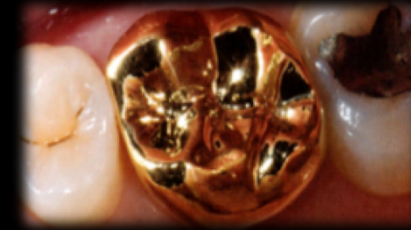


Types Of Crowns



Types	Ceramic	Porcelain Fused Metal	Metal
Description	Relatively new material that combines the strength of metal with the aesthetics of porcelain.	Strong metal core with a layer of porcelain layered on it.	Made of a combination of copper and other metals, such as nickel, chromium or gold.
