above two photographs show Illinois-Michigan Canal Corridor Association President Ana Koval and LaSalle, Illinois Mayor Jeff Grove unveiling the new silhouette of Rene-Robert Cavelier, Sieur de LaSalle (1643-87) at the I & M Lock 16 Center on 754 First Street in LaSalle, IL. In the 1680s LaSalle came to Illinois and established Fort St. Louis atop Starved Rock. Our member and author of *The Time of the French in the Heart of North America: 1673-1818*, Dr. Charles Balesi (in the right photograph), was a keynote speaker at the event. The Bourbonnais Grove Historical Society and the Bradley Bourbonnais Rotary Club are working with the Canal Corridor Association to someday establish an "Historic Waterways Corridor" from Lake Michigan to Saint Genevieve, Missouri. The "Historic Waterway Corridor" would include Lake Michigan, St. Joseph River, Kankakee River, I & M Canal, Illinois River, and Mississippi River.
