Happy April to all - I thought I'd keep this month's "Corner" short and sweet by providing a few helpful websites. I hope you'll take a few minutes to visit these websites.

#### Be Prepared for the Severe Spring Weather

The arrival of spring brings longer days, budding flowers and trees, and thunderstorms. The American Red Cross has several important tips that can help ensure safety during dangerous storms. Thunderstorms can be deadly. According to FEMA, lightning injures an average of three hundred people and causes about 80 fatalities each year. At any given time, nearly 1,800 thunderstorms are occurring somewhere on Earth. Thunderstorms occur more in the spring and summer months, but can happen year round. They are

most likely to hit during the afternoon and evening, but can happen any time of the day or night. Go to the <u>American Red Cross website</u> for recommended steps if a thunderstorm hits your area. You can also get helpful tips on preparing for and handling thunderstorms on the <u>FEMA</u> website.

#### Flood Season and Safety

Last year we saw significant flooding in the mid-south area with numerous families in Millington and Memphis affected. You can monitor the latest forecasts from your <u>local National Weather Service office</u>, review <u>Flood Safety Awareness</u> from FEMA and learn how an <u>emergency kit</u> (containing non-perishable food items, flashlight, hand-crank radio, airtight container for important documents, and other items) can prove invaluable if your home is flooded.

Remember, if you come across a flooded road, Turn Around, Don't Drown.

#### AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

I have already built up a small audio amp and speaker for QRP rigs. I was having to plug and unplug my amp speaker box for the QRP rig I was using. This month's project is the QRP AUDIO SWITCH. I built this one up in another one of my small surplus aluminum boxes from LMB. I bought several of these at a hamfest still in the plastic wrapping. The aluminum is easy to drill for parts and paint to match my other equipment. The audio switch allows me to plug in the audio from up to 4 QRP radios and then switch the one I want to my amplifier speaker box. This stops the wear and



tear from constantly plugging and unplugging cables. The box has jacks on the back to get audio from the four radios and a switch on the front panel wired to select which one I want to go on to the amplifier speaker box. The box works great and makes it easy to select the audio from the radio I am using and send it to the amplifier and speaker.

We usually publish class schedules a month or two in advance. You will be notified by email or phone when the class is set if you send an email informing us of your desire to be in a class.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, product* #0977 / *ISBN* 978-0-87259-097-7 (red-brick colored cover) is strongly suggested as well as study of the 396 question and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers may have this manual. You can purchase it online from <a href="www.arrl.org/catalog or on Amazon.com">www.arrl.org/catalog or on Amazon.com</a>. The list price is \$29.95 (which includes a CD). The older ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, Second Edition, was priced at \$24.95, but did not have a CD.

The current Technician License question pool, which was approved by the NCVEC on February 1, 2010, can be seen at <a href="http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356">http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356</a>. Testing for this new question pool started July 1, 2010.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The <a href="www.qrz.com">www.qrz.com</a> website is free. To access the sample tests, click on Main Menu to the right of the Search button on the QRZ Home Page. Scroll down and click on Practice Amateur Radio Exams. Click on Start Test to enter QRZ Practice Test Center. Click on Technician 35 Questions. Click on Wait For Correct. (This feature gives you the ability to answer again to get the correct answer if you miss the first time. On each answer it will either show Wrong Answer or Correct.) Click on Begin Test. Statistics are given at the top of the screen with the number of Completed questions, the Accuracy percentage, and the Overall percentage of questions completed on the test. Be sure to study multiple QRZ tests. The first test is only the first question from each of the 35 subgroups of the question pool. The second test is only the second question from each of the 35 subgroups, and so on. It is recommended to take at least 15 of the sample tests to be able to see all 396-question pool questions.

The 35-question FCC exam will be given at the end of class by a Volunteer Examiner (VE) team. There is a \$15.00 ARRL VEC FCC exam fee.

DELTA CLUB 146.82 NET PREAMBLE (Rev. 2)
GOOD EVENING: This is calling this session of the DELTA CLUB'S TRAFFIC AND INFORMATION NET. This net is affiliated with the ARRL and the NTS and is organized to pass traffic in and out of the mid - south area, in addition to providing information about club events and amateur related topics. This net meets nightly at 8:00 p.m. CT except the second Tuesday of the month on the 146.82 W4BS repeater and requires a pl. tone of 107.2 Hz. All stations will refrain from transmitting without being acknowledged by net control.
All licensed amateurs are encouraged to participate.
