AMATEUR PACKET UPDATE

Many new projects that we develop use microprocessors in their design. They have become cheap and they are easier to program. Two of the most popular Microprocessors are the Arduino series and the Picaxe microprocessors. The ARRL has printed a new book about using these processors for ham radio projects. The book called “Ham Radio for Arduino and Picaxe” shows how to program these chips for lots of ham radio projects. The Picaxe chips are as cheap as \$3.00 and the Arduino complete boards are less than \$20.00. These microprocessors are easy to program and design. AMATEUR HARDWARE UPDATE

Many times we run our equipment on batteries. The problem we have is as the battery is used its voltage will drop. Some radios do not like to run on this lower voltage and will quit working properly or just shut down. With today's technology using the LM2577 integrated circuit we can buy a complete step up DC-DC up-converter on a pc board. These are made in China and are available on Ebay. The board has a connection for input voltage and output voltage. An on-board variable resistor sets the output voltage to be maintained. I set mine to 13.2 volts and used a female cigarette lighter plug to connect to radios. Now with any input from 3 to 13 volts DC the output stays at 13.2 volts with 1 percent regulation. The switching up-converter is 92 percent efficient and can handle up to 3 amps if you use a heat sink. I mounted mine in a surplus case with digital meter and a switch to select input and output voltage levels to monitor. The circuit works great and is very cheap to buy. I got my up-converter for \$2.35 with free shipping. Check Ebay for availability and pricing. Do a search for "LM2577 step up power converter".

Or you can go to the Delta Club webpage www.deltaclub.org click on Training Classes; then click on Technician Class to send an email, or call at 901-628-4318. We usually publish class schedules a month or two in advance. You will be notified by email or phone when the class is set if you send an email informing us of your desire to be in a class.

There is no charge for the class, but registration is required. Advanced study of *The ARRL Ham Radio License Manual*, product #0977/ISBN 978-0-87259-097-7 (red-brick colored cover) is strongly suggested as well as study of the 396 questions and answer Technical Class License question pool. Barnes & Noble Booksellers may have this manual. You can purchase it online from www.msars.com, www.arrl.org/catalog or on Amazon.com. The list price is \$29.95 (which includes a CD). The older ARRL Ham Radio License Manual, Second Edition was priced at \$24.95, but did not have a CD.

The current Technician License question pool, which was approved by the NCVEC on February 1, 2010, can be seen at <http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=356>. Testing for this question pool started July 1, 2010.

Practice tests are highly recommended. The www.qrz.com website is free. To access the sample tests, go to www.qrz.com. From the QRZ home page click on **RESOURCES** in the blue band on the top right. Then click on 2010 Technician Exam Practice Test. When you start answering the questions, it will show you if you answered correctly or not with **CORRECT!** or **SORRY BUT THAT ANSWER IS NOT CORRECT**. Statistics are kept below the test question at **This Quiz** with the number of questions answered correctly and the percentage correct. Also shown is the number of questions answered correctly from the 396 questions of the question pool. It keeps track of your correct answers on subsequent tests. Below the **This Quiz** line is **Questions in This Test**, that is a list of the 35 question numbers of the current test. If answered correctly, the question number radio button turns green. If answered incorrectly, it turns red.
