



Community Partnerships

"Huey, the Workhorse of Vietnam" Traveling Exhibit

We collaborated with the Oklahoma Humanities and the City of Enid Communications Department to reveal our newest military traveling exhibit entitled, "The Huey, the Workhorse of Vietnam." This exhibit, dedicated to those veterans of Vietnam in Nov 2022, includes an oral history excursion through life in a Huey during Vietnam. More than 1MM views of these heroic videos have been seen.



The project also included a portion of a 20 ft. high by 80 ft. long mural depicting the history of the Woodring Airport which includes a phenomenal rendition of the men of the US Army on the ground while the Huey helicopters fly overhead. The mural brings to life the experiences of the men on the ground in the Vietnam War and highlights the dependence of the famous helicopter. The exhibit has been showcased in several locations and events around Enid as a static display drawing thousands of visitors.

Woodring Airport Historical Mural Revealed on the 90th Anniversary of Woodring Field Dedication



On Memorial Day, May 30, 2023 the new historical mural was revealed during the annual City of Enid services. The mural depicts the history of the Enid Air Park as it transitioned to Woodring Field, Woodring Municipal Airport and as now known as Enid Woodring Regional Airport. mural has portraits of the early day barnstormers who visited the field, Charles Lindberg, Amelia Earhart, and Wiley Post. Other portraits include upper Bert Woodring and Col Leon Vance, Jr. Other lower portraits include Bert Woodring, Clyde Cessna (who started his flying in Enid, Oklahoma), Ralph Baker, whose family sold the land to the City of Enid, now Vance AFB, Rachel Eshbaugh, the widow of a fallen hero, and Larry Stephens, a local veteran remembering at the wall. The Vietnam Wall, Oklahoma's official Vietnam War Monument, centers the mural. The "Lady Liberty" an actual flying WWII/Korea/Vietnam aircraft, based at Woodring Airport, is showcased along with the Huey/Fighting Men in the field in the right hand side of the mural. mural was created and painted by Tox Morillo, a local Enid artist.

Making an Impact through Community Partnerships

The Quilts of Valor Group, led by Jovita Lang, provides quilts for approved veterans. A beautiful handmade quilt was presented by the group to Jack Toney, a local Vietnam veteran.



Shirley Suttles leads another private quilting group and has provided more than 10 handmade patriotic quilts to our Legacy Veterans of the Year on Veterans Day, and for our Gold Star families on Memorial Day. The value of these quilts exceeds \$1,000 each.

The Harris Foundation provided funding to enhance the traveling exhibits that are on display at the OK Military History Exhibit at Oakwood Mall.

The Oakwood Mall partnered with our veterans park allowing us to create and display a 40,000 sq. ft. military exhibit in the old Sears anchor store location.

The Woodring Wall of Honor volunteers provided assistance to several veterans needing Aid and Attendance benefits to certified offset health services. We collaborate with the local Disabled American Veterans organization to make application and assist families through the benefit We have been successful in process. getting more than 10 veterans or surviving spouses with Assisted Living or Long Term Care Housing benefits.

Park Avenue Thrift and the Woodring Wall of Honor partner on creating 2000 STEAM swag bags for school tours. The Bags contain STEAM education and are provided free of charge to students. Bags include art supplies, color books, wooden aircraft, and activities for elementary age students. Boomarang Restaurant provided back sacks for those students. High School students receive a bag with activities for extra credit, scholarship information, and other items. This program was provided by a grant from Park Avenue Thrift.

The Woodring Wall of Honor and the Corvette Club of Enid has a long standing relationship. The car owners host an annual event and disburse the funding to local non-profits. Due to their generosity, over the past few years we have been able to purchase a riding lawn mower to help maintain our grounds, a golf cart, for transportation for our disabled, and this year they partially sponsored our new mural. Without partnerships like this, we couldn't expand and grow our exhibits and park which honor our veterans.

Vance AFB is a key asset to our community not only economically but with their community involvement. The airmen from Vance have donated many hours of volunteerism and support to the park. They wash the Vietnam and Living Walls, helps with yard work and gardening, and assist with programs and events. Many airmen volunteered their skill sets to help with the launch of the new OK Military History Exhibit.

The Boy Scout Council of the Plains has been a 17 year partner with the Woodring Wall of Honor through the Eagle Scout Program. Our organization has identified several worthy projects that allow the boy scouts to achieve the Eagle Scout rank. This year we had three successful candidates who completed their projects to support veterans. A flag box for collection of damaged/worn flags was built and installed at the Educational Center. A flag burn box with both organizations logos/cutouts were designed and welded with assistance and mentorship from Jack Toney and EH Welding. The final rank was achieved with the renovation of the interior of a Huey helicopter along with assembling oral history portraits for The Huey, the Workhorse of Vietnam."



