The Bride says, "COME."

What does COME mean?

To find the core meaning of a word we go to the Bible to the very first time it was used, and see what God was saying:

Gen 6:13 And God said to Noah, "The end of all flesh has COME before Me, for the earth is filled with violence through them; and behold, I will destroy them with the earth.

- Gen 6:20 "Of the birds after their kind, of animals after their kind, and of every creeping thing of the earth after its kind, two of every kind will **COME** to you to keep them alive..
- Gen 7:1 Then the LORD said to Noah, "COME into the ark, you and all your household, because I have seen that you are righteous before Me in this generation.

Come here indicates "it is time." *It is time-come*, (*name of website*)

or

"bring to pass, and come into safety."

In Strong's definition, for the above thee Scriptures, it says: the definition for this "come" is: to go in, go, to enter, enter, come, come in, come in to, come to, come with, to come upon, to come to pass, to attain to, to be enumerated to go, to lead in, to carry in, to bring in, cause to come in, gather, cause to come, bring near, bring against, fall or light upon, attack (enemy)bring upon to bring to pass, to be brought, brought in, to be introduced, be put

The Lord said: Gen 7:1 *Then the LORD said to Noah, "COME into the ark, you and all your household, because I have seen that you are righteous before Me in this generation."*

So "COME" in this command would be "to go in, enter, come into." God showed Noah how to build an ark, an ark of safety from the evil in the world and the flood.

God gave a promise to Abraham in Gen 17:6 *"I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall COME from you."* So here, "come" would mean to attain, to be enumerated, to be brought in (into the world).

COULD GOD BE SAYING THE SAME THINGS AGAIN DURING THESE LAST DAYS? "The Bride said, "Come," in Revelations

The word "COME" is used 1588 times in the NKJV Bible, and used in many ways.

Rev 1:8 "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End," says the Lord, "who is and who was and who is to COME, the Almighty."

Rev 11:17 saying: "We give You thanks, O Lord God Almighty, The One who is and who was and who is to **COME**, Because You have taken Your great power and reigned."

Rev 19:17 Then I saw an angel standing in the sun; and he cried with a loud voice, saying to all the birds that fly in the midst of heaven, **"COME and gather together for the supper of the** great God," Rev 19:7 "Let us be glad and rejoice and give Him glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has COME, and His wife has made herself ready."



Rev 21:9 Then one of the seven angels who had the seven bowls filled with the seven last plagues came to me and talked with me, saying, "COME I will show you the bride, the Lamb's wife." Rev 22:17 And the Spirit and the bride say, "COME!" And let him who hears say, "COME!" And let him who thirsts COME. Whoever desires, let him take the water of life freely. Rev 22:20 *He who testifies to these things says,* "Surely I am coming quickly." Amen. Even so, COME, Lord Jesus!

What more does "Come" mean? Does "COME" mean the same as "CALL"? When we say come, are we calling others? This is the meaning of "CALL" in Strong's: *call, to call,* call out, call for, call by, call and commission, to call unto, to be called, be named, be called out, to call oneself to be called, call (with name of God), cry, utter a loud sound, cried, cry out, cry (for help), proclaim, to proclaim, be proclaimed, renowned, bidden, preach, recite, read, to read aloud, be read aloud, read (to oneself), to summon, be summoned, invite, appoint, gave, name, give name to, be named, named, guests, invited, to **be chosen**

What is the meaning of "chosen"?

"CHOSEN" from Strong's definition means: picked out, chosen, chosen by God, to obtain salvation through Christ, Christians are called "chosen or elect" of God, the (Messiah is called "elect", as appointed by God to the most exalted in these Scriptures), office conceivable choice, select, i.e. the best of its kind or class, excellence preeminent: applied to certain individual Christians, select, selected, by implication, favorite:-chosen, elect. There is more:

"1. chosen by God, and, a. to obtain salvation through Christ; hence, Christians are called, the chosen or elect of God of pious Israelites- Isaiah 65:9, 15, 23; Psalm 104:43 (Ps. 105:43), cf. Wis. 4:15): Luke 18:7; Romans 8:33; Colossians 3:12; Titus 1:1; Matthew 24:22, 24; Mark 13:20, 22; 1 Peter 1:1; Matthew 24:31; Mark 13:27, Revelation 17:14; 1 Peter 2:9 (from Isaiah 43:20, cf. Additions to Esther 8:40, those who have become true partakers of the **Christian salvation---- are contrasted with those** who have been invited but who have NOT shown themselves fitted to obtain it (others regard the 'called' and the 'chosen' here as alike partakers of salvation, but the latter as the 'choice ones'.....

