TOWN OF ALAMEDA TRANSPORTATION POLICY

POLICY No. 400-1

PROPERTY & SURVEY POLICY

1. Purpose:

To provide guidelines for staff and council with regards to local property and development.

2. Location of Pins:

The Town will not locate property lines or (property markers) pins to ensure accuracy of the original property survey. If the ratepayers want accurate property lines they will have to hire a surveyor.

The Town will allow the ratepayer to use the metal detector to locate the property lines or (property markers). The Town Foreman will be on site at this time.

The cost to the ratepayer will be \$30.00 per visit.
