




June 18-24

#### Pastor's Reflections

For some reason or another I have been more aware of my surroundings lately. Not sure what it is. Maybe it is the fact that I generally have been turning off the radio in my car. Maybe it is the fact that all the distractions that seem to go around in my head are quitter these days. Maybe it's because I have a new insurance company and I currently have an app on my phone that tracks how well, or not so well, I am driving. At the renewal time I can get a discount on my car insurance.

A couple examples of this noticing. 1. Walking into Walmart on Route 60 and I noticed the Entrance and the Exit signs above the doors. I saw them after I was technically walking in the exit door. How about car bumper stickers? Have you noticed interesting car bumper stickers? Maybe you have noticed the creation colors or the speed of people driving who seem to be in some kind of hurry for some reason.


So here is the question I keep asking myself. Why now? When you receive this newsletter, we will be in the beginnings of Holy Week. The drama of Holy Week always draws me in. It makes me notice things I might not have noticed before. It also reminds me that God, in Jesus Christ, God's Son, is going to do something. You and I know the something and will celebrate it with the return to the Alleluia in worship. We will remember this something Sunday after Sunday as we celebrate this gift of God to the world.

It seems to me because of this gift – RESURRECTION nothing is the same. When we despair about not having enough time to do the things we want to do we step back and remember RESURRECTION. When we wonder about wars and hunger and the injustice of the system that seems to continue to want to put us all into categories or camps we remember RESURRECTION. When we seem to be having the worst day possible and nothing seems to be going right we remember RESURRECTION.

Maybe all the noticing I have been seeing is God's way of saying: Wake up and see RESURRECTION! God saying to me see hope. God saying to me death and despair and grief does not have the final say. Maybe also the noticing of the stuff of life is a reminder that God is active and involved and showing me RESURRECTION every day.

There is a phrase I have been using from scripture lately that helps me to move forward as God would have me move. The phrase is: With the eyes of your heart enlightened. My prayer for us all this Easter season is that the "eyes of your hearts would be enlightened" with the hope of RESURRECTION and new life.


Dear Members of St. Paul Congregation,


For the first time ever, I missed the Ash Wednesday service and the imposition of Ashes. In less than 48 hours, I had fallen ill with Flu B, strept pneumonia, pleurisy and sepsis and was hospitalized. I have never been so sick. Through this sickness, I prayed and prayed and talked to God and asked for full healing. I held my Faith close at heart as I know God is our one true healer. As I faced my fear of illness with God by my side, I prayed the St. Patrick's breastplate prayer. I used meditation as well and imagined Christ on all sides of me and in my heart. I remembered, I am a child of God and I am so blessed and I want to continually share the word, love and light of Christ daily. It has been 5 weeks and I am still fighting pneumonia and a broken rib. During this time, I have been still and listened. I have learned to slow down a bit, to express my love for family and friends daily, to share God's love, to pray, praise and be thankful for all my blessings, to remind others they are a child of God, to not sweat the small things or the insignificant things and to rejoice and be glad that I am made in God's image. I am thankful for all of your prayers as well. It is so easy for us to get caught up in this fast paced world around us and to allow things to get between our time with God. We need to make the time. We need to take the time.

As Ash Wednesday begins our Lenten Journey, we reflect on our past, our present and look to our future for our spiritual growth. We may fast, give, give up, or implement changes in our spiritual journey. We desire to be Christlike and to be a loving Child of God and to walk by Faith. Let us renew our faith and honor the truth and grace of Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. We are so blessed with the gift of eternal life through the greatest sacrifice of all- God's only son. I watched a documentary on the Jesus Revolution while in the hospital and was moved to know how God can and has moved through others. I have started reading the book and have learned some history as well. "More people were baptized during the Jesus Revolution than in any time since people started keeping records" (Laurie & Vaughn, p.14) I would love to see another Jesus Revolution take place in America now. We have seen revivals in our neighboring state of Kentucky. We have seen growth in our church with new members from our community. Let us continue to share the word, love and light of Christ with all we meet. Let us welcome others like an open and innocent child. Have you ever been to a playground? Children make new friends in a matter of minutes. There is no disgression but only the willingness and openness to be welcoming and play and join in the fun. If we let go of the unimportant small things and remember we are children of God, made in his image, and we are called to love one another and allow God to use our hands to do His work, then we are honoring God.and our call. We are "the change" we want to see in the world! We can make the world a better place daily!

Since I have come back to church, I have been so humbled with the love, compassion and prayers of others. The hugs from children that missed me as well as the hugs and kind sentiments from my brothers and sisters in Christ have lifted me up as I recognize the true blessing of being a member of St. Paul Lutheran Church. The children will perform "This Little Light of Mine" on Palm Sunday. I hope that it reminds us all to share the love and lights in our hearts with the world! This Easter may you remember that you are blessed with the BEST, we are so blessed to have our Lord by our side. I leave you with the lyrics to "I'm so Blessed" by Cain. (on the next page)