....distinguished above the former;), Matthew 20:16; Matt 22:14;

finally, those are called who are destined for salvation but have not

yet been brought to it, 2 Timothy 2:10. (All are called because Jesus died

for us all, but some have not "been brought to it, " or received salvation yet.)

b. The Messiah is called preeminently, as appointed by God to the most exalted office conceivable: Luke 23:35, Luke 9:

c. Angels are called, as those whom God has chosen out from other created beings to be peculiarly associated with him, and his highest ministers in governing the universe: 1 Timothy 5:21; Josephus, b. j. 2, 16, 4,2 Peter 2:4; Jude 1:6.

Are you "predistined for salvation?

Eph 1:4 just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love, 5 having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will,

Have you received salvation? (been brought to it) Rom 10:9 that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

Some people say (of themselves) that they are called, but not chosen. These Scriptures and definitions show that those that receive salvation ARE CHOSEN. And Jesus died on the Cross for everyone to be saved. So all men are called, **but some choose to NOT be chosen**, or according to definition: ("those who have been invited but who have NOT shown themselves fitted to obtain it.")

There are those who choose to be chosen, and these show themselves fitted to obtain it. — Even the Bride made herself ready.

<u>To fit ourselves to obtain it</u> requires action, commitment, dedication, and willingness to "obtain" the promised election of "chosen." Jesus said to "count the cost." Jesus paid a price for us, His life. He said, "Follow Me."

Luke 14:28 "For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not sit down first and count the cost, whether he has enough to finish it-

Who will come to the wedding?

Mat 22:8 "Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy. 9 'Therefore go into the highways, and as many as you find, invite to the wedding.' 10 "So those servants went out into the highways and gathered together all whom they found, both bad and good. And the wedding hall was filled with guests. 11 "But when the king came in to see the guests, he saw a man there who did not have on a wedding garment. One must "fit themselves to obtain it." Mat 22:14 "For many are called, but few are chosen."



So, are you called? Yes, because all are called. You are called, so can you call others? **Are you saved?** Have you "been brought to it?" (Have you believed in your heart and confessed Romans 10: 9,10?) If yes, you are commissioned to spread the gospel. Are you chosen? Yes, if you choose to be chosen, (if you show yourself fitted to obtain it).

Can all that are chosen and shown themselves fitted to obtain it, become the Bride? Yes, if you <u>choose</u> to be washed and cleansed, and make yourself ready, you can be His wife, the Bride. If you have been washed and made yourself ready, HOW do you then say "COME?" There will be teachings on this site showing how through intercession by the Holy Spirit will "CALL" others and open the Door for them saying "COME."

There are those who have received the calling, chose to be chosen, and sought deliverance, who have repented and been delivered of many spots, (demons), blemishes (iniquities), and wrinkles (the flesh) to become in right standing with God --- they may INTERCEDE for others with more effective prayers, because (James 5:16b) the effective, fervent prayer of a RIGHTEOUS man (in right standing with God) avails much. The Bride says "Come." She made herself ready.

This website is about mostly about intercession and those that have sought to be "righteous" and desire to pray effectively for others. It is about removing the "speck" from another's eye in love. To intercede for others is showing love and compassion, and it is also saying "thank You," to Jesus for what He has done for us by removing the "beams" from our eyes. God also blesses us by healing us as we pray for others.

To begin looking at the meaning of "intercede" we read the first Scripture that mentions it in the Bible.

Exo 8:9 And Moses said to Pharaoh, "Accept the honor of saying when I shall <u>intercede</u> for you, for your servants, and for your people, to destroy the frogs from you and your houses, that they may remain in the river only." In Strong's, it says it differently: *"And Moses said unto"* Pharaoh, 'Glory over me: when I shall I ENTREAT for thee, and for thy servants and for thy people to destroy the frogs from thee and thy houses that they may remain."

Here they use the word "ENTREAT" for intercede; "and in Strong's it means: to pray, entreat, to be entreated, supplicate, to be supplicated, to make supplication, plead, to burn incense in worship, i.e. <u>intercede</u>.

This website will have instruction and demonstrations of intercessions as the Holy Spirit gives the utterance to those interceding. There will be example intercessions and testimonies.

It is a working of the Holy Spirit, and for His Glory..
