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What is Medicare Fall Open Enrollment?

The Fall Open Enrollment Period also called the annual election period (AEP) is from October 15 – December 7 each year. You can join, switch, or drop a Medicare plan during this time. You can make as many changes as you like but the final change you make before December 7 will become effective on January 1 (as long as the plan gets your request by December 7).



SEPTEMBER & OCTOBER - REVIEW

Your plan may be changing. Review any notices from your plan about changes for next year. You will receive an Annual Notice of Change in the mail for your Part D drug plan or Medicare Advantage plan. Medicare insurance carriers must send them to you by September 30 each year. This notice will tell you what's changing with your plan next year. So be on the lookout for yours!

OCTOBER 1ST - COMPARE

Once you have received your annual notice of change or on October 1st you may start to comprae plans. This information is available at Medicare.gov/plan-compare or contact a licensed medicare advisor in your area for a consultation.

OCTOBER 15 - OPEN ENROLLMENT BEGINS

This is the one time of the year when ALL people with Medicare can make changes to their health and drug plans for the next year.

DECEMBER 7 - OPEN ENROLLMENT ENDS

In most cases December 7 is the last day you can change your medicare coverage for next year. The plan has to receive your application by December 7th.