When I walk up to the Vietnam Wall at the Woodring Wall of Honor and Veterans Park, I am reminded that I lost 58,318 brothers and sisters (and to this day, still counting), that gave their lives to protect and preserve the freedoms we enjoy in our beautiful America. In 2023, the Woodring Wall of Honor and Veterans Park became the first Chapter of the Oklahoma Military Heritage Foundation. The Military Heritage Foundation founded the Oklahoma Military Hall of Fame to honor Oklahoma veterans. It limits honorees to 12 new members per year. There are many more heroic and patriotic Oklahomans deserving of significant recognition so the Hall of Honor was established in 2023 to expand the impact of the Foundation and honor additional veterans.

Supporting community chapters were developed to administer the programs locally. These chapters will identify and nominate honorees who will receive a Hall of Honor citation and medal with a maroon ribbon lanyard. The local chapter coordinates presentations. Selections for the Military Hall of Fame are made annually In October. The Hall of Honor awards are made throughout the year. We were honored to present Hall of Honor awards to five worthy veterans on Memorial Day, 2023. USA veteran Bill Parker's award was presented in Tulsa, Judge Robert Lovell, USA; HB Evans, USAAF; RD Lawrence, USAAF and Ed Bray, USA were presented by the Heritage Foundation Founder, General Douglas Dollar, USA Retired. Five more recipients have been identified and will be presented on Memorial Day, 2024.

Impacting the Community

On Memorial Day, each year, we continue the strong support that Enid shows its military armed forces through services and events that honor our fallen and remember the sacrifices of those who served before us. Enid leads the charge to honor these honorable men and women who defended our nation. We have honored 210 of Oklahoma's fallen heroes since 2000.

This year we added a unique way to honor those who have earned the Medal of Honor through the Medal of Honor Ride. Vehicles and motorcycles rode to three sites in NW Oklahoma to pay tribute to three Medal of Honor recipients.

The Red Dirt Run of Honor is a 5K run that honors the fallen of Oklahoma. This year, we postponed the race but still had runners come out and run regardless. They vow to never forget.

We dedicated a bridge this year to the USMC veterans Henry & George Bellmon which was sponsored by the First Bank and Trust of Billings and the Billings Fairchild Center. The cost of the highway signs were \$1,400.


An amazing event occurred at the NJCAA Baseball World Series this year. Korea, Vietnam, and today's warriors carried a flame around the bases ending up at home plate. The families of two Medal of Honor recipients, two WWII USAAF airmen and Lt. Col Christina Hopper raised the flame at plate а Blue Star Mother home as extinguished the flame following the "flame run" to begin the series.

Impacting the Community - Education

This year, for Black History Month, we were honored to have George Washington share about the famous Buffalo Soldiers. The Lawton-Fort Sill Chapter of the Buffalo Soldiers hosted a presentation at Enid Woodring Regional Airport recently on the history of one of America's lesserknown military units. The Buffalo Soldiers were activated as a U.S. military unit in 1866 following the Emancipation Proclamation with the creation of four infantry units and two cavalry units. The Buffalo Soldiers had numerous commendations and 42 Medal of Honor recipients. This highly decorated unit was a key to success in many battles and missions.

Our goal is to educate our next generation of the value of all members of our armed forces. We host several oral history presentations each year. Previous testimonies include Chuck DeBellevue, USAF; Bob Ford, USA; RD Lawrence USAAF, Walter Scheffe, USAAF; Fran Hoad, USAAF; RD Bland, USAAF; HB Evans, USAAF; Bo Gritz, USA; Randy USN: "Duke" Cunningham, David McCoy, USN; Rick Allison, USMC; Jim Goodrich, USMC; Jake McNiece, USA; Spads Hoffman, USN; David Smith, USN Bellmon, George USMC; Bill Schwertferger, USAF; and ML Becker, USAAF.

Our Huey, the Workhorse of Vietnam exhibit included more than 40 testimonies of veterans who were tied to the Huey helicopter during the Vietnam War. Those oral histories are currently on display at the OK Military History Exhibit at Oakwood Mall. The testimonies range from crewing the aircraft, to flying the warbird, to being medi-flighted out of the war zone, to being transported to other drop zones. One testimony from a POW.

In late 2022, we were approached by the Kansas Military History Museum about their closure and the acquisition of their collection with a value of more than \$500,000. It took six months to bring the collection down to Enid for storage in the old Sears anchor store in the Oakwood Mall. Under the direction of one of our key volunteers, Justin Messenger, we began unpacking boxes, assembling aircraft, transporting vehicles and the process of setting up our merged collections into an educational history of American war. This collection continues to expand its educational videos and we'll be scheduling school tours for all age groups in the Spring of 2024. Teaching modules for educators are on our new web site.
