The rewards for giving my time to the classes are seeing the new hams become active. Thank you new hams for your interest in membership in the club, and providing public service to the community. If it were not for the new hams, the Delta Club would not have been able to provide the 50+ hams for the St. Jude Marathon on December 6th.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual* is highly suggested as well as study of the 392 questions and answer Technical Class License question pool. Memphis Amateur, 1465 Wells Station Rd, 683-9125 is a local ham radio store that sells the manuals.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, scroll down and click on Practice Tests on the left side of the QRZ home page. Another site is www.hamtestonline.com. It costs \$49.95, but it is good for 2 years for the Technician, General and Extra Class tests.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$15.00 ARRL VE Exam fee.

The St. Jude Marathon was a great event for everyone. I was told that the event raised about 1.8 million dollars for St. Jude. That sounds like a lot of money but I was also told that it takes about 1.5 million dollars to run St. Jude for ONE day. I didn't get time to take pictures while I was running around but thought I would share with you the only picture I got. AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

Some Amateurs like to set up beacons on the bands to automatically transmit and help show propagation conditions on the band. By listing the station, frequency and callsign used we can hear beacons from different locations around the world to see how strong the signal path would be to that area. These beacons are low power automated transmitters that send our callsign, location, ETC usually in morse code. A few companies have made boards to do this but they required programming an EPROM to put the data in. This worked well but was hard to do. Now a company has come out with a Beacon controller that is cheap and easy to program. The Freakin Beacon is a kit on a small PC board that you build up. IT programs from your PC computer by just typing in text you want it to send. You can program callsign, location, and time delays just like you want. It even has commands for turning on the transmitter with time delays before sending the code. The unit cost of about \$35.00 makes it a nice accessory for you beacon station. AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times during emergencies we need to run portable and use power from our cars or power from the car battery. I got a surplus battery booster unit that had a burned up transformer and circuit board from a friend. I decided to reuse the extra larger jumper cable clamps from the unit. I wired them up to be an adaptor from the larger jumpers you can connect to a car battery to small alligator clips that could be used to supply power to our radios. To make sure everything was protected in case of a short I fused both the plus lead and the ground lead with fuses in each line. This is the way Icom does it on their mobile wiring. The adapter works great and now I can hook up the radio directly to a car battery if needed. The small clips can also be hooked up to my standard power pole connectors if needed.

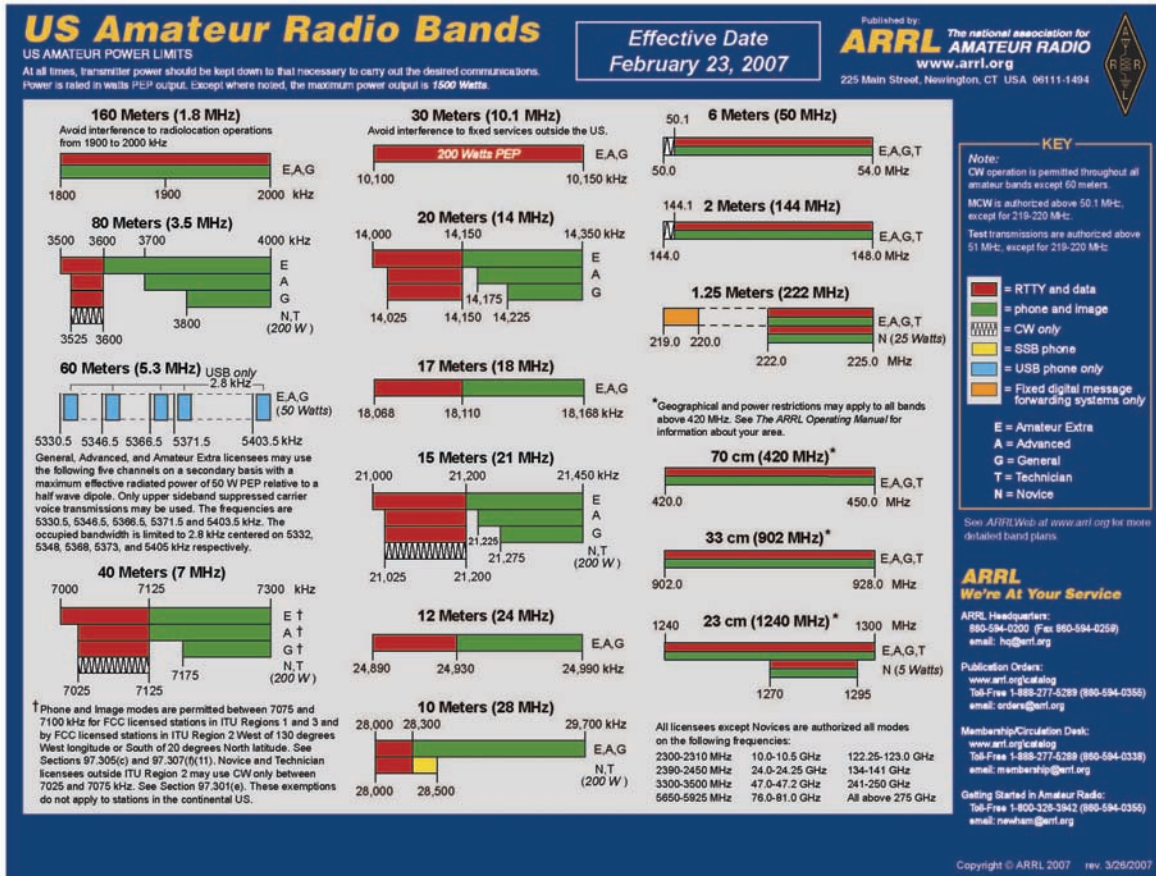
