




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

- Evidence-Based Practice of CBT & Motivational Interviewing
- Withdrawal Management
- Residential: 30 days, 5 hours of group, 1:1 once per week, 1 hr. twelve-step per night
- Partial Hospitalization: 30 days, 5 days per week 4 hours of programming per day
