## AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE .....

Many times we look to buy new equipment for the shack. It might be a new model or and older used unit. Sometimes it is hard to find out if a unit performs well or may have a few problems in the design. If we are lucky we can find someone that already has one and ask them how they like it. As it turns out there is a place on the internet that does just that for amateur radio gear. The website is called EHAM. They have reviews for all sorts of amateur radio equipment from QRP kits to antenna tuners. By looking up equipment you are interested in you can find out any problems with items. You also find radios and equipment that have performed well for the price and are highly recommended by others who actually own and use those pieces of gear. Every time I see a piece on EBAY I am interested in I go the EHAM to see how others rate it. They have reviews for thousands of pieces of gear both old and new. ## AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE .....

Many times when we build up our own amateur radio equipment we have to come up with a case to put it in. Many kits include the case ,knobs, and connectors needed to complete a project but some do not. You can buy knobs and a new case from several vendors but this can add a lot to the cost of a project. One way to save money is to reuse older project cases. One of my favorite is the Heathkit HD15 phone patch. These are not in demand that much anymore and on EBAY you see a lot of them for sell untested or not working. Since I am going to strip out the components anyway that does not matter. The phone patches run from \$10.00 to \$15.00 on EBAY and have a lot of parts I can use for my QRP rigs. I get the nice case I can repaint to any color I want. I also get three Heathkit style knobs to use on the controls of the project. The included VU meter can be hooked up to the audio of my QRP rig for an audio derived S-meter. On the back there are two RCA jacks I wire up for the 12 DC power to supply the rig. I also wire up the slide switch on the back as a tune switch to key the rig so I have my hands free to adjust my antenna tuner on my 40 meter version. The hole on the back that has access to a screwdriver adjustment level resistor that I remove is just the right size for my BNC connector I mount for the antenna. This case is perfect for my SWL series QRP radios. I have put both a 30 meter and 40 meter kits in this case. Just make sure the case size is large enough for your project. I am currently looking at other older Heathkits to see if I can reuse the cases on those.

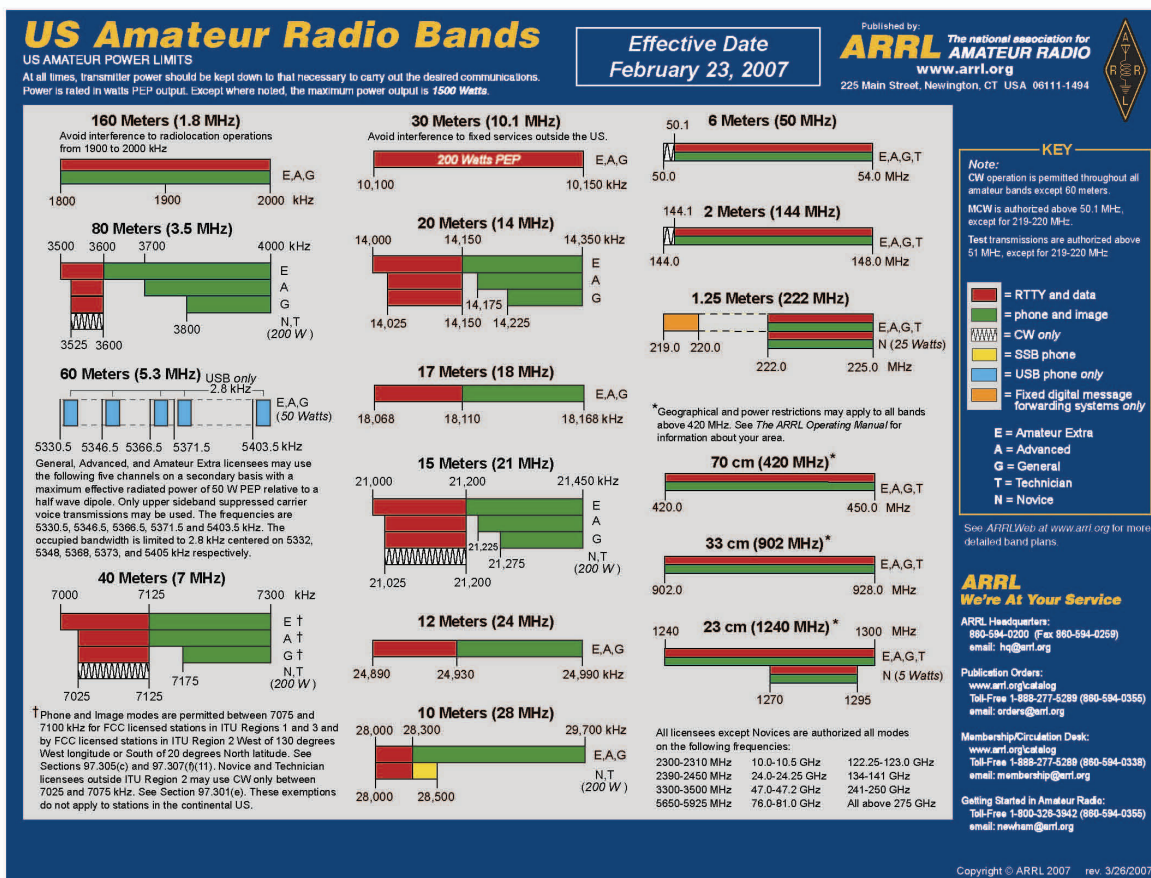

**FYI Analog TV Shutoff**

You're probably aware of the big analog (non-digital) signal shutoff on February 17, 2009. But this month is important too. The government vouchers to go towards the purchase of a digital converter box are now available, as of January 1. Here are some quick facts in case you get questions. We'll do a more detailed digital tv presentation for you later in January.

Every household can receive 2 vouchers.  
The vouchers are \$40 each.  
You must request them by visiting [ntia.doc.gov/dtvcoupon](http://ntia.doc.gov/dtvcoupon) or by calling 1-888-388-2009.  
They are available beginning January 1, 2008.  
Each voucher may be used for one box only-- you cannot put two vouchers toward the purchase of one box.  
The boxes are not yet in the stores. Last word says it will be mid-February.  
Last word also puts the boxes at between \$50 and \$80.
