- JADC2 Kill Chain Scheduling Optimization Model** Jan 2023-Aug 2023
Operations Research Analyst at Booz Allen Hamilton – Finds optimal platform to target/phase allocation and schedule to minimize total time to close kill chains vs. all targets for the DoD's Joint All-Domain Command and Control (JADC2). All work is classified.
- U.S. Air Force Synthetic Theater Operations Research Model (STORM)** Jan 2022-Aug 2023
Operations Research Analyst at Booz Allen Hamilton – A stochastic model that serves as USAF's premier campaign analysis tool. We provide analysis of campaign-level contributions of air, space, sea, land and cyberspace forces. All work is classified.
- Seshat: Global History Databank** Apr 2019-Sep 2020
Research Assistant at University of Oxford – Seshat systematically collects what is currently known about the social and political organization of human societies and how civilizations have evolved over time. We built the database to allow us and others to test different hypotheses about the rise and fall of large-scale societies across the globe and human history.

- "Political Ritual Violence of Anti-Communist Vigilantism: Philippines, 1965-1989"** Jan 2019-Mar 2020
- Conducted an archival study that explored how anti-communist vigilantism manifested in politically clientelist relationships between warlords and militants in the Philippines within a Cold War framework.
 - Synthesized messianic texts and religious manifestos with U.S. intelligence and military documents to evaluate armed group behavior in response to emerging Cold War ideologies.
- "How Does Resource Availability Affect Non-State Armed Group Recruitment?"** Jun 2016-Apr 2017
- Performed a mixed methods study that analyzed how geographical location, political regime structure, and technological availability affect the expansion of non-state armed groups.
 - Designed a negative backwards regression to evaluate armed group behavior based on a set of independent variables, extracting and cleaning data from the World Bank, UN, Polity IV, and BAAD for final analysis.
- "Moral Injury and the Display of Religion in the French Satirical Press"** Aug 2015-Apr 2017
- Analyzed a qualitative series of caricatures published in the *Charlie Hebdo* satirical magazine and timely media releases from other European press outlets to question the presence of moral injury to the French Muslim community.
